97/54 #83	2-1	Elmer Middlecoff's placer operation at Hight Creek (between Mayo and Minto Creek). See Gold and Galena pp 50, 51. Tower on building was used to chill meat by wetting the flaps and allowing air circulation. #83 - #98: In 1916, the first dredge was constructed on Hight Creek by the Klasco [Dredging] Co. of Seattle with a Mr. Knot in charge of operations. The company brought a [newly designed steam] tractor in to haul the equipment to the creek; once assembled [in Mayo] it wouldn't work so teamsters, Alex Nicol, Joe and Louis Cantin were hired to do the job. A building was erected below the Hight Canyon and equipment set up to supply electrical power for the dredge. When the plant didn't work, completion of the dredge was given up as only the scow portion had been constructed. Elmer [Middlecoff] bought the building using the lumber for sluice boxes. [Gold and Galena, pp 297-298.] The hull of the dredge was constructed near the mouth of 80 Pup and a building housing the pipe boiler and electric generator was built below the Hight Creek Canyon, near the mouth of the creek. A pole line was built as the steam boiler would provide the electricity needed to power the dredge further up the creek. ... the project was abandoned leaving parts of this dredge scattered from Hight Creek to San Francisco. [Gold & Galena pp. 53-54]. [Men posing outdoors with two log buildings in background.]
