Government Telegraph Service ledger detailing expenditures / revenues and employees for the Atlin Forty Mile Division of Yukon Telegraphs. The expenditures and revenues cover July 1903 to June 1905. Entries are for Forty Mile, Dawson, Ogilvie, Stewart River, Selwyn, Fort Selkirk, Yukon Crossing, Big Salmon, Hootalinqua, Lower Laberge, White Horse, Maintenance, Tagish, Caribou Crossing, Centre Cabin, Atlin, Tantalus, Upper Laberge, Line Repair, Couture Repair Party, Gagné Repair Party, Unpaid and Contingent Accounts, and Balance. The ledger was also used to record employment information for the predominantly male employees (linemen, operators, messengers, etc.) to 1952. Additional information such as birthdate, next of kin, and war service is occasionally included along with work locations, roles, and periods of absence. Some entries continue on subsequent pages.
