During the trip Smith notes layover times, locations passed and stopped at, river conditions, sternwheelers encountered, freight discharged, weather, and problems encountered. 3 pages. 1907. - Typed transcript of Captain John T. Smith's personal log as Master of the Northern Navigation Co.'s sternwheeler 'Will H. Isom'. The trip starts at St. Michael, Alaska on September 6, 1907. They reach the North American Trading and Transportation Co.'s trading post at Weare, Alaska on September 15. Departing September 17, they arrive back near St. Michael on September 27. During the trip Smith notes layover times, locations passed and stopped at, river conditions, sternwheelers encountered, freight discharged, weather, and problems encountered. 3 pages. 1907. - History of the Northern Commercial Company and the Northern Navigation Company. The N.C. Co. is the successor to four companies. The company maintains a chain of stores and warehouses in the valleys of the Yukon River and its tributaries. The N.N. Co. maintains a fleet of 32 sternwheelers, 35 barges, and numerous tow-boats and other harbour craft.
