Pedee indicates he will not be visiting Whitehorse due to costs, his friendship with Bishop Coudert, his diminished connections with Whitehorse, Peg Crook's request that he secure for MacBride Museum items pertaining to the construction of the Alaska Highway, his sending of negatives and other items (menu and piece of dedication ceremony ribbon) to MacBride Museum, wondering where the items ended up, his ability to send 25 rolls of 35mm negatives, and that the Calgary Herald's John Schmidt could assist the museum with the information he has collected on the Alaska Highway. 1 page. 13 Feb 1976. - Letter from Larry Pedee to Helen and Bill Horback. Pedee inquires about the menu and piece of dedication ceremony ribbon he sent to Whitehorse, indicates he has negatives to send, describes a recent trip with his wife Mary, discusses research into Lt. Roland Small, encloses photographs of a 'Stockton' Bridge painting (81/6 #1) and Co. 'B' 18th Engrs. Combat Battalion banner (81/6 #2), and mentions fishing on Lake Erie. 2 pages. 12 Aug 1979. - Copy of Alaska - Canada Highway dedication program and menu. 1 page. 19-20 Nov 1942. - Copy of letter to Larry Pedee from The City College of The City University of New York re: copies of school records for Civil Engineering graduate Roland R.
