Vifquain mentions: reading Lloyd Lockhart's article about Yukon paddle steamers, the list Vifquain and MacBride wrote of Yukon steamers, visiting Herbert Wheeler in Victoria, being a purser on the sternwheeler 'Yukoner', 'Yukoner' ownership history, attending the International Yukoners Reunion in San Francisco in August, being a bookkeeper for Manager J.B. Woods at the Trading &amp; Exploration Co. beginning in 1899, and seeing Woods' sister-in-law at the reunion. Vifquain encloses a receipt from his employment on the 'Yukoner'. 6 Oct 1951.</li><li>- Receipt for work performed by C.J. Vifquain onboard the sternwheeler 'Yukoner' (\$330.79). Written by Herbert Wheeler of the Canadian Development Co. at Whitehorse. Poor condition (taped). 13 Oct 1900.</li><li>- Typed letter copy from William MacBride to C.J. Vifquain. MacBride thanks Vifquain for his letter and the receipt. MacBride mentions: some of the documents he has from the sternwheeler 'Yukoner', pranks he has played on others (including Paul Mason and Frank Downey) with a big brass key from the 'Yukoner', he was frequently misquoted in Lloyd Lockhart's article, he is the Secretary Treasurer of the recently formed Yukon Historical Society, that the society has secured the Telegraph Office for \$1/year, that the society has no funds but is anticipating government assistance, that he went through the Whitehorse Rapids recently in a canoe with Amos Burg and Bill Goodlad, anecdotes about Herbert Wheeler, and a series of articles he wrote about trips to the Klondike. 1 page. 10 Oct 1951.</li></ul>	1900, 1951
