Kenneth?] Macrae for \$16 from Andrew S. Grant of the Canadian Dredging & Mining Co. Ltd. May 1906. - Copy of a letter from the Office of District Superintendent of Postal Service offering Ed Whitehouse a 1928-1929 winter mail contract between Dawson and Scroggie Creek via Stewart River for \$100 per trip. 17 Aug 1928. 1 page. - A Government Telegraph Service telegraph probably from Charles Joseph "Bunny" Lelievre at Dawson to Ed Whitehouse, Str. Whitehorse, Big Salmon, Y.T. Message reads "Did not see you on the boat so am saying cheerio and good luck right now Regards to the gang Bunny 10.37 am". 9 Oct 1930. (Charles Lelievre, 1908-1994, was a member of the Government Telegraph Service in Dawson. Charles was the son of Joseph "Rabbit" Lelievre. Lelièvre means Hare in French.) - A receipt for supplies sold to Whitehouse by J.A. Kemp & Co. Dealers in General Merchandise, Hay, Grain and Produce from Steel Creek, Alaska. Signed paid by H.H. Ross. 16 Mar 1933. 	1906-1945

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		<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Copy of a certificate of discharge made out for Ranger Joseph Edward Whitehouse (K554744) from the Pacific Coast Militia Rangers. The certificate indicates Whitehouse served continuously from Feb 16, 1943 to Oct 30, 1945. 30 Oct 1945. 1 page.- Copy of a newspaper photo clipping of Samuel J. Whitehouse in military uniform. No date. 1 page.- Copy of an article by Highways road crew Foreman J. Ed. Whitehouse regarding the recently discovered grave of a pioneer Klondiker out on the Hunker Creek Road (17 miles from Dawson). Headboard reads "H. Swalgrass, Oshkosh, Wis. Age 38. Died Jan. 21, 1899". Image of grave accompanies the article. No date. 1 page.- Copy of a newspaper clipping titled "Bear Returns, Meets Waterloo at Hands of Girl – Mrs. J.E. Whitehouse Kills Black Bear at Lee Creek". No date. 1 page.- Copy of a newspaper clipping regarding the death of Joseph Edward Whitehouse by appendicitis near Carmacks on April 30. Whitehouse, his brother S.J. and his nephew Ed were mushing from Whitehorse to Dawson on their return from England.
