MSS 206	f1	<p>Ed Whitehouse Dawson City School notebooks 5 bound volumes Set of five school notebooks / exercise books kept by Ed Whitehouse while attending Dawson City Public High School (ca.1922). The handwritten notebooks were kept for the following subjects: Composition and Literature; Geography; History; Algebra and Composition; and Spelling. Mr. Whitehouse recalled that some of the teachers he had in Dawson were Miss Garrow for Latin/French; Miss English for English; a Miss Sloane; the primary teacher was Miss Lusk; and the principal was a Mr. Bragg followed by a Mr. Dyde. Fellow classmates of Ed Whitehouse's included Martha Ballentine, Mrs. Alice Holbrook, and Mr. Charlie Reynold.</p>	ca. 1922
MSS 206	f2	<p>Dawson City cable ferry log book 1 ledger Maintained for his own interest, Capt. Ed Whitehouse recorded passengers (names if he knew them) and vehicles for each ferry trip and other ferry maintenance, activities and events. Entries for 1939 are for May 15 to Oct 14. Entries for 1940 are for May 2 to Oct 17. Entries for 1941 are for Apr 9 to Oct 16. Entries for 1942 are for May 13 to Nov 4. Entries for 1947 are for May 5 to Jul 3. Entries for 1948 are for May 3 to Oct 27. Entries for 1949 are for May 3 and May 5. There are additional brief entries at the back of the ledger pertaining to 1943, 1944, 1945, 1946, and 1949. The Dawson City Cable Ferry was motorized in 1945, and could transport up to four cars and two trucks free. The ferry operated for 8 hours per day (prior to freeze-up) and the Cable Ferry captain earned about \$200 a month. In the winters, Mr. Whitehouse would work in the Fire Hall.</p>	1939-1949
