Article mentions Arthur Harper, Alfred Mayo, and William Ogilvie. 1953. - Newspaper clipping “Lest We Forget” by Andrew Baird provides a brief list of placer mining claims in the Klondike Gold Fields with high yields, details a placer mining exhibition in Ballarat, Australia, and laments that Dawson City lacks a placer mining exhibition.
