Abstract

This file consists of 11 pages of handwritten notes made by Benjamin Craig recording various Yukon historical subjects. Included are:

- names of the first North West Mounted Police (NWMP) Yukon Detachment, 1895
- information about Klondike Dawson Schultz, who was claimed to be the first white child born in Dawson City
- names of the original Dawson News staff, 1899-1902
- names of members of the Ogilvie Party who arrived in Dawson City, 1898
- distances of places in Alaska and Yukon from Seattle
- names of stations on the White Pass and Yukon Route (WP&YR) and their distance from Skagway
- names of the Dawson City Volunteer Fire Department, 1899
- contents of the Dawson Post Office on Front Street, 1899
- descriptions of numerous murders and other crimes committed in Yukon, 1897-1932
- and an assortment of other facts

The North West Mounted Police was formed in 1873.

Inspector Constantine was ordered to Yukon in May 1894.

In the winter of 1898-9 the [1898-1899] N.W.M.P. covered with dog-team 64012 miles (all of Canada).

7124 Small craft not counting regular steamers went down river during the Gold Rush of 1898 (From Bennett.)

Fire in Dawson

On Oct. 14. 1898 - 2 large blocks were laid in ashes.

The Dominion Saloon on Front St. was held up in 1902 by Wm [William] Brophy, Mart. Tomerlin & Edwin B. Harris. Brophy got life. Harris 10 years

Police posts in Yukon in 1902

White Pass Summit. Montague Gold Run Cariboo. MacKay's Dominion White Horse. Minto. Hunker Upper LaBarge. Selkirk. Dawson Hootalinqua McQuesten Forty Mile

The "Str. Stratton" [Steamer Stratton] & "Willie Irving" were crushed in the ice on Oct. 23. 1899.

\$1650 was stolen from the Mining Inspector's Office in Grand Forks, Yukon. - Party never found.

The Atlin Stage was held up in 1899. $3.^{00}$ taken. Robber escaped.

\$100,000 fines collected during 1898-9 [1898-1899] was spent on relief

On. Sept. 22. 1912, the Yukon Gold Co's dredge was blown up. & Jacob Neilson on March 20. 1913 was found guilty of dynamiting the dredge.

The first white child born in Dawson was born Sept. 8. 1897. She was named "Klondike Dawson Schultz". She was the daughter of Charles Schultz whom I knew in the early days. Her name is now (1932) Mrs. Klondike Dawson Stockwell now living in or near Seattle.

Soon after her birth the miners contributed gold nuggets & dust to pay passage for babe & mother on the last boat for St. Michael to Seattle. The father remained in Dawson. The mother died on the way down river & was buried on the banks of the Yukon River in Alaska. The natives cared for the child & the following year the U.S. Revenue Cutter Bear took her to Seattle.

Schultz told me the story in the early days. Others of course claimed that there were whites born before her but there are many still living who remember the story.

Murders etc.

In Oct.1897

Ed. Henderson, on Marsh Lake, clubbed his partner over the head with a revolver then shot him. He was hanged at Dawson.

Christian Fox, descending the McClintock River with his partner Wm. Meehan were shot in 1898 by Indians named Jim & Dawson Nantuck & another. Jim & Dawson were hanged at Dawson. The other died before the day of hanging.

The charred skeleton of a man, later proved to be Louis Bellias was found by Const. James J. Allmark. Bellias' partner John Stravas or Sarga commonly known as "Little Joe the Greek" was tried at Dawson in Sept. 4. 1900 for the murder of Bellias in Aug. '99 was found guilty of manslaughter & sentenced to 7 years with hard labour.

Ole. Olson. linemen, Wm. Clayson & Linn Relfe were murdered by Geo. O'Brien, near Minto in 1900 who was hanged at Dawson, Aug 23. 1901

Alex King shot. Herbert Davenport his partner on their way on a scow to Dawson. King gave himself up at Klondike City. The crime was committed on July 15, 1900 King was hanged at Dawson. Oct 2. 1900

On Oct. 23 1900, in the Holborn Restaurant James Slorah killed Pearl Mitchell. In Nov. 19. 1900 he was found guilty & sentenced to death but in Feb. 1901 signs of insanity saved him from the gallows. & he was given life imprisonment

Geo. [George] St. Cyr. killed one [James] Davis near Hootalinqua in 1900 On Feb 5. 1901 he was found guilty of murder, but in March signs of insanity saved him from the gallows. for life imprisonment.

In 1902 [Peter] Fournier & [Edward] Labelle murdered [Leon] Bouthilette, [Guy Joseph] Beaudoin, [Alphonse] Constantine, while they slept, on an island 10 miles below Stewart River, frisked them, weighed down the bodies with stones & gave them to the river, then burnt all they could of the evidence. The haul was \$145 & a few trinkets. They also killed Archie Gilbault another French Canadian below Eagle city. Labelle confessed. On Oct. 27. Labelle was tried at Dawson. On Oct. 31 sentenced to death. On Nov 4. Fournier was tried & condemned the same day. Both were hanged at Dawson on Jan 20. 1903 - 52 below zero.

Otto Frank got 14 years for almost beating the brains out of one Sandison, with an axe. in the winter of '98 [1898].

Lainiga, a Swede shot one Bauer in '99 [1899] in the Yukon but got away. Was caught after 3 days in Alaska(?) but got away.

Prater killed his partner in '99 [1899] then went mad.

In the Monte Carlo, Evans killed a dance hall girl named White & then turned the gun on himself.

Harry Davis in the Monte Carlo shot & killed Maude Rosselle & the shot himself. Blanche Lamont was a witness to the shooting

Le Crice shot a woman in Dawson.

In 1903 Herbert Weiser, on Dominion Creek, was arrested on suspicion of poisoning four fellow Germans by doctoring their sugar. He was found guilty & given 15 years at hard labour.

In 1908, a man named [Emil] Anderson was shot through the jaw, near Selkirk & was rendered first aid by Stillman at Selkirk. In his broken English, Anderson told how he was coming from Whitehorse in a small boat, with two others named [David] Bergman & [Ned] Elfors, a Finn, who had joined him in Seattle. On June 8th, 11 miles from Selkirk, Elfors had induced Bergman to go with him to hunt bear. He came back for Anderson to get the game. Elfors fired at him but he got away. Bergman's body was found later by the police - shot to death. On July 6 Elfors was tried for murder, Found guilty & was hanged at Dawson Oct. 6, 1908

In 1915 Alex Gagoff killed four men near Whitehorse, & was hanged at Whitehorse on March 10, 1916 Tom Gagoff, the murderer's cousin threatened to stop the execution by force, was arrested at W.Horse by H.G. [Henry George] Mapley & was given "3 months hard" & fined \$500 or 3 months more.

Romolo Cesari murdered Dominico Melis in Whitehorse in 1914, but was saved from the gallows by insanity after sentence.

Jackie MacIntosh, an Indian, killed Pelly Jim, also an Indian. on Oct. 11. 1927 at WhiteHorse, in a drunken brawl. On Jan 8. 1928 he was given 3 years for manslaughter.

Barney West killed Michel Essanasa in 1932 at Dawson. He was hanged at Dawson on Sept 27. 1932

Below Carmacks in 1926 Const. Thornthwaite found the body of Chas. Smith riddled with bullets & hidden in a cellar. Harry Davis, his partner was given life imprisonment for slaughter.
