

INDEX BY SUBJECTS OF THE TRANSCRIPTS OF THE HEARINGS CONDUCTED BY THE ALASKA HIGHWAY PIPELINE INQUIRY.

In April 1977, the Government of Canada announced its decision to establish the Alaska Highway Pipeline Inquiry. Mr. Kenneth M. Lysyk was appointed as the Chairman of the Board of Inquiry; the Board was composed of two other members: Mr. Willard Phelps nominated by the Yukon Territorial Council and Mrs. Edith Bohmer nominated by the Council for Yukon Indians. The Inquiry was directed to report in a preliminary way on the possible social and economic impacts of the construction of a natural gas pipeline through the southern Yukon, and to report on the attitudes of Yukoners to this proposal.


The hearings were held between May 11, 1977 and July 15, 1977, and the report was submitted to the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development on August 1, 1977. In addition to the formal hearings held at Whitehorse where representatives from Foothills company, governments and associations testified, the Inquiry travelled to seventeen (17) communities throughout the Yukon. Fifty-one (51) volumes of transcripts (total of 7,306 pages) were produced following the hearings held by the Inquiry.

This index by subject of the transcripts has been prepared for the Alaska Highway Pipeline Inquiry in order to help people to find their way through this vast amount of material. It can be useful to any researcher conducting research in the Yukon, since the transcripts contain a good amount of valuable information on a variety of subject matters.

Special thanks are extended to the Yukon Archives who provided useful help both in the selection of subject matter for the index and in the provision of working space.
