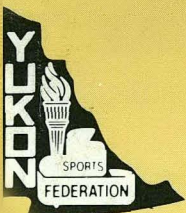
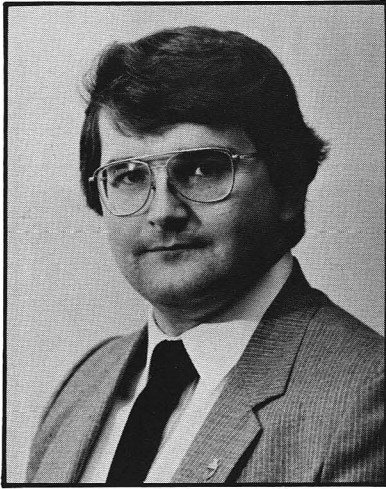

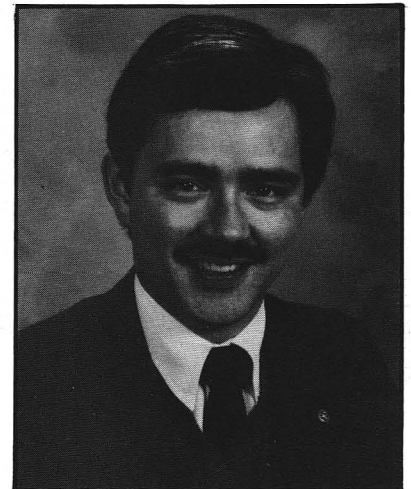

The Takhini Arena was filled to capacity as five contingents paraded onto the ice surface. The many hours of diligent preparation were being rewarded as the 1986 games finally began.

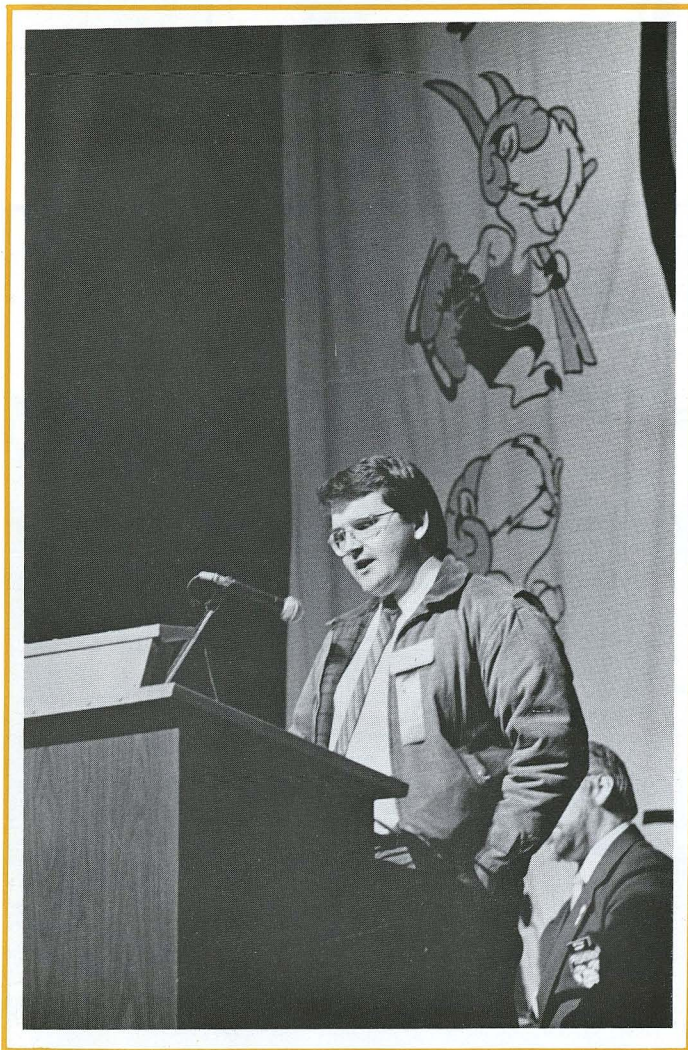
