PREFACE

The contents of this report represent a partial index of the <u>Dawson</u> <u>Daily News</u>, from its founding in 1899 to December 1920. The areas of focus are topics relating to northern Yukon. Broad headings included in this are: Herschel Island, arctic whaling, missionaries, trapping/trading and arctic exploration. Also included in this index are articles referring to Yukon native people and topics pertaining to archaeological and palaeontological discoveries.

In total, there are 414 newspaper listings included here - cross referenced by more than 1000 key words. Each listing contains the article title, date of publication, key words, and a brief summary of the article. An alphabetical index is provided, listing key words and corresponding catalogue numbers. A note on the use of the index follows the summary.

The index should prove to be a valuable finding aid for research on a wide variety of topics relating to the northern Yukon at the turn of the century. All of the articles listed here are available on microfiche at the Yukon Archives.

This index was initiated by Government of Yukon, Heritage Branch in 1988. Several researchers have contributed to its development, including Greg Hare, Rob Ingram, Helen Dobrowolsky and David Porter. It was completed in 1991 by Jan Tosczak, with funding from the Government of Canada's Northern Oil & Gas Action Program (NOGAP).

Special thanks are extended to the staff of Yukon Archives who provided technical and research support.

ABOUT THE INDEX

The index is primarily an alphabetical listing of file names and the corresponding catalogue numbers under which the subject material may be found.

There are two in which an information search may be initiated. The researcher may either use a computer generated search using PC-File or the summary information in the first half of this book. A search may be conducted by cross-referencing a file name, catalogue number or both, using either method.

Either method will allow the researcher to access information on a specific topic very quickly. File names are the keys by which the researcher may review summary information and thus eliminate the need to search uncatalogued newspaper articles for the time period or the subject matter.

Contained within the index are several cases where alternate spellings, additional titles or initials are given in brackets. These have been included as the news articles did not maintain a consensus with names or spelling over time. Effort to provide the correct alphabetical listing and/or the most commonly used spelling has been included in the index. For some words there were simply too many variations so these were given separate listings.

It is important to remember that when doing a computer search that the researcher must be specific when entering the file names as key words will only provided information for a particular spelling in a given news article.
