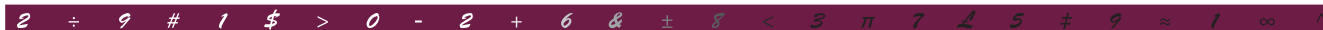

Household Spending in Yukon 2009

Highlights:

- Spending patterns of Yukon households are consistent with the average Canada-wide in the majority of expenditure categories
- Yukon households spend the *most* in the country on Reading Materials and Other Printed Matter, and the *least* on Personal Care
- In 2009, Yukon households spent the *largest* portion of their budgets on shelter (\$13,897), and the *smallest* portion on Games of Chance, (\$211).
- Yukon households spent only \$683 on education in 2009, 45% *less than* the Canada-wide average of \$1,238.

Introduction

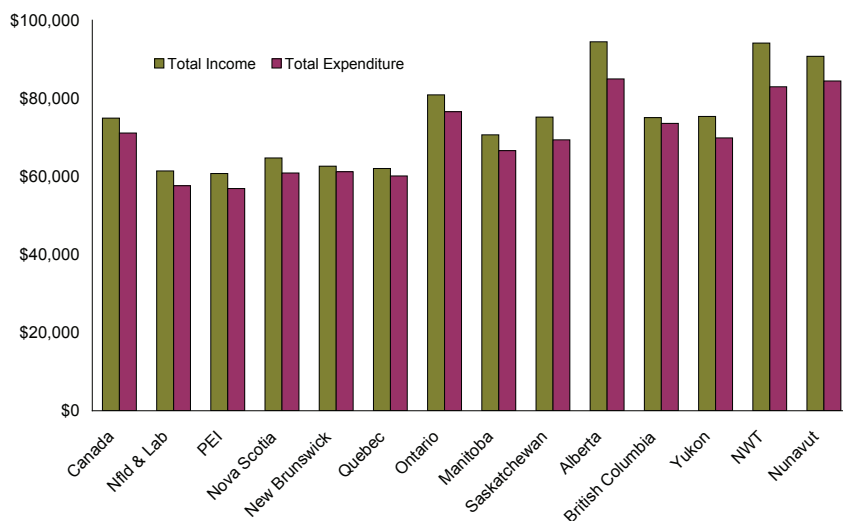
This report presents the results of the 2009 Survey of Household Spending (SHS), conducted January through March 2010 by Statistics Canada. The SHS is conducted annually in the provinces but only every second year in the territories in order to reduce the response burden on the territories' small population base.

Information about the spending patterns, dwelling characteristics, and household equipment of Canadian households during 2009 was obtained by asking people in each province and territory to recall their expenditures for the previous calendar year. This report focuses on spending patterns in Yukon as well as providing comparisons with Canada and other Canadian jurisdictions.

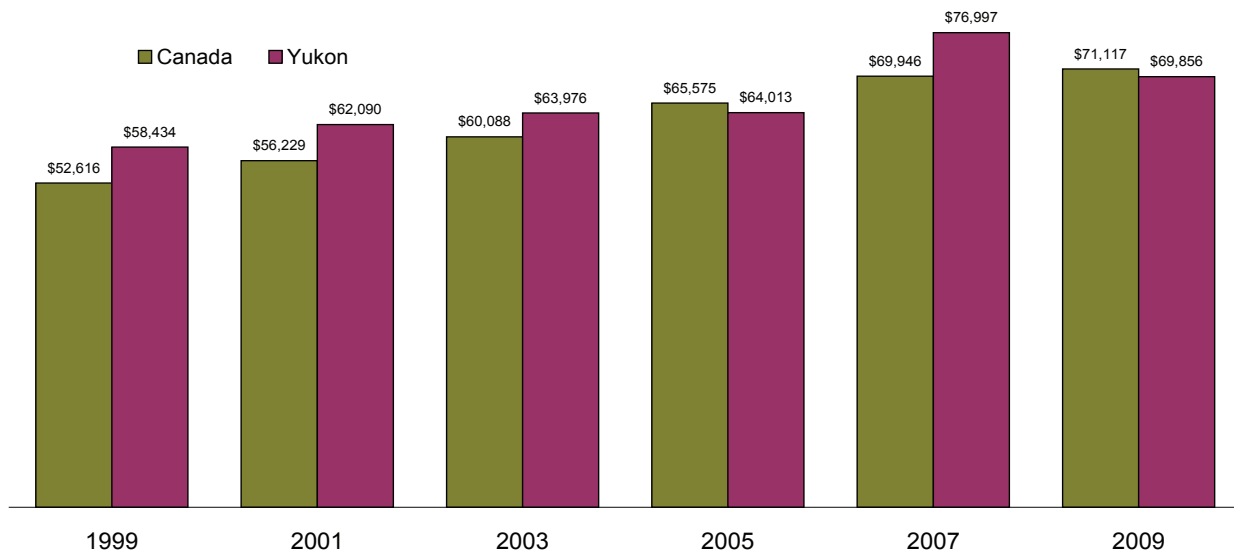
Average Total Household Income and Expenditures



In 2009, the average total household income reported by Yukon households was \$75,340. Yukon households were fifth in total income, with Alberta highest (\$94,471) and P.E.I. (\$60,735) lowest. The average household income for Canada was \$74,921.

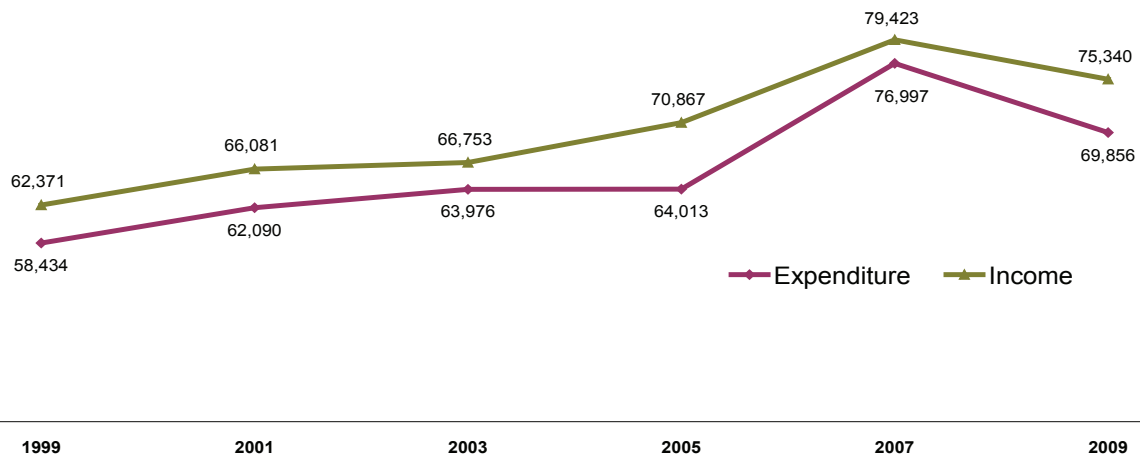
The average total expenditure by Yukon households was \$69,856 in 2009. Yukon was sixth in total expenditure. Alberta had the highest average expenditure at \$84,976, while P.E.I. had the lowest average expenditure at \$56,896. The average total expenditure in Canada was \$71,117.

Average Household Spending, Canada and Yukon, 1999-2009



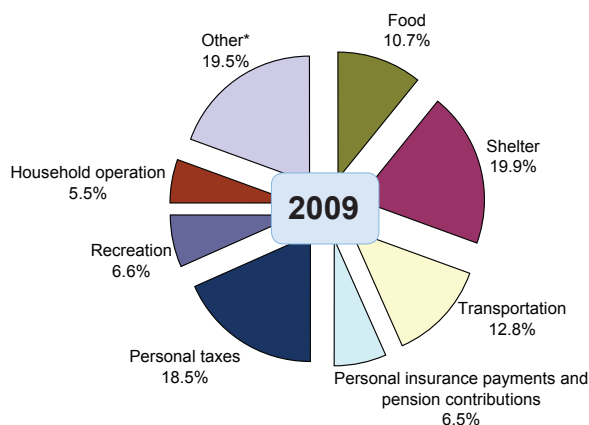

Dollar Share of the Largest Spending Categories, Yukon, 2009



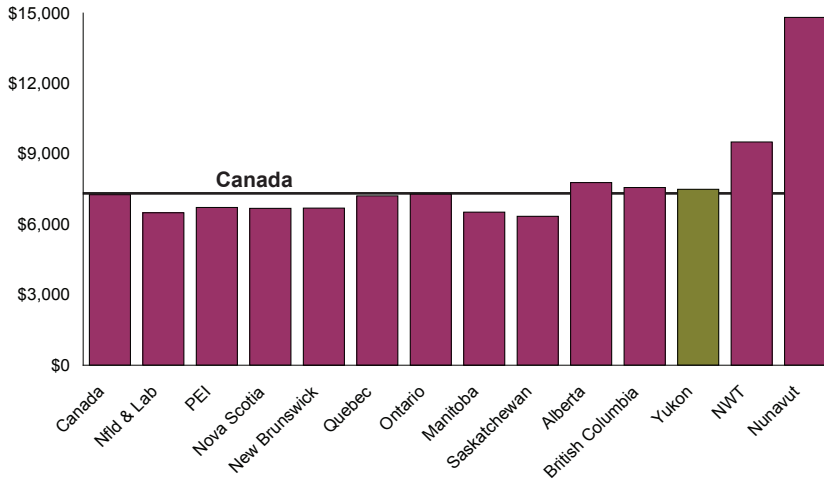
In 2009, the majority of the average Yukon household budget was spent on shelter (19.9 cents of every dollar) and personal taxes (18.5 cents of every dollar).

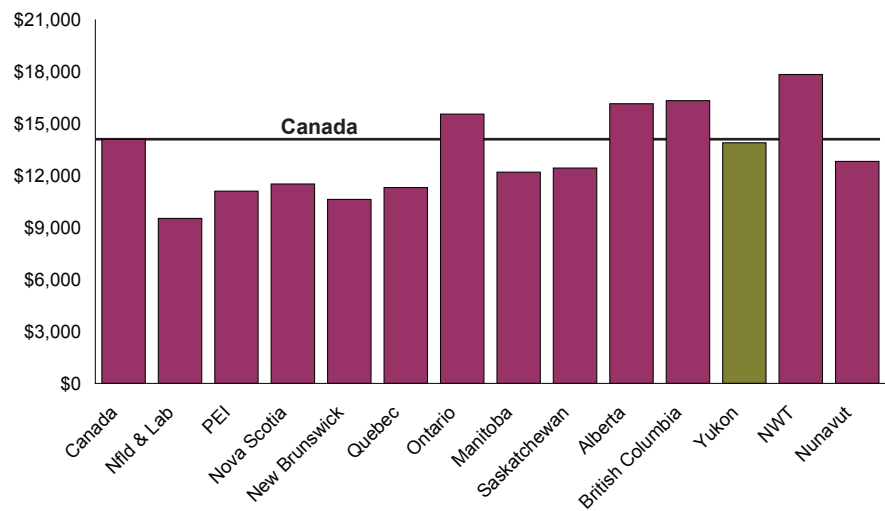
Food



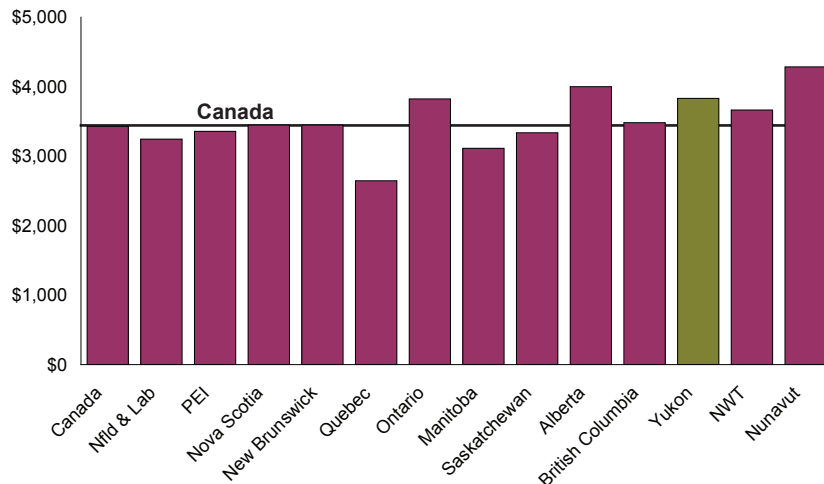
In 2009, the average expenditure on food by Yukon households was \$7,496. Yukon was the fifth highest in spending on food in Canada. Nunavut was highest at \$14,815 and Saskatchewan lowest at \$6,344 per household. In Canada, the average household expenditure on food was \$7,262.

Shelter

The average expenditure on shelter by Yukon households was \$13,897 in 2009. Yukon was the fifth highest in spending on shelter. The N.W.T. was highest at \$17,848, followed by British Columbia at \$16,336. Newfoundland and Labrador households spent the least on shelter, at \$9,534. The average expenditure on shelter in Canada was \$14,095.



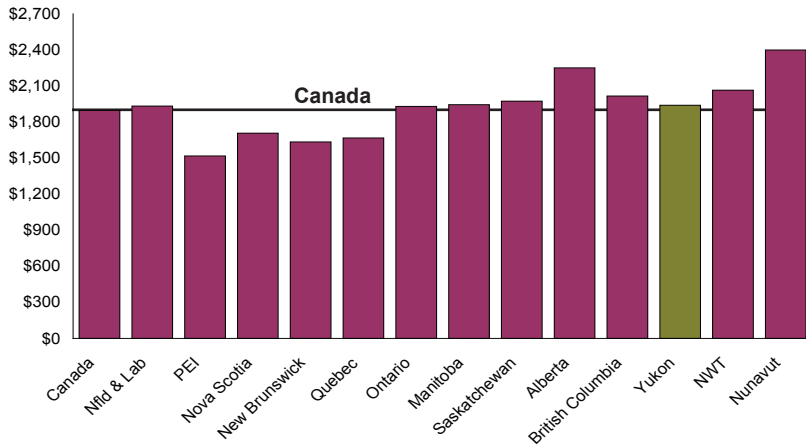
Household Operation



In 2009, the average expenditure on household operations by Yukon households was \$3,831. Yukon was the third highest in spending on household operations, behind the N.W.T. (\$4,285) and Alberta (\$4,001). Quebec was lowest at \$2,647. The average expenditure on household operations in Canada was \$3,428.

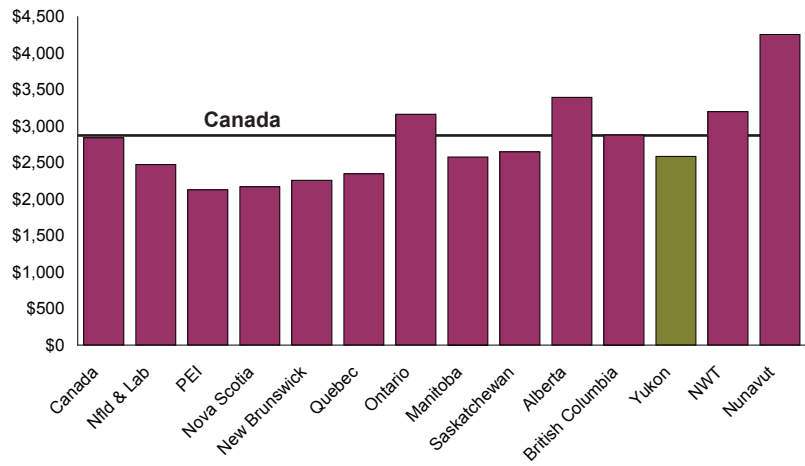
Household Furnishings & Equipment



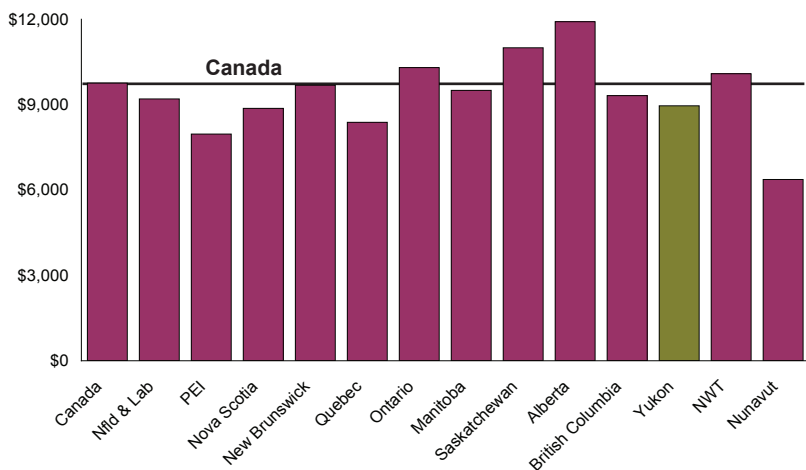
In 2009, the average expenditure on household furnishings and equipment by Yukon households was \$1,940. Yukon was seventh highest in spending on household furnishings and equipment. Nunavut was highest at \$2,400, while P.E.I. was lowest at \$1,518. The average expenditure on household furnishings and equipment in Canada was \$1,896.

Clothing

Yukon households spent an average of \$2,586 on clothing in 2009. Yukon was the seventh lowest in spending in Canada on clothing. Nunavut households spent the most, at \$4,257, while P.E.I. spent the least, at \$2,127. The average expenditure for clothing in Canada was \$2,841.



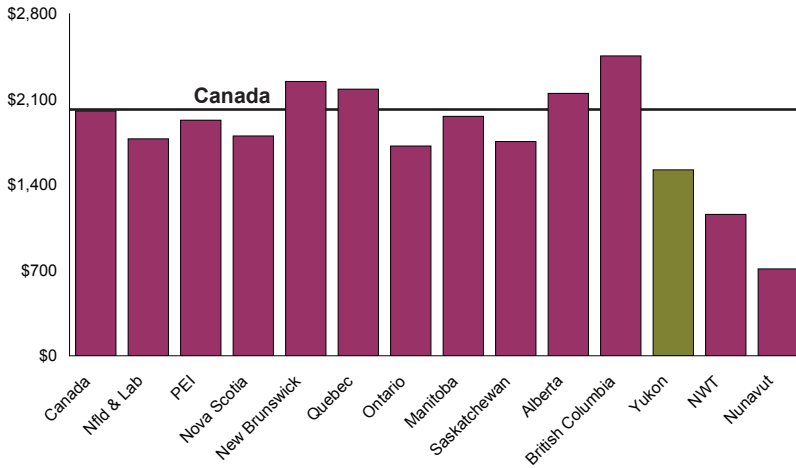
Transportation



The average expenditure on transportation in 2009 was \$8,958 in Yukon. Yukon was the fifth lowest in spending on transportation, above Nova Scotia (\$8,870), Quebec (\$8,380), P.E.I. (\$7,964), and Nunavut (\$6,372). Households in Alberta spent the most in Canada on transportation, at \$11,912. The average expenditure on transportation in Canada was \$9,753.

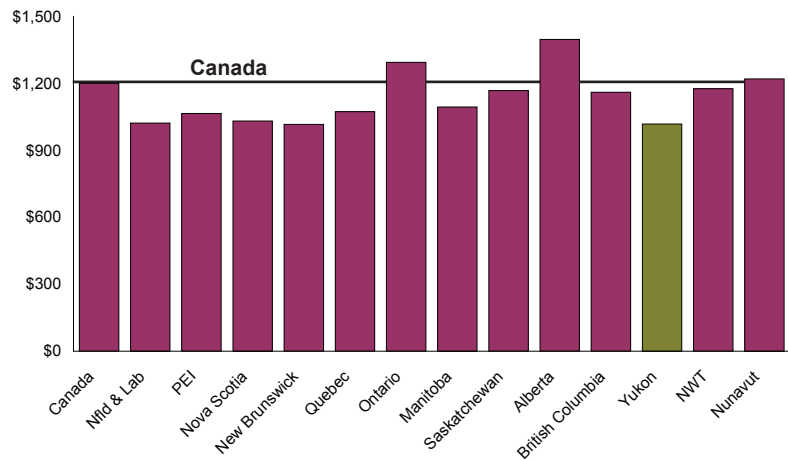
Health Care



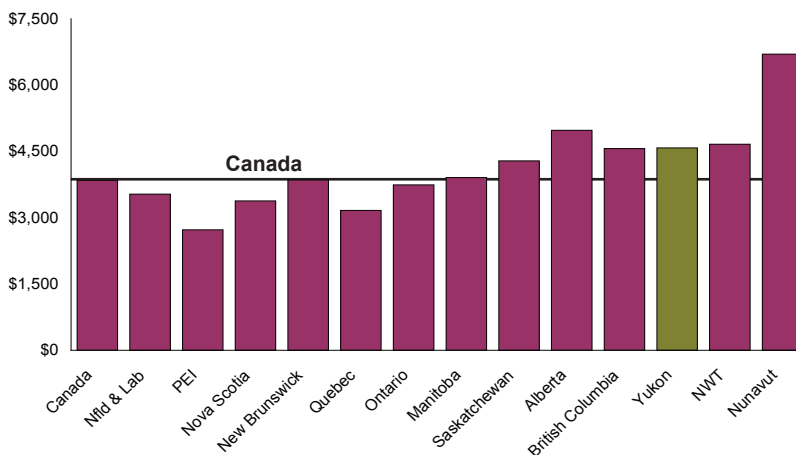
In 2009, the average expenditure on health care by Yukon households was \$1,522. Yukon was third lowest in spending on health care in Canada, above the N.W.T. (\$1,158) and Nunavut (\$711). British Columbia spent the most Canadawide on health care, at \$2,455. The average expenditure on health care in Canada was \$2,004 in 2009.

Personal Care

In 2009, the average expenditure on personal care by Yukon households was \$1,018, second lowest in spending on personal care. Only New Brunswick households spent less on personal care (\$1,016), while households in Alberta spent the most (\$1,397). The average expenditure on personal care in Canada was \$1,200.



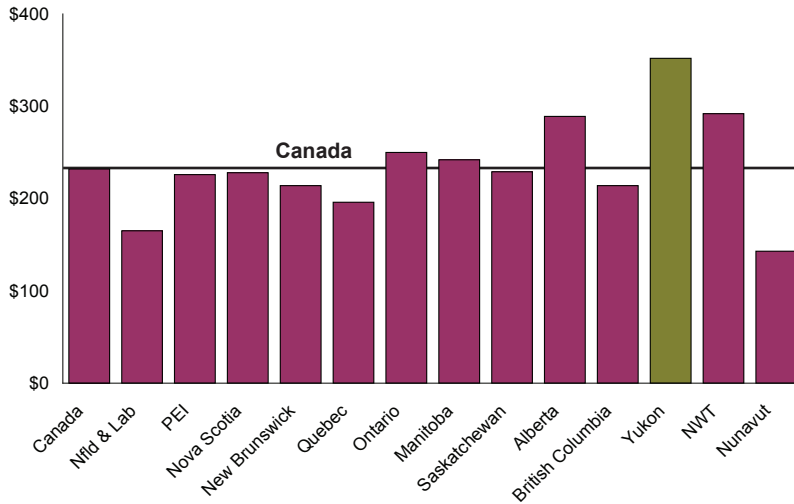
Recreation



The average expenditure on recreation by Yukon households was \$4,579 in 2009. Yukoner's were the fourth highest in spending on recreation, behind Nunavut (\$6,698), Alberta (\$4,976) and the N.W.T. (\$4,661). P.E.I. spent the least on recreation, at \$2,727. The average expenditure on recreation in Canada was \$3,843.

Spending Patterns of Households, Canada, Provinces, & Territories, 2009

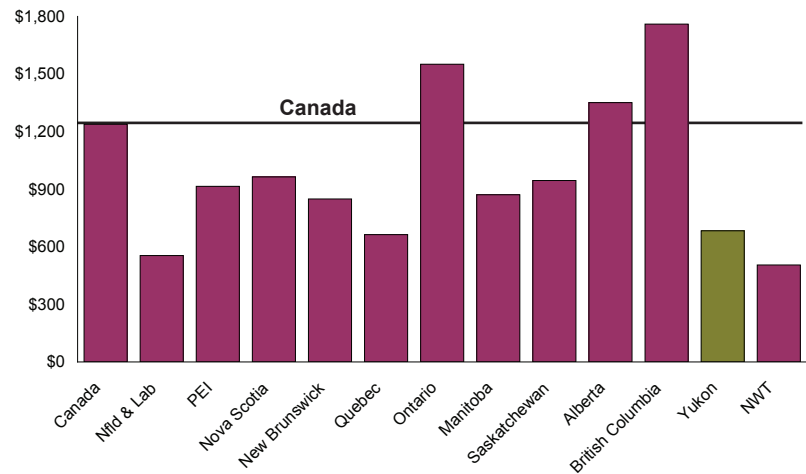
Reading Materials and Other Printed Matter



In 2009, the average expenditure on reading materials and other printed matter by Yukon households was \$352, the highest in spending on this category nationwide. The N.W.T. was second highest at \$292, while Nunavut households spent the least, at \$143 in 2009. The average expenditure on reading materials and other printed matter in Canada was \$232.

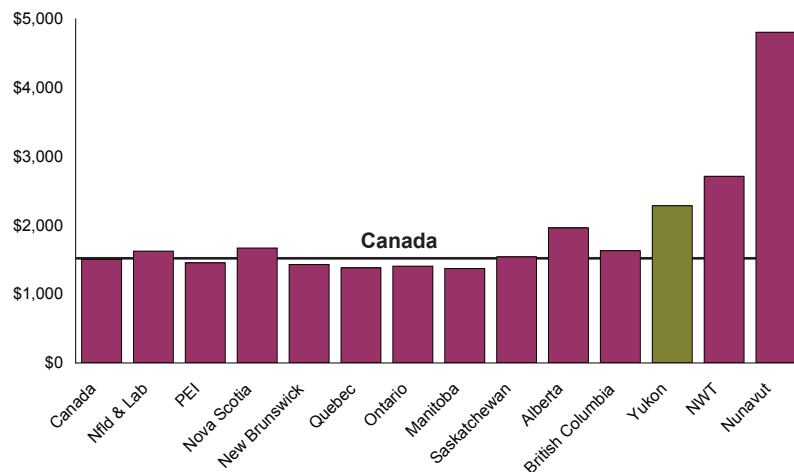
Education

The average expenditure on education by Yukon households was \$683 in 2009. The Yukon was the fourth lowest in spending on education, ahead of the N.W.T. (\$505), Newfoundland (\$554), and Quebec (\$663). Households in British Columbia spent the most on education, at \$1,760. The average expenditure on education in Canada was \$1,238.

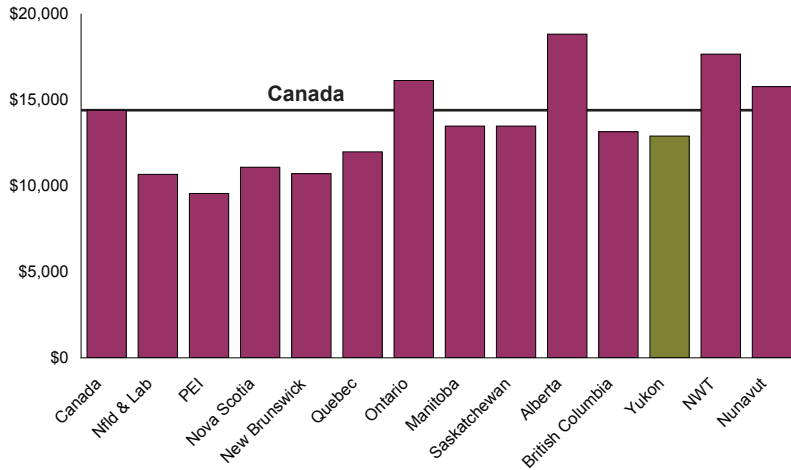
Tobacco Products and Alcoholic Beverages



In 2009, the average expenditure on tobacco products and alcoholic beverages by Yukon households was \$2,285. Yukon was the third highest in spending on tobacco and alcohol, behind Nunavut (\$4,806) and the N.W.T. (\$2,713). Manitoba households spent the least on tobacco products and alcoholic beverages, at \$1,372. The average expenditure on tobacco products and alcoholic beverages in Canada was \$1,506.

Spending Patterns of Households, Canada, Provinces, & Territories, 2009

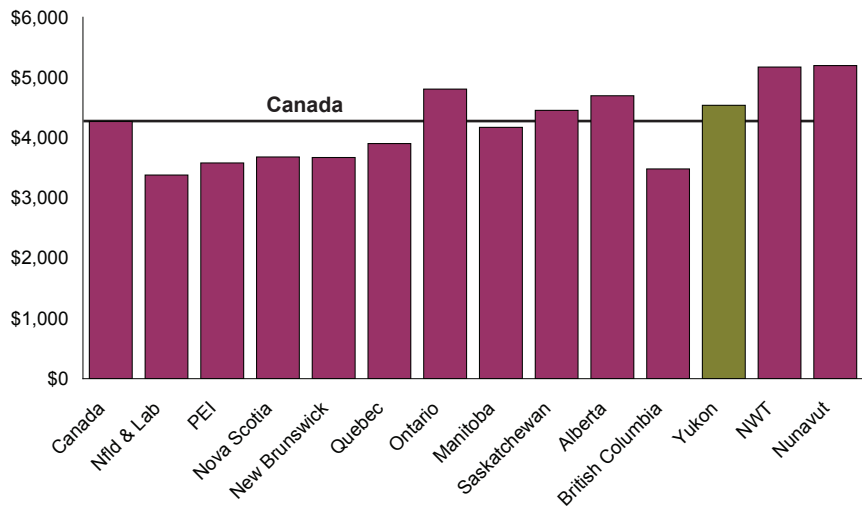
Personal Taxes



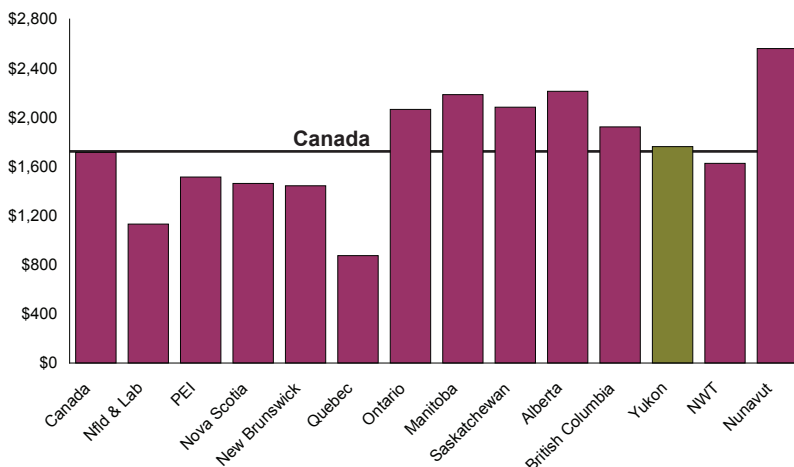
In 2009, the average expenditure on personal taxes by Yukon households was \$12,905. Yukon was the sixth lowest in spending on personal taxes in Canada. Alberta was the highest, at \$18,830, while P.E.I. was the lowest, at \$9,564. The average expenditure on personal taxes in Canada was \$14,399.

Personal Insurance Payments and Pension Contributions

The average expenditure on personal insurance payments and pension contributions by Yukon households was \$4,539 in 2009. Yukon was fifth highest in spending in this category. Nunavut spent the most on personal insurance payments and pension contributions (\$5,198), while Newfoundland and Labrador spent the least (\$3,381). The average expenditure on personal insurance payments and pension contributions in Canada was \$4,269.



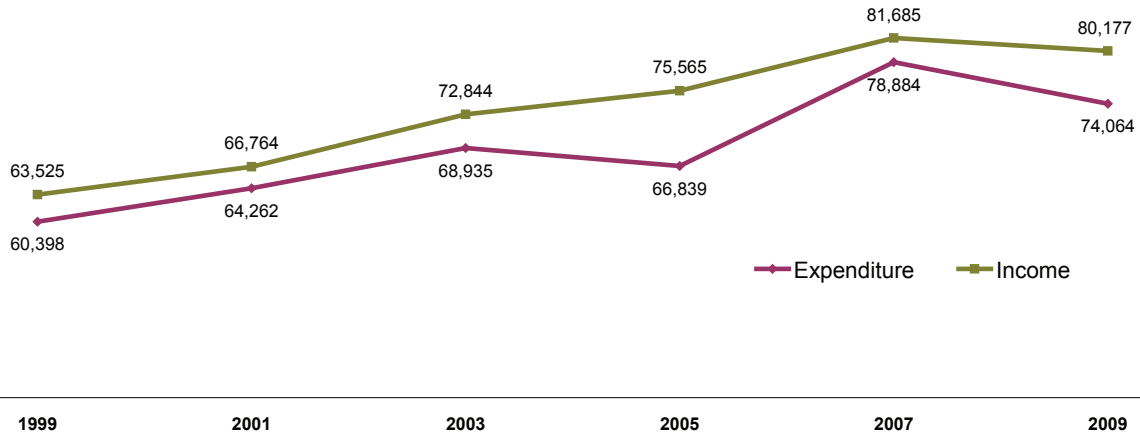
Gifts of Money and Contributions



In 2009, the average expenditure on gifts of money and contributions by Yukon households was \$1,762. Yukon was the seventh highest in spending on gifts of money and contributions. Nunavut was highest (\$2,560) and Quebec was lowest (\$874). The average expenditure on gifts of money and contributions in Canada was \$1,715.

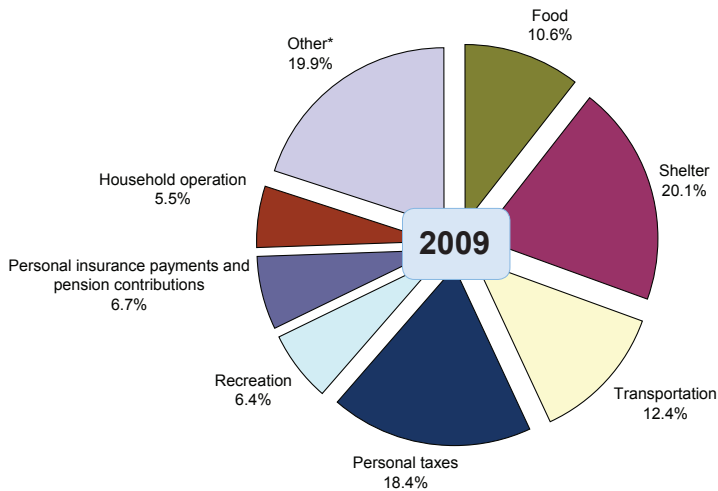
Historical Spending Patterns of Whitehorse Households

Dollar Share of the Largest Spending Categories, Whitehorse, 2009



In 2009, households in Whitehorse spent the largest percentage of their budgets on shelter (20.1 cents of every dollar), followed by personal taxes (18.4 cents of every dollar).

*Other includes household furnishings and equipment; health care; personal care; reading materials and other printed matter; education; tobacco products and alcoholic beverages; clothing; miscellaneous expenditures; games of chance; and gifts of money and contributions.

Did you know...

- Yukon ranked seventh in Canada for the percentage of households with home computers and tenth in households with internet use from home.
- 79.4% of households in Yukon have home computers, compared with 81.7% of households in Canada.
- 71.1% of households in Yukon use the internet from home, compared with 77.8% of households in Canada.

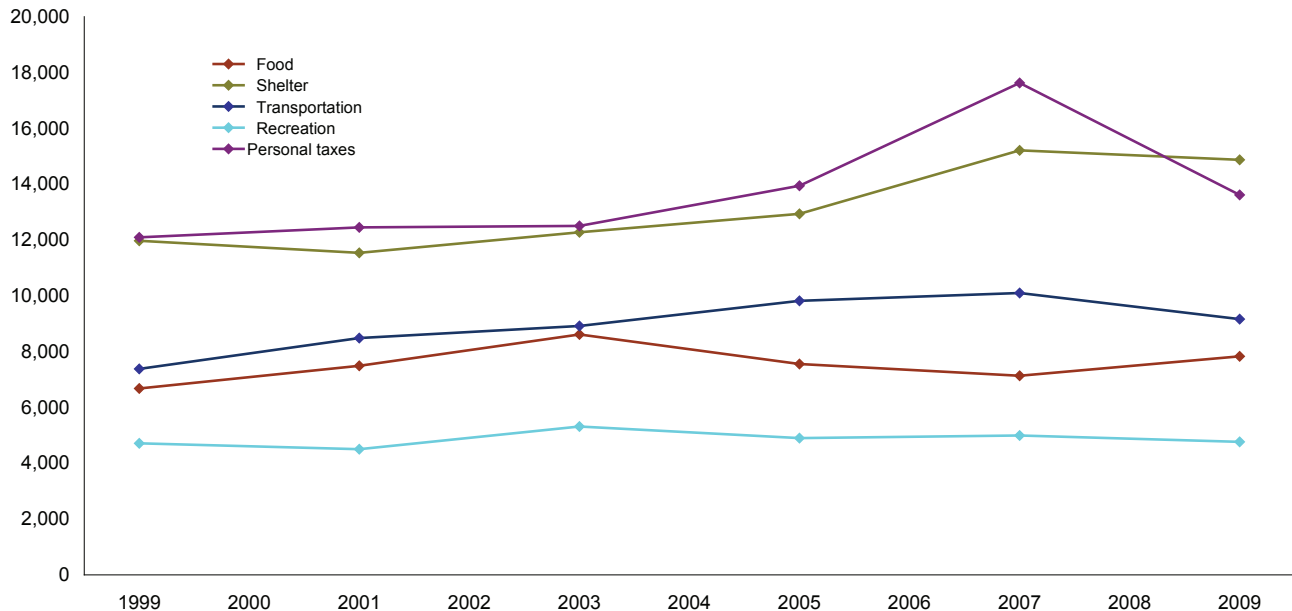

Average Household Spending, Top Five Expenditures, 1999-2009*



Expenditures in all categories increased over time in Whitehorse households. The largest increase in spending from 1999-2009 was on shelter, from \$11,973 in 1999, to \$14,870 in 2009, an increase of \$2,897, or 24.2%. Annual spending on personal taxes rose significantly from 1999-2007, increasing \$5,536, or 45.7%, before falling to \$13,613 in 2009. While expenditures for Whitehorse households have risen steadily from 1999-2009, the average household income has risen as well, from \$63,525 in 1999 to \$80,177 in 2009, an increase of \$16,652, or 26.2%.

Notes: F = Due to reliability concerns, the data in these tables have been replaced by an "F" for detailed spending categories reported by fewer than 30 households, since these would normally have coefficients of variation of 30% or more. This symbol should not be interpreted as zero. The expenditures are included in more reliable aggregates.

Average Expenditure per Person: The average expenditure per person on an item is equal to the average expenditure per household for that item divided by the household size (line #1100). For example, to find the average expenditure per person on food (lines 10000 - 15600):

Average household expenditure on food Example: $\frac{\$7,496}{2.35} = \$3,189.79$ per person
Household size

Average Expenditure per Household: The average expenditure per household is equal to the estimated total expenditures of all households divided by the estimated number of households. The average is based on all households in a column, including households that reported a zero value.

Percentage Reporting: The percentage reporting is the percentage of households that reported purchasing an item. These percentages cannot be added together to form sub-totals.

Average Expenditure per Household Reporting: Average expenditure per household reporting is calculated for those households that reported the expenditure, i.e. without zero values. Average expenditure per household reporting was calculated using unrounded data. Note also that expenditures in this column do not add to sub-totals. To calculate the average expenditure per household reporting the purchase of an item, divide the average household expenditure on that item by the corresponding percentage reporting, and then multiply by 100. For example, to find the average expenditure on pets by households that actually had pet expenses:

Average household expenditure on pet expenses x 100 Example: $\frac{\$607 \times 100}{61.5} = \997.00
Percentage reporting

Percentage of Total Expenditure: The percentage of total expenditure is calculated by expressing the average expenditure per household as a percentage of total expenditure. This statistic is also known as "budget share."
