



### Highlights:

- The estimated population of Yukon on March 31, 2025, was 47,170; an increase of 911, or 2.0%, compared to the figure for March 31, 2024 (46,259).
- Comparing March 31, 2025, to March 31, 2015, Yukon's population increased by 9,748 or 26.0%. The population of the Whitehorse area increased by 8,654, or 29.8%; Dawson City increased by 386, or 19.1%; Watson Lake increased by 32, or 2.2%; and Haines Junction increased by 168, or 19.1%.

### Methodology notes:

Official population estimates prior to June 2010 were based on information in Yukon Health Care Insurance Plan (YHCIP) files and a semi-annual health care update survey that estimated the number of plan members who were no longer Yukon residents. In 2010, the estimation model was revised and the population counts for June 2010 through December 2014 were derived by tracking changes in YHCIP files and other administrative data files. In 2015, the model was further revised to make the approach more comprehensive and to improve accuracy based on information in all available and applicable administrative data files of the Yukon government.

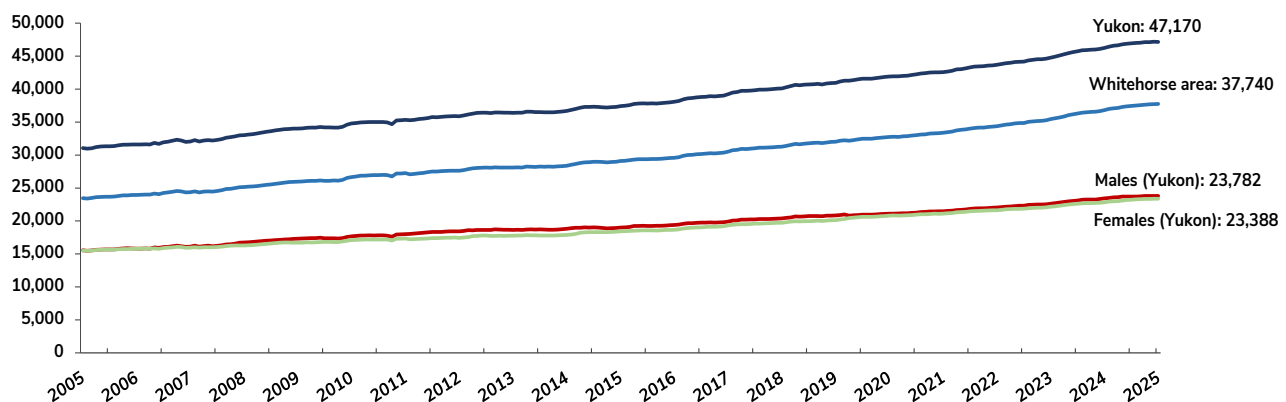
In 2020, the model was updated by prioritizing residential addresses over mailing addresses in the assignment of communities. This update allowed for separate reporting of population estimates for Johnson's Crossing and Mendenhall, and changes in the organization of Whitehorse subdivisions. The changes were applied to all population estimates from June 2019 onwards.

Every five years population estimates are calibrated to estimates based on census counts adjusted for net undercoverage. The most recent calibration was done in April 2024. In addition, changes in community and subdivision populations from one time period to another are not only due to natural population change and migrations, but may also be due to the reassignment of residential addresses as additional administrative data became available.

Given that the number of non-binary individuals in Yukon's administrative files is very small, non-binary individuals are distributed between males and females to protect confidentiality.

All monthly estimates are as of the last day of the month. The June estimates represent annual figures.

### Monthly population, March 31, 2005 to March 31, 2025



- From 2005 through 2014, Yukon's population increased almost steadily in most quarters of every year, except in 2013. Positive growth rates—often very high—have been recorded in each quarter, from 2015 onwards. The March 31, 2025 population was 47,170, a new record high<sup>1</sup> for Yukon.
- On March 31, 2025, Yukon's population (47,170) increased by 46 people, or 0.1%, from the figure for December 31, 2024 (47,124), and increased by 911 people, or 2.0%, from March 31, 2024 (46,259).

<sup>1</sup> Accurate population counts during the Gold Rush are not available. However, the population figure in the Third Census for Yukon (1901) was 27,219.

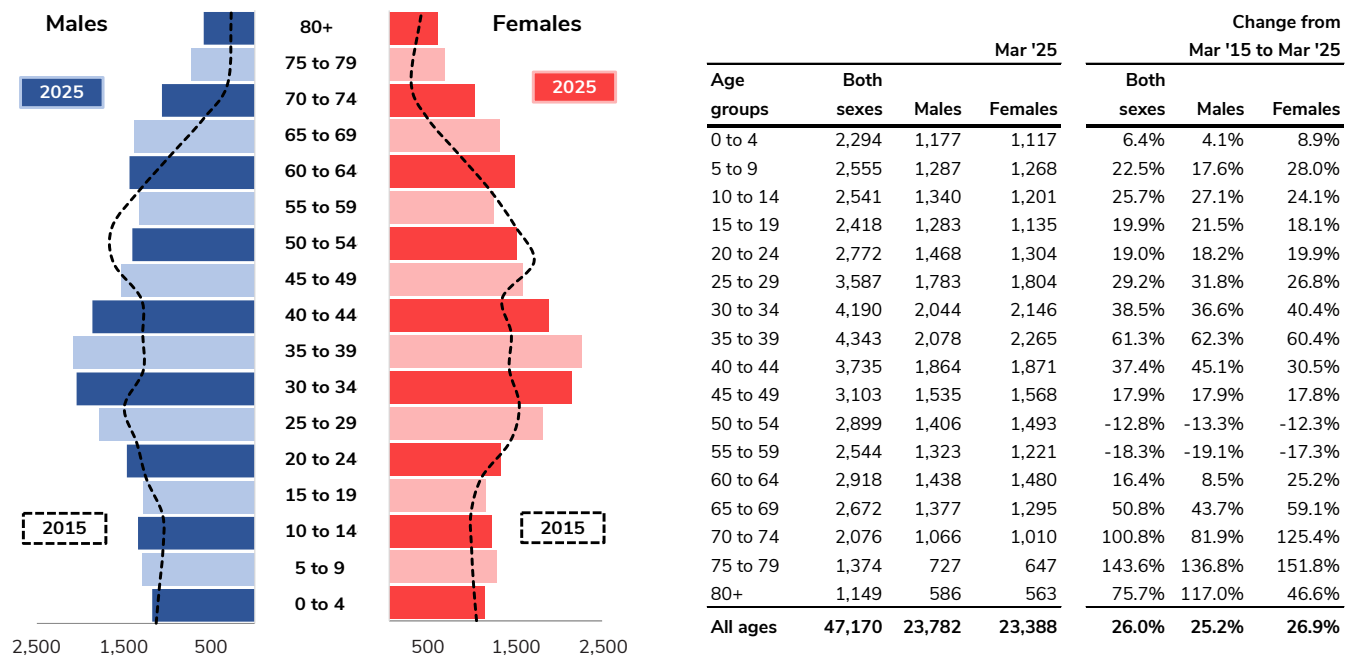

- During the first quarter of 2025, Yukon's population increased by 46 people, or 0.1%, from 47,124 on December 31, 2024, to 47,170 on March 31, 2025.
- Comparing the months of January through March of 2025 to their respective months of 2024, the population increased: 2.4% in January; 2.3% in February; and 2.0% in March.

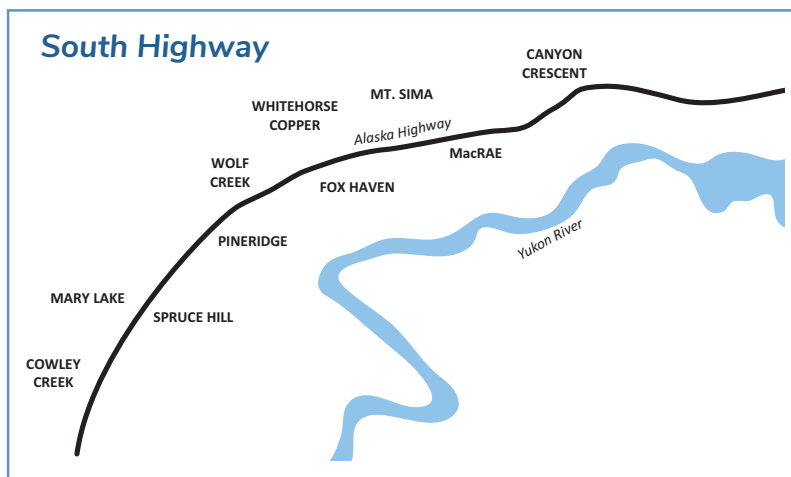
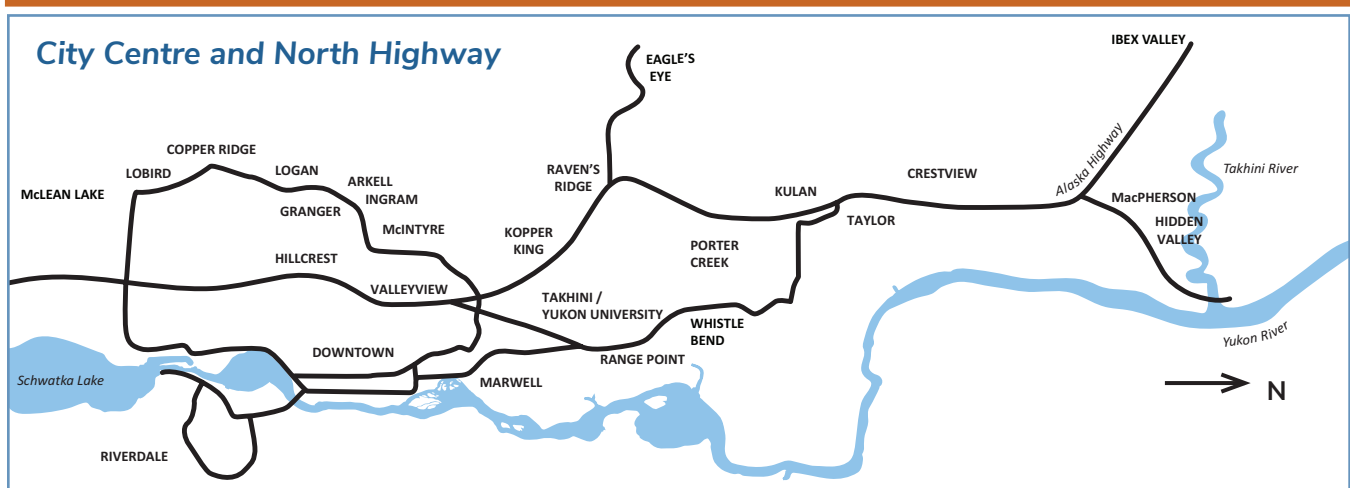
## Population by age group and sex, Yukon, March 31, 2015 to March 31, 2025



Comparing March 31, 2025, to March 31, 2015, growth occurred as follows (15-year age groupings):

- 0 to 14 years increased by 1,126 people, or 18.0%;
- 15 to 29 years increased by 1,654 people, or 23.2%;
- 30 to 44 years increased by 3,832 people, or 45.4%;
- 45 to 59 years decreased by 522 people, or 5.8%;
- 60 to 74 years increased by 2,353 people, or 44.3%; and
- 75 years and over increased by 1,305 people, or 107.1%.

Subdivisions are assigned based on boundaries provided by the City of Whitehorse. Areas outside of the City of Whitehorse boundaries are assigned using Statistics Canada's Census Subdivision (CSD) boundaries within the Census Agglomeration of Whitehorse.

Changes in subdivision (City and CSD subdivision) populations from one time period to another are not only due to natural population change and migrations, but may also be due to the reassignment of residential addresses as additional administrative data become available.
