



Population Report Second Quarter, 2025

Highlights:

- The estimated population of Yukon on June 30, 2025 was 47,505; an increase of 538, or 1.1%, compared to the revised figure for June 30, 2024 (46,967).
- Comparing June 30, 2025 to June 30, 2015, Yukon's population increased by 9,760, or 25.9%. The population of the Whitehorse Area increased by 8,798, or 30.0%; Dawson City increased by 344, or 16.7%; Watson Lake increased by 28, or 1.9%; and Haines Junction increased by 164, or 18.5%.

Methodology notes:

Official population estimates prior to June 2010 were based on information in Yukon Health Care Insurance Plan (YHCIP) files and a semi-annual health care update survey that estimated the number of plan members who were no longer Yukon residents. In 2010, the estimation model was revised and the population counts for June 2010 through December 2014 were derived by tracking changes in YHCIP files and other administrative data files. In 2015, the model was further revised to make the approach more comprehensive and to improve accuracy based on information in all available and applicable administrative data files of the Yukon government.

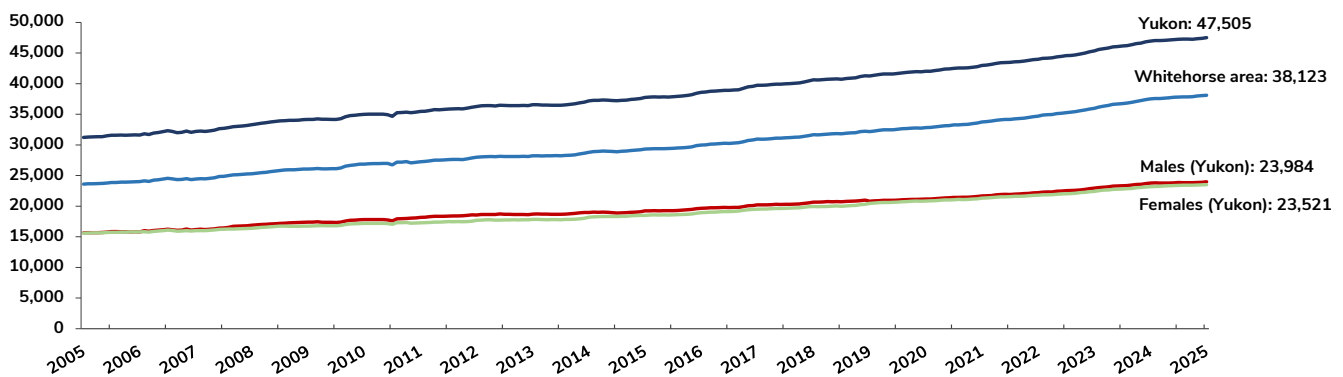
In 2020, the model was updated by prioritizing residential addresses over mailing addresses in the assignment of communities. This update allowed for separate reporting of population estimates for Johnson's Crossing and Mendenhall, and changes in the organization of Whitehorse subdivisions. The changes were applied to all population estimates from June 2019 onwards.

Every five years population estimates are calibrated to estimates based on census counts adjusted for net undercoverage. The most recent calibration was done in April 2024. Revisions to population estimates are also done when additional information and revised administrative data become available.

Given that the number of non-binary individuals in Yukon's administrative files is very small, non-binary individuals are distributed between males and females to protect confidentiality.

All monthly estimates are as of the last day of the month. The June estimates represent annual figures.

- From 2005 through 2014, Yukon's population increased almost steadily in most quarters of every year except in 2013. Positive growth rates — often very high — have been recorded in each quarter, from 2015 onwards. The June 30, 2025 population at 47,505 is the new record-high¹ for Yukon.
- On June 30, 2025, Yukon's population (47,505), increased by 249 people, or 0.5%, from the revised figure for March 31, 2025 (47,256), and increased by 538 people, or 1.1%, from the revised figure for June 30, 2024 (46,967).

¹ Accurate population counts during the Gold Rush are not available. However, the population figure in the first Census for Yukon (1901) was 27,219.

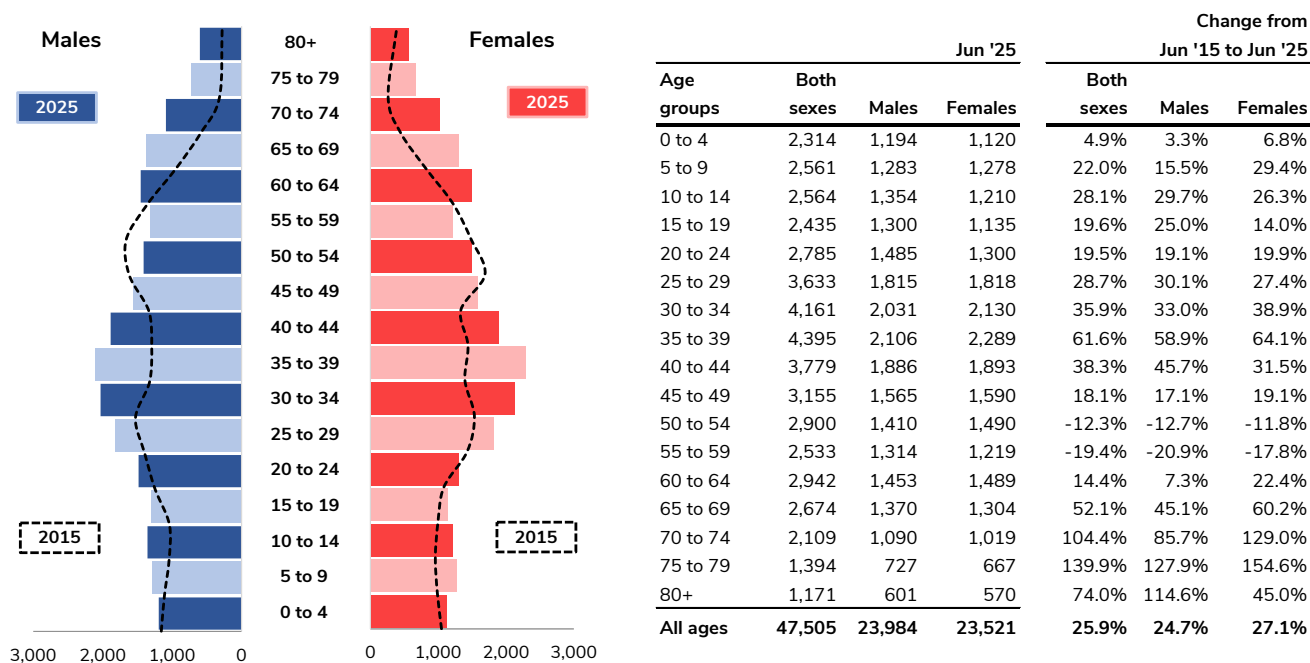

- During the second quarter of 2025, Yukon's population increased by 249 people from 47,256 on March 31, 2025 to 47,505 on June 30, 2025.
- Comparing the months of April through June of 2025 to their respective 2024 months, Yukon's population increased: 1.5% in April; 1.2% in May; and 1.1% in June.

Comparing June 30, 2025 to June 30, 2015, Yukon's population growth by 15-year age group were:

- 0 to 14 years = increased by 1,133 people or 18.0%;
- 15 to 29 years = increased by 1,664 people or 23.1%;
- 30 to 44 years = increased by 3,821 people or 44.9%;
- 45 to 59 years = decreased by 533 people or 5.8%;
- 60 to 74 years = increased by 2,364 people or 44.1%; and
- 75 years and over = increased by 1,311 people or 104.5%.

Annual (June 30th) population by community¹, Yukon, 2015 to 2025

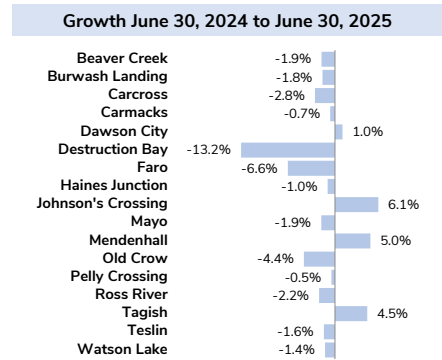
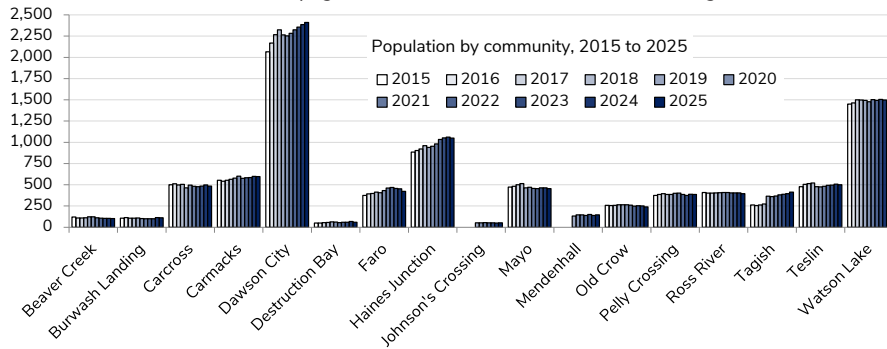

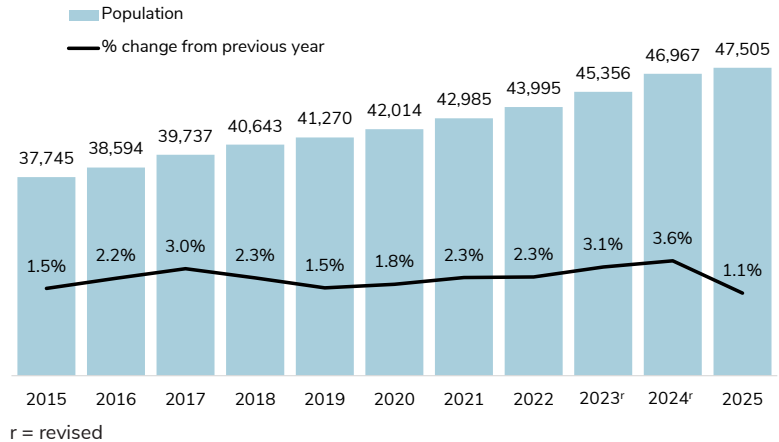

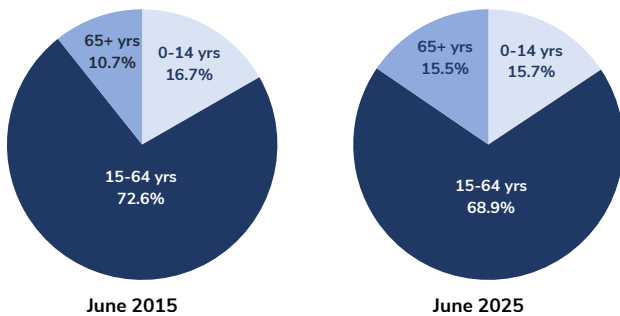
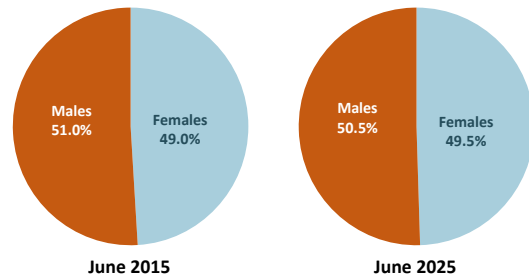
Annual (June 30th) population and growth, Yukon, 2015 to 2025

Yukon's annual population increased by 9,760, from 37,745 in 2015 to 47,505 in 2025. This represents a 25.9% increase and a compound annual growth rate of 2.3%. During the ten-year period from 2015 to 2025, Yukon recorded its lowest annual population growth (1.1%) in 2025; the highest annual population growth during this period was 3.6% in 2024.

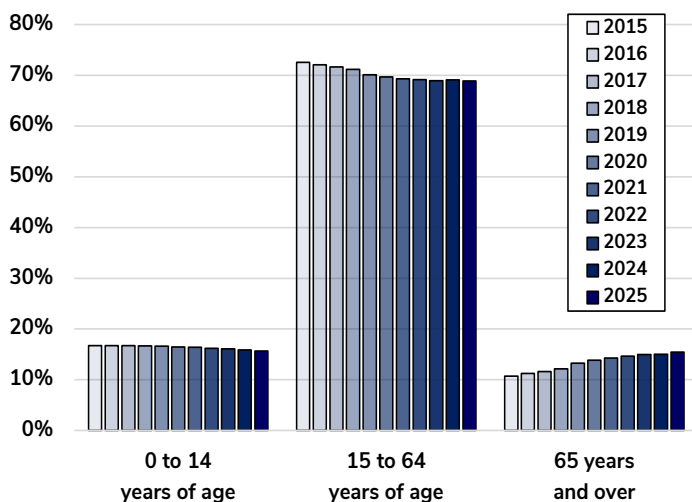


Distribution of annual population by sex and age group, Yukon, 2015 and 2025

- On June 30, 2025, Yukon's population consisted of 23,521 females (49.5%) and 23,984 males (50.5%).
- Ten years earlier, on June 30, 2015, the ratio was slightly more dispersed: there were 18,509 females (49.0%) and 19,236 males (51.0%).



- On June 30, 2025, 15.7% of Yukon's population was under 15 years of age, 68.9% was between 15 and 64 years, and 15.5% was 65 years of age or older.
- Ten years earlier, on June 30, 2015, 16.7% of Yukon's population was under 15 years of age, 72.6% was between 15 and 64 years, and 10.7% was 65 years and over.



The distribution of broad age groups as a percentage of Yukon's annual (June 30th) population over the period from 2015 to 2025 shows:

- the proportion of the population aged 15 to 64 years decreased by 3.7 percentage points to 68.9% in 2025;
- the proportion of the population aged 65 years and over increased by 4.8 percentage points to 15.5% in 2025; and
- the proportion of children (those aged 0 to 14 years) decreased by 1.0 percentage point to 15.7% in 2025.

The dependency ratio — the ratio of the combined population aged 0 to 19 years and 65 years and over to the population aged 20-64 years, multiplied by 100 — for Yukon increased from 48.8 in 2015 to 56.9 in 2025, an increase of 8.0 over the 10-year period.

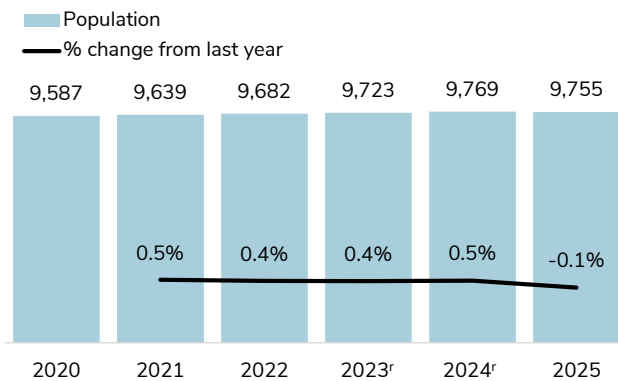

Annual (June 30th) Indigenous population¹ growth, Yukon, 2020 to 2025



In 2025, the estimated Indigenous population¹ (9,755) decreased by 14, or 0.1%, from 2024 (9,769).

In 2025, the year-over-year growth rate in the Whitehorse Area (0.7%) was 2.0 percentage points higher than in rural communities (-1.3%). By comparison, the non-Indigenous population grew by 1.8% in the Whitehorse area and -0.5% in rural communities.

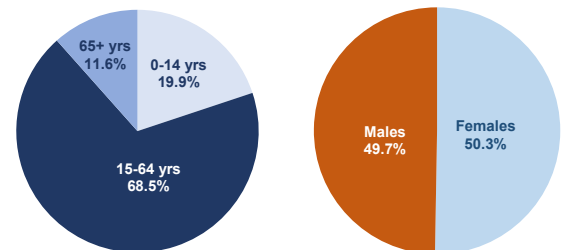

Distribution of Indigenous population¹ by age group and sex, Yukon, 2025

On June 30, 2025, the estimated Indigenous population (on the basis of self-reported identity) in Yukon was 9,755. Of this total:

- 19.9% were aged under 15 years; 68.5% were between 15 and 64 years; and 11.6% were 65 years and over.
- 49.7% were males; 50.3% were females.
- 5,831 (59.8%) resided in the Whitehorse area, while 3,924 (40.2%) resided in rural communities.

In 2025, the Indigenous population (9,755) represented 20.5% of Yukon's population (47,505). The median age for the Indigenous population was 35 years; for non-Indigenous, it was 40 years.

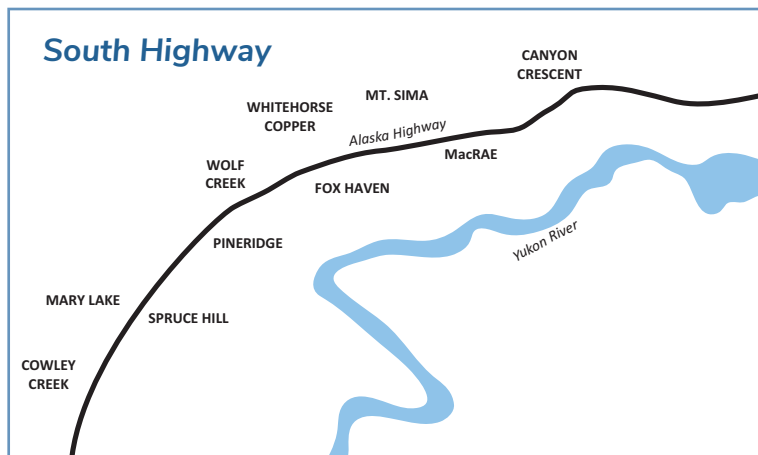
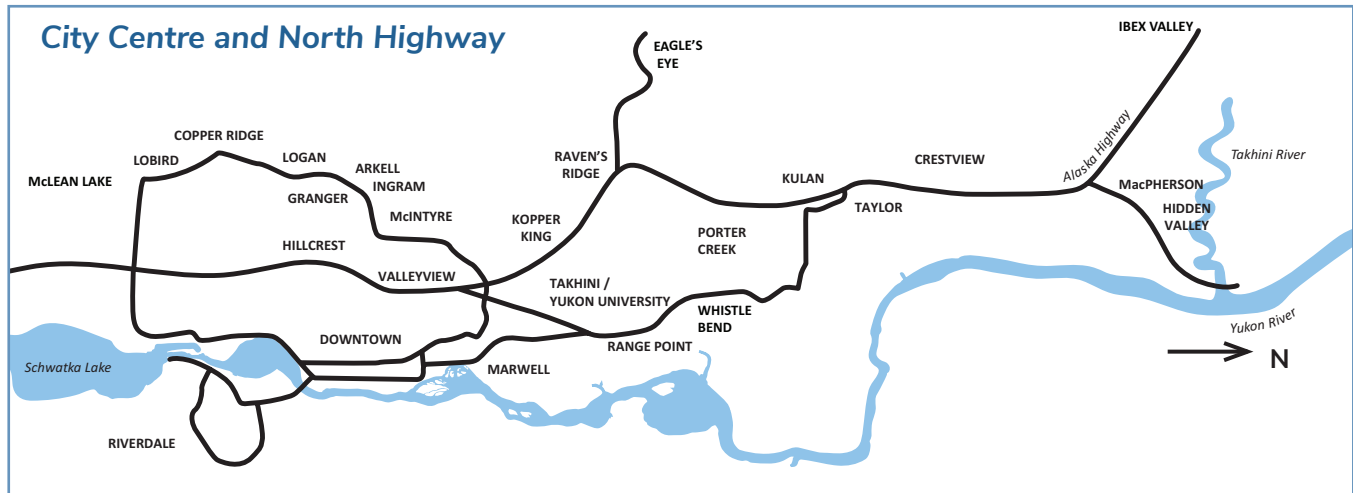


June 2025 by age group

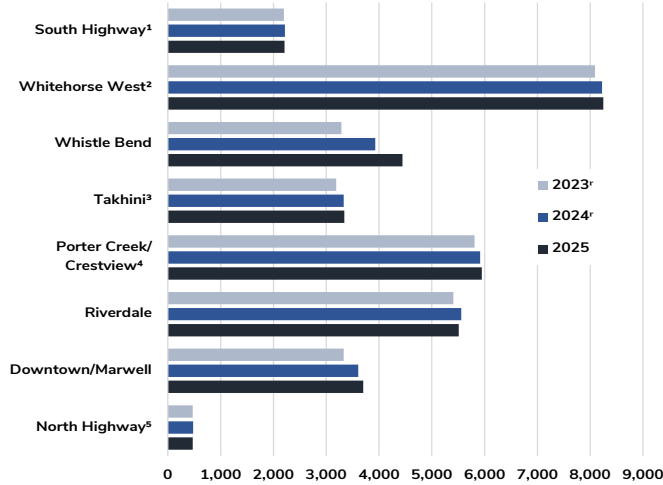

Comparing 2025 to the revised figures for 2024, the population in Whitehorse subdivisions and aggregated subdivisions grew except Riverdale and North and South Highway.

The population changes were:

- 516 (13.1%) in Whistle Bend;
- 93 (2.6%) in Downtown/Marwell;
- 35 (0.6%) in Porter Creek/Crestview⁴;
- 23 (0.3%) in Whitehorse West²;
- 12 (0.4%) in Takhini³;
- -6 (-1.3%) in North Highway⁵;
- -9 (-0.4%) in South Highway¹; and
- -47 (-0.8%) in Riverdale.

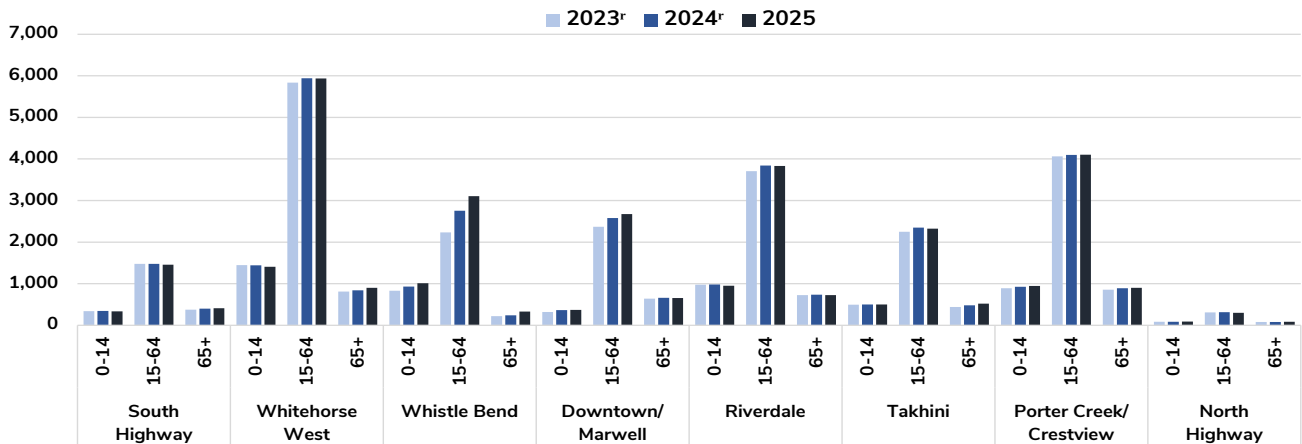

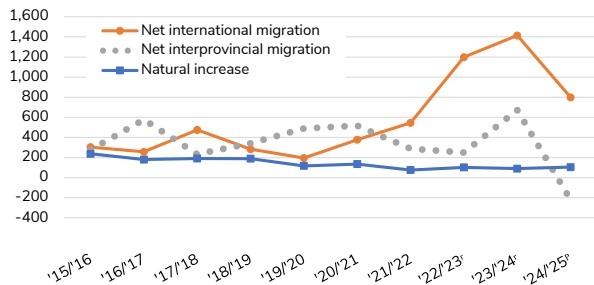
