
# Yukon RRSP Contributions 2017


# **Highlights:**

- In 2017, 25.2% of all Yukon taxfilers contributed a total of \$51.1 million to a Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP), an increase of \$4.6 million, or 9.8%, compared to 2016 (\$46.5 million).
- Yukon's median RRSP contribution amount was \$3,600; the median for males was \$4,340 and for females, \$3,000.

### Total Contributions and Number of RRSP Contributors, Yukon, 2017

- Yukoners contributed \$51.1 million to RRSPs in 2017, up \$4.6 million, or 9.8%, from the 2016 total of \$46.5 million.
- Nationally, Canadians contributed \$42.0 billion to RRSPs in 2017, an increase of \$1.6 billion, or 4.0%, from the 2016 total of \$40.4 billion.






- The number of Yukoners contributing to RRSPs was up, from 6,800 in 2016 to 6,860 in 2017, an increase of 60 people, or 0.9%.
- The number of Canadians contributing to RRSPs increased 0.5%, from 5,936,090 in 2016 to 5,966,630 in 2017.
- In 2017, 25.2% of Yukon taxfilers contributed to an RRSP the highest rate in the country.

#### Median RRSP Contributions, Canada, Provinces and Territories, 2017

- Yukon's median RRSP contribution of \$3,600 in 2017 (\$4,340 for males; \$3,000 for females) was up \$100, or 2.9%, from 2016.
- Yukon and British Columbia ranked the second-highest in median RRSP contributions (\$3,600); Nunavut was the highest at \$3,670. Nationally, the median RRSP contribution in 2017 was \$3,030 (\$3,780 for males; \$2,540 for females), was up \$30, or 1.0%, compared to 2016.

- While women in Yukon represented 51% of the tax-filers in 2017, they accounted for 53% of total RRSP contributors and 44% of the total contributions.
- In the last 18 years for which data are available, Yukon was the only jurisdiction where the proportion of female contributors outnumbered the proportion of male contributors.
- In 2017, the proportion of the total contributions by Yukon female contributors (44%) was the second-highest among all provinces and territories, following Nunavut (46%).
- The median RRSP contribution in 2017 was higher for men than for women in all provinces and territories; the largest gap was in Newfoundland and Labrador (\$1,560) and the smallest was in Manitoba (\$700).
- The average age of Canadian RRSP contributors in 2017 was 46 years as was Yukon contributors' average age.
- Yukon's median employment income for RRSP contributors in 2017 was the fourth-highest in the country at \$73,350, an increase of \$1,930, or 2.7%, from the 2016 figure of \$71,420. Nationally, the median employment income for RRSP contributors increased \$1,720, or 2.8%, from \$61,000 in 2016 to \$62,720 in 2017.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

- In 2017, 2.0% of the total number of RRSP contributors in Yukon were under 25 years of age, with their contributions representing 1.0% of all contributions. Contributors aged 25 to 34 years represented 21.0% of the total contributors, with their contributions representing 13.0% of the total contributions. Persons aged 35 to 44 years accounted for 24.0% of contributors and 18.0% of contributions, while those aged 45 to 54 years accounted for 24.0% percent of contributors and 25.0% of contributions. Yukoners aged 55 to 64 years accounted for 24.0% of the total number of contributors and the largest percentage of total contributions at 34.0%. Those aged 65 years and older accounted for 6.0% of contributors and 10.0% of contributions.
- In 2017, 49.0% of Yukon's RRSP contributors had a total income of \$80,000 or more; 22.0% had a total income between \$60,000 and \$79,999; 17.0% between \$40,000 and \$59,999; 9.0% between \$20,000 and \$39,999 and 2.0% of contributors had a total income of less than \$20,000.
