
Yukon RRSP Contributions 2018


Highlights:

- In 2018, 24.7% of all Yukon taxfilers contributed a total of \$50.0 million to a Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP), a decrease of \$1.1 million, or 2.2%, compared to 2017 (\$51.1 million).
- Yukon's median RRSP contribution amount was \$3,470; the median for males was \$4,160 and for females, \$3,000.

Total Contributions and Number of RRSP Contributors, Yukon, 2018

- Yukoners contributed \$50.0 million to RRSPs in 2018, down \$1.1 million, or 2.2%, from the 2017 total of \$51.1 million.
- Nationally, Canadians contributed \$43.5 billion to RRSPs in 2018, an increase of \$1.5 billion, or 3.6%, from the 2017 total of \$42.0 billion.






- The number of Yukoners contributing to RRSPs was up, from 6,860 in 2017 to 6,870 in 2018, an increase of 10 people, or 0.1%.
- The number of Canadians contributing to RRSPs increased 0.6%, from 5,966,630 in 2017 to 6,003,990 in 2018.
- In 2018, 24.7% of Yukon taxfilers contributed to an RRSP the highest rate in the country.

Median RRSP Contributions, Canada, Provinces and Territories, 2018

- Yukon's median RRSP contribution of \$3,470 in 2018 (\$4,160 for males; \$3,000 for females) was down \$130, or 3.6%, from 2017.
- Yukon ranked the fourth-highest in median RRSP contributions (\$3,470. Nunavut was the highest at \$3,740. Nationally, the median RRSP contribution in 2018 was \$3,130 (\$3,890 for males; \$2,600 for females), was up \$100, or 3.3%, compared to 2017.

- While women in Yukon represented 51% of the taxfilers in 2018, they accounted for 52% of total RRSP contributors and 46% of the total contributions.
- In the last 19 years for which data are available, Yukon was the only jurisdiction where the proportion of female contributors outnumbered the proportion of male contributors.
- In 2018, the proportion of the total contributions by Yukon female contributors (46%) was the second-highest among all provinces and territories, following Nunavut (50%).
- The median RRSP contribution in 2018 was higher for men than for women in all provinces and territories; the largest gap was in British Columbia (\$1,560) and the smallest was in Nunavut (\$370).
- The average age of Canadian RRSP contributors in 2018 was 46 years as was Yukon contributors' average age.
- Yukon's median employment income for RRSP contributors in 2018 was the third-highest in the country at \$75,660, an increase of \$2,310, or 3.1%, from the 2017 figure of \$73,360. Nationally, the median employment income for RRSP contributors increased \$1,940, or 3.1%, from \$62,720 in 2017 to \$64,660 in 2018.

DID YOU KNOW?

- In 2018, 2.0% of the total number of RRSP contributors in Yukon were under 25 years of age, with their contributions representing 1.0% of all contributions. Contributors aged 25 to 34 years represented 20.0% of the total contributors, with their contributions representing 13.0% of the total contributions. Persons aged 35 to 44 years accounted for 24.0% of contributors and 19.0% of contributions, while those aged 45 to 54 years accounted for 23.0% percent of contributors and 24.0% of contributions. Yukoners aged 55 to 64 years accounted for 24.0% of the total number of contributors and the largest percentage of total contributions at 34.0%. Those aged 65 years and older accounted for 6.0% of contributors and 9.0% of contributions.
- In 2018, 51.0% of Yukon's RRSP contributors had a total income of \$80,000 or more; 22.0% had a total income between \$60,000 and \$79,999; 17.0% between \$40,000 and \$59,999; 8.0% between \$20,000 and \$39,999 and 2.0% of contributors had a total income of less than \$20,000.
