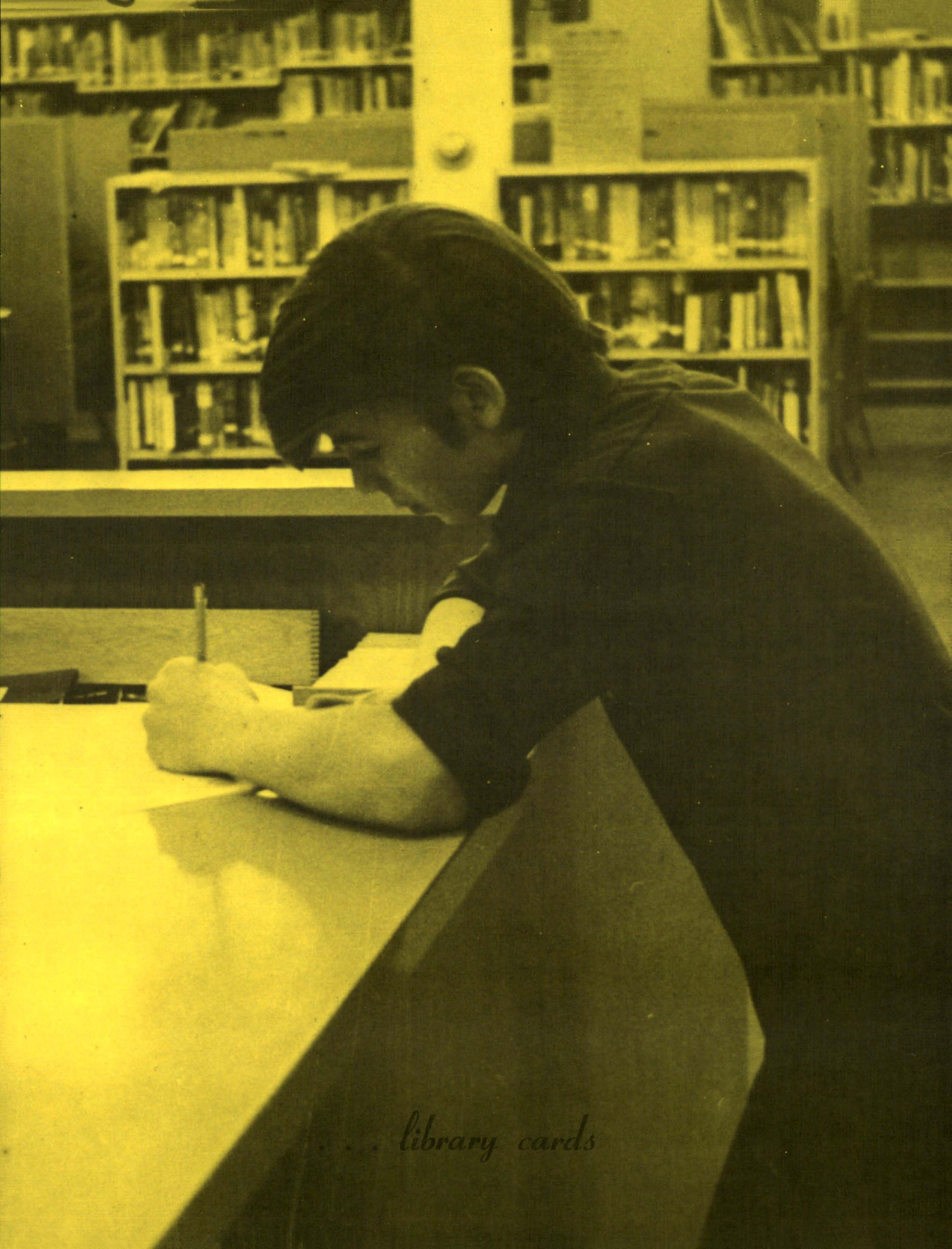




YEARBOOK MESSAGE 1972-73

And I want to go back--and I will.

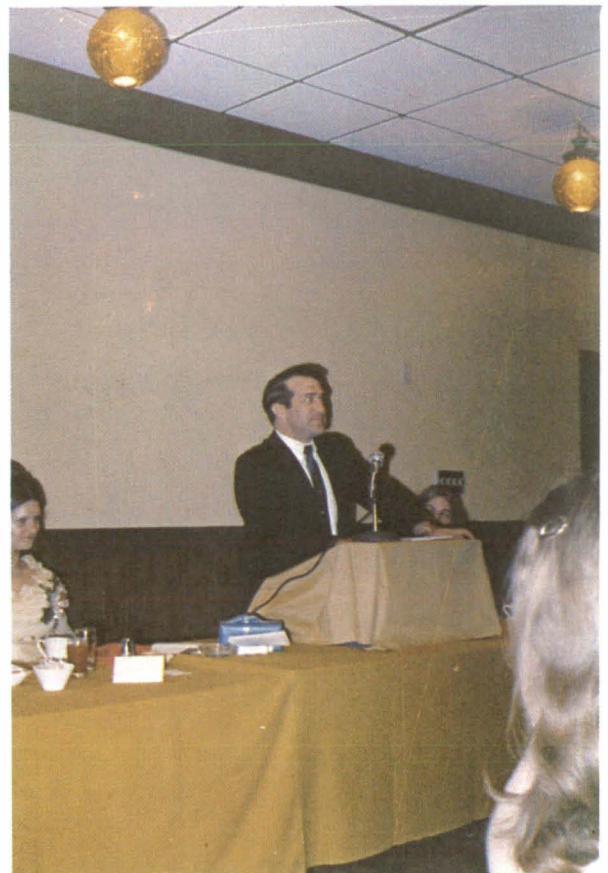
