Yukon Council now in Session memorializes His Excellency, The Governor General in Council relative inadequacy of Federal Grant, asks that it be increased by sixty-five thousand dollars and urges consideration of following:

Extensive new placer mining development under way in Dawson District involving expenditure running to several million dollars. Roads are unfit for transportation of the hundreds of tons of machinery and equipment required. Lartz mining development in silver lead at Mayo resulting new in substantial production concentrates and shipping ore justifying increased expenditure for roads. It is already assured that Yukon will be a substantial and increasing contributor to Canada's mineral production for many years to come, enabling it to absorb labour and make large purchases of supplies and equipment in Canada. There is no unemployment problem in the Territory, the only unemployed being the aged and infirm indigents the care of which constitutes a considerable drain on the funds of the Territory."
