NOW THEREFORE it is respectfully asked that funds be provided for the payment of a bounty of \$20.00 on each wolf or coyote destroyed in the Yukon Territory, without requiring the person claiming the bounty from time to time to deliver to the Government the pelts of the animals killed."

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Controller of the Territory be respectfully requested to transmit this Memorial to His Excellency in Council.
