BE IT RESOLVED by the Yukon Council now in session that His Excellency the Governor-General in Council be memorialized as follows:

mose, caribou, and fur-bearing animals in the Yukon
Territory by wolves and coyotes
with its resultant effects,
and in particular that of
working hardship on the Indians
of the Territory, whose livelihood and means of supply are
every year becoming more
seriously timestened, has been
the matter of Lemorials by
this Council to his
Excellency-in-Council in years
past;

AND WHEREAS this Council has had Urgent representations from authentic sources that the number of wolves and coyotes is increasing with such alarming rapidity that many horses have been killed, and that the depredations have made inroads on the big game of the Territory to such an extent that Big Game hunters will no longer find this field an attractive one for their expeditions, in that ninety per cent of the game has been destroyed in some sections and they are unable to obtain the bag limit allowed by law;

AND WEEREAS the expeditions of Big Game hunters are of much benefit not only to the Yukon but to Canada as a whole, by reason of the very considerable sums of money spent by such parties;

AND WHENMAS in the Province of British Columbia, the North West Territories, and the Territory of Alaska, all adjoining the Yukon, bounties are given on wolves and coyotes, which in effect makes the Yukon a sanctuary for these animals;

NOW THEREFORE the Council respectfully urges that provision be made for the payment of a bounty of 10.00 on each wolf or coyote destroyed in the Yukon Territory, without requiring delivery of the pelts of the animals killed.
