3. Resolved that a sum not exceeding \$7300.00 be granted to the Commissioner for Salaries and Travelling Expenses for the twelve months ending March 31st 1941.
4. Resolved that a sum not exceeding \$4425.00 be granted to the Commissioner for Sessional Indemnity and Travelling Expenses; Election of new Council; and for Plebiscite re sale of Liquor, for the Yukon Council for the twelve months ending March 31st 1941.

5. Resolved that a sum not exceeding \$39,465.00 be granted to the Commissioner for Schools for the twelve months ending March 31st 1941.
6. Resolved that a sum not exceeding \$77,800.00 be granted to the Commissioner for Grants to Hospitals and for Charities and Public Health for the twelve months ending March 31st 1941.
7. Resolved that a sum not exceeding \$18,000.00 be granted to the Commissioner for grants to Libraries and Reading Rooms, and to the City of Dawson, for the twelve months ending March 31st 1941.
8. Resolved that a sum not exceeding \$22,025.00 be granted to the Commissioner for Miscellaneous Expenditure for the twelve months ending March 31st 1941.
9. Resolved that a sum not exceeding \$47,435.00 be granted to the Commissioner for Roads, Bridges and Public Works for the twelve months ending March 31st 1941.
10. Resolved that a sum not exceeding \$42,300.00 be granted to the Commissioner for the City of Dawson for the twelve months ending March 31st 1941.

Ordered that the Report be received and concurred in.

The said Resolutions, being read a second time, were agreed to.

On Motion of Mr. Wilson:

Ordered that the rules be suspended and that the Council resolve itself into a Committee of the whole on Ways and Means.

Council, according to Order, resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole on Ways and Means, and after some time spent therein the Speaker resumed the Chair, and:

Mr. Wilson reported that the Committee had come to several resolutions.

Ordered that the Report be now read.

1. Resolved that towards making good the supply granted the Commissioner for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1940, the sum of \$165,824.92 be granted out of the Territorial Revenue Fund.
2. Resolved that towards making good the supply granted the Commissioner for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1940, the sum of \$168.15 be granted out of the City of Dawson Revenue Fund.
3. Resolved that towards making good the supply granted the Commissioner for the twelve months ending March 31st 1941, the sum of \$216,450.00 be granted out of the Territorial Revenue Fund.
4. Resolved that towards making good the supply granted the Commissioner for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1941, the sum of \$42,300.00 be granted out of the City of Dawson Revenue Fund.

Ordered that the Report be received and concurred in.

The said Resolutions, being read a second time, were agreed to.

On Motion of Mr. Wilson:

Ordered that the rules be suspended and that he have leave to introduce a Bill entitled: "An Ordinance for granting to the Commissioner certain sums of money to defray the expenses of the Public Service of the Territory and the City of Dawson".

Mr. Wilson accordingly presented the said Bill, No. 18, and the same was received and read a first time.

On Motion of Mr. Wilson:

Ordered that the rules be suspended and that the Bill No. 18 be now read a second time.

Bill No. 18 was accordingly read a second time.

On Motion of Mr. Wilson:

Ordered that the Speaker do now leave the Chair and that the Council resolve itself into a Committee of the whole to consider the Bill No. 18.

The Council, according to Order, resolved itself into Committee of the whole to consider the Bill No. 18, and after some time spent therein the Speaker resumed the Chair and Mr. Wilson reported Bill No. 10 agreed to without amendment.

On Motion of Mr. Wilson:

Ordered that the rules be suspended and that the Bill No. 18 be now read a third time.

Bill No. 18 was accordingly read a third time.

On Motion of Mr. Wilson:

Ordered that the Bill No. 18 be now passed and be entitled: "An Ordinance for granting to the Commissioner certain sums of money to defray the expenses of the Public Service of the Territory and the City of Dawson."

The Clerk then informed the Council that the Controller was pleased to assent to the following Bills:
