This being the first day of the First Session of the Thirteenth Wholly Elective Council of the Yukon Territory, pursuant to a Proclamation of the Controller of the said Territory dated the 25th day of February, 1944, the Members present having previously subscribed to the Oath, took their seats.

The Members present were:

John R. Fraser, for Dawson District.  
Alexander A. Smith, for Whitehorse District.

Due to the absence of Ernest J. Corp, member for Mayo District, who was unavoidably delayed, the Council adjourned until Friday, April 28th, at 3 o'clock p.m.

Owing to the continued absence of the Member for Mayo District the Session was adjourned until 4.30 p.m. May 2nd.

The Clerk, having taken his seat at the table, stated as follows:

"Gentlemen of the Council:

I have the honour to inform you that I am directed by the Controller to request that you do now proceed to the election of a Speaker."

A request from the local Board of the Dawson Miners' Union that the hours of labor for the Yukon Territory shall be eight (8) hours per day, forty-eight (48) hours per week, with time and one-half for overtime, and with overtime to include Sundays and legal holidays.

As this matter involves a question of hours of labor in the Dominion the Department of Labor at Ottawa had been communicated with by wire, and a reply had been received from Humphrey Mitchell, Minister of Labor, as follows:

Retel the Council is competent to enact such legislation at the present time as it may have been formerly but such legislation will if it is repugnant to overridden Dominion legislation under the War Measures Act be inoperative stop legislation requiring an employer to alter his wage rates or terms of employment affecting compensation would be repugnant to the wartime wages control order 1943 insofar as such employer is subject to that order.

The Council therefore resolved that no action be taken.

On Motion of Mr. Smith:

It was resolved that the Clerk of the Council be instructed to enter the following recommendation on the minutes of the Journal:

"That in order to facilitate the operations and increase the efficiency of the Fire Department in the Town of Whitehorse, signs be placed at all street intersections showing the names of the streets, and also that some system of numbering of houses and other buildings be adopted. These improvements would not only be of great assistance in the locating of fires whenever necessary, but would add materially to the convenience of townspeople and visitors alike."

On Motion of Mr. Fraser:

The Committee recommended that the sum of \$2,500.00 be granted for the purpose named, on condition that the mining interests concerned contribute a like amount towards the project.
