



#### TESLIN ROADS

Winter has arrived and our Village Roads are in winter driving conditions so please drive cautiously.

#### ASSET MANAGEMENT

Our Asset registers are now complete and Council has passed an asset policy we are now drafting an asset management plan for all our asset categories and creating an asset management framework

#### SOLID WASTE FACILITY (LANDFILL)

To comply with our new waste management permit, we have done some upgrades to our transfer station these upgrades also make it more user-friendly. The new bylaw has been passed by Council and the new fees will come into effect January 2017. Curbside Collection fees will increase to \$ 25.00 per month for residential and \$50.00 per month for commercial if commercial customers need more than two pickups in a week the charge will be \$30.00 per extra collection. The landfill fees and fines are listed in the Teslin Post, available at the Village office, posted at the landfill and on our website. If you would like to review the bylaw please stop by or call the Village Office.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home and at work to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

#### LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful on what is being flushed down the system.

#### WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The new Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition and we are planning some regular maintenance for the summer months

Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

Please keep your driveway accessible for the water truck.

Our new water truck has arrived, is in service and we are happy with the purchase.



#### DOG CONTROL

We have received some complaints and concerns about dogs running at large. Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take these reports very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

The Yukon Government has announced a new community dog spay program which began Aug. 1<sup>st</sup>, the project will provide \$ 250.00 per spay surgery of one female dog, per dog owner in rural communities. Teslin Tlingit Council and Village of Teslin have created a program to enhance the YG program by assisting residents with neutering male dogs. The joint Councils will provide up to \$ 250.00 to residents of Teslin for one male dog. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

#### RECREATION BUILDINGS

Our Recreation buildings are ready for the winter season. Hockey, public skating and curling are all scheduled throughout the week; see the recreation calendar for dates and times. We are busy planning for building upgrades at the recreation complex, watch for public consultation meetings.

#### OTHER

It's that time of year again where we are planning projects and preparing budgets for 2017.

Our auditor will be here during the week of Feb. 20th to finalize 2016 year end.

#### Hours of operation

The Teslin landfill only accepts these items on a regular basis.

- Household Garbage
- Clean Metal Metal products by themselves with NO other products attached, rubber, wood, plastic, etc.
- Cars-NO fluids and NO tires otherwise a handling fee will be charged
- Tires Tires on rims will be charged a sorting and handling fee of \$10.00
  - I. 19" rim and smaller tire (no charge)
  - II. 20" rim and larger tire (\$31.00)
- Electronic Waste Computers, radios, TV's or any other electronic device
- Compost All organic waste
- Construction Waste –Construction waste deemed as special waste will not be accepted
- Burnables –Brush, Scrap lumber, yard trimmings, etc.
- Recycle Center- All non -refundable recycling has to be sorted in bins at the recycling center. All refundable recyclables will be counted at the recycling center.

Non Refundables -tin cans, milk jugs, cardboard, plastic, glass & paper
Refundables -aluminum cans, glass bottles, wine bottles, juice boxes and plastic
bottles

Any larger items or any products not listed above will have to be brought to the Village of Teslin's attention prior to being dropped off at the landfill. If you are unsure of any items call the Village of Teslin and we will tell you if we can accept them at the landfill.

Dumping fees are attached and posted at the landfill or can be found on our website www.teslin.ca.

Special waste will be accepted at the Village of Teslin's public works yard and not at the landfill.

#### The Teslin Training Fund

In the fall of 2016, the Teslin Training Fund (TTF) was established for Teslin area residents to support training that maintains or increases employment opportunities and prepares community members for potential employment. The TTF provides funding for employment training to:

- · Individuals to support specific employment training needs;
- · Teslin based organizations engaged in employment training that benefits the community.

Individual or groups can apply for up to 75% of course costs for employment related training such as tuition, books, and travel. Individual applicants must be Teslin residents, or live in Teslin Tlingit Council Traditional Territory within the Yukon Territory, who have been a resident in for one year prior to the application funding deadline date. Applicants must be Canadian residents. Group applications from Teslin-based organizations are also accepted.

There are four intakes over the year with funding deadlines on the second Thursday of February, April, August, and November. Applicants are encouraged to apply in advance of training and the applications. However, to allow for courses that fall between intakes, applicants can apply to the next available deadline after the training.

<u>For example:</u> An opportunity came up to take training in May. The April deadline has already passed but the applicant may make application to the next deadline which is August. If an applicant submits that same application in November, the application would be denied as it should have been submitted in August.

Applications are reviewed by a locally based committee and funding decisions are based on eligibility, merit and an ability to meet fund criteria. The VOT, TTC, DDC, and Teslin campus also have representatives on the committee. The committee is still looking for a Member-at-large. Please contact the Village of Teslin if you are interested in applying to sit on the committee.

The TTF is funded by the Yukon Government Department of Education and is administered by the Village of Teslin. Funding guidelines and application forms are available at the Village of Teslin and the Teslin campus of Yukon College.







All dogs must be licensed with the Village Of Teslin. There are two programs sponsored by YG & TTC/VOT to assist dog owners with the vet bill to have your dog spayed or neutered. Dogs running at large (off their property & not with the owner) will be picked up by the Village of Teslin. We only hold dogs in our pound for 3 business days after that the dog will be relocated or re-homed.




























#### **Instructions**
