

TESLIN ROADS

All roads are in summer driving condition we will be sweeping the gravel off the roads in the near future.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY (LANDFILL)

To comply with our new waste management permit, we have done some upgrades to our transfer station these upgrades also make it more user-friendly. The new bylaw has been passed by Council and the new fees will come into effect January 2017. Curbside Collection fees will increase to \$ 25.00 per month for residential and \$50.00 per month for commercial if commercial customers need more than two pickups in a week the charge will be \$30.00 per extra collection. The landfill fees and fines are listed in the Teslin Post, available at the Village office, posted at the landfill and on our website. If you would like to review the bylaw please stop by or call the Village Office.

Over the next few months we will be implementing the new bin system at the landfill; construction waste, metal, and appliance areas of the landfill will be closed to the public and the public will drop these waste streams into designated bins that are setup near the household waste bin. Arrangements can be made with the Village office for commercial vehicles to continue have access to the designated areas.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home and at work to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful on what is being flushed down the system.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The new Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition and we are planning some regular maintenance for the summer months. The annual water report is due at the end of March we are compiling information and will have the report to the water board by the end of the month

Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

Please keep your driveway accessible for the water truck.



DOG CONTROL

We have received some complaints and concerns about dogs running at large. Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take these reports very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

The Yukon Government has announced a new community dog spay program which began Aug. 1st, the project will provide \$ 250.00 per spay surgery of one female dog, per dog owner in rural communities. Teslin Tlingit Council and Village of Teslin have created a program to enhance the YG program by assisting residents with neutering male dogs. The joint Councils will provide up to \$ 250.00 to residents of Teslin for one male dog. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

RECREATION BUILDINGS

The survey results on the curling rink upgrades have been compiled and reviewed. 114 surveys were filled out and 79% would like us to explore option #1 which was to remove one sheet of curling ice to add room for a viewing wall, a small addition would be added to the building to house two bowling lanes, a multi-purpose area, an office, a storage room and a senior center/youth center. Our next step will be to source or funding to assist with the upgrade.

Check out the recreation schedule, there are lots of activities and programs for everyone.

Community Cleanup day is scheduled for Friday May 19th please call the Village office if you have garbage to be picked up. Please ensure all garbage is sorted; free dump weekend on Friday May 19th and Saturday May 20th.

15 Brilliant Life Hacks to Speed up your Spring Cleaning

1. ADD A LAZY SUSAN TO YOUR FRIDGE

9. WASH YOUR WINDOWS ON A CLOUDY DAY

For a quick made-at-home window-washing solution, mix equal parts white vinegar and warm water or add one teaspoon of mild dishwashing liquid to several gallons of water. But time your cleaning wisely: Sunshine will cause your windows to dry too quickly, leaving streaks

10. DUST WITH FABRIC SOFTENER SHEETS

Dryer sheets are a cheap substitute for more expensive electrostatic cloths, and they work just as well. Lone socks that have lost their mates, when worn as a mitten, also work for dusting tight areas and Venetian blinds. Always remember to work top to bottom when dusting to avoid wasting time going over surfaces twice.

11. TOSS EXPIRED TOILETRIES

If your medicine cabinet is starting to seem over-cluttered, spring cleaning is the perfect time to re-check the expiration date on all your toiletries and trash anything that's past its prime. You can check the Internet for specifics, but sunscreen should only stick around for a few years after you purchase it, and mascara should be replaced every couple of months.

12. USE A HAIR DRYER TO BANISH WATER RINGS

Someone hasn't been using a coaster and now your wood coffee table paid the price and has those telltale white water rings. Try erasing them with a hair dryer. Simply blast the offending spot on high heat until it starts to disappear. Once it's gone, rub a little bit of olive oil on the area to recondition the wood.

13. USE YOUR DISHWASHER FOR MORE THAN DISHES

There are tons of things that you can clean in the dishwasher that don't have anything to do with place settings. Once every few months, toss some of the following into the dishwasher for a deep clean: contact lens cases, hair brushes, makeup brushes, pet dishes, plastic kids toys, refrigerator shelves, soap dishes, tweezers, various knobs and pulls, and even your showerhead (if it's removable).

14. CLEAN YOUR DISHWASHER

What good is a dirty dishwasher? After you remove any visible grime, place a (dishwasher safe) cup of vinegar on the top shelf and run the hottest cycle your dishwasher has. After that, sprinkle a cupful of baking soda around the bottom and run it through a short but complete cycle using the hottest water.

15. CLEAN YOUR SHOWERHEAD

If your showerhead isn't detachable and thus can't be run through the dishwasher, you can clean it by letting it soak in vinegar overnight. First, fill a sandwich baggie with vinegar and then carefully secure the bag over the showerhead so it's fully submerged—you can use an elastic hair tie or rubber band. Leave the whole thing to soak overnight—just be sure you remember to remove the vinegar bag before you turn on the shower in the morning!




