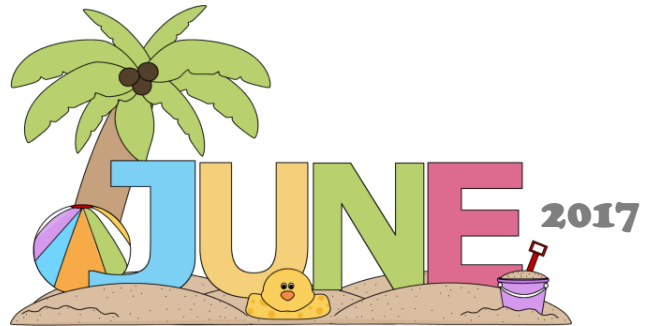

## **TESLIN ROADS**

All roads are in summer driving condition we will be out patching and cleaning culverts in the near future. We are working with DDC on the planning and start-up of our road (BST) project. We will be placing BST on Dream Ave (Airport Subdivision), Remaining streets in the new Sawmill Road Subdivision and Fox Point.

## **SOLID WASTE FACILITY (LANDFILL)**

To comply with our new waste management permit, we have done some upgrades to our transfer station these upgrades also make it more user-friendly. The new bylaw has been passed by Council and the new fees were in effect January 2017. The landfill fees and fines are listed in the Teslin Post, available at the Village office, posted at the landfill and on our website. If you would like to review the bylaw please stop by or call the Village Office.

Over the next few months we will be implementing the new bin system at the landfill; construction waste, metal, and appliance areas of the landfill will be closed to the public and the public will drop these waste streams into designated bins that are setup near the household waste bin. Arrangements can be made with the Village office for commercial vehicles to continue have access to the designated areas.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home and at work o reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

## **LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM**

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful on what is being flushed down the system.

## **WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY**

The new Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition and we are planning some regular maintenance for the summer months. The annual water report is due at the end of March we are compiling information and will have the report to the water board by the end of the month

Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

Please keep your driveway accessible for the water truck.





## **DOG CONTROL**

We have received some complaints and concerns about dogs running at large. Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take these reports very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

The Yukon Government has announced a new community dog spay program which began Aug. 1<sup>st</sup>, the project will provide \$ 250.00 per spay surgery of one female dog, per dog owner in rural communities. Teslin Tlingit Council and Village of Teslin have created a program to enhance the YG program by assisting residents with neutering male dogs. The joint Councils will provide up to \$ 250.00 to residents of Teslin for one male dog. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

## **RECREATION BUILDINGS**

We are busy preparing the schedule for summer activities, a package with information on summer camps will be sent home with the kids. Check out Teslin recreation Facebook page, the recreation calendar, and posters around town for programming and events.

Community Cleanup day was a success once again. We have a list of 38 Vehicles to be pickup from around town and taken to the landfill!

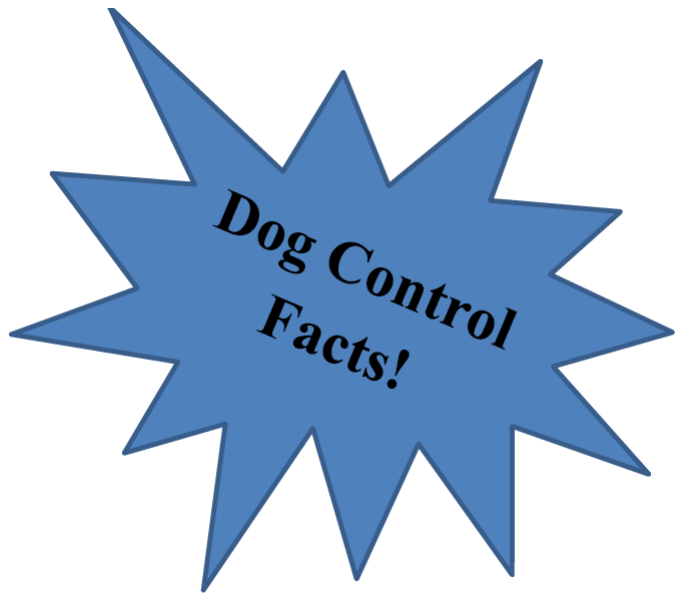

We only hold dogs in our pound for 3 business days after that the dog will be relocated or re-homed.

## February 16<sup>th</sup>, 2017 – Public Engagement Session

Stantec helped the Village of Teslin (VoT) and Teslin Tlingit Council (TTC) facilitate a Public Engagement Session on February 16<sup>th</sup>, 2017. There were approximately 50 attendees. The three main projects discussed during the session included: Connector Road, Central Biomass System and Ditching and Drainage Program. Public engagement is an important part of ongoing community involvement and making the projects better that were identified in the Community Development Plan. A World Café exercise was used to gather and provide information on each project. During the World Café, the community members gathered in small groups to address concerns, opportunities, what is needed to make a great project, and project involvement. There was a table for each project with an additional table for TTC Heritage.

Some key takeaways from the engagement session included:

- Ongoing communication (through email / newsletters)
- Local employment opportunities
- Concerns about wildlife / wetland habitat loss
- Supply chain for biomass system (supply chain workshop)
- Need for Heritage Resource Assessment

## April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2017 – Community Dinner

Annually, the Village of Teslin (VoT) and Teslin Tlingit Council (TTC) host a community dinner to share the progress on the Community Development Plan and discuss prioritization of future projects. Approximately 160 community members attended the dinner to partake in the ongoing community engagement to ensure success in the implementation of the Plan. Stantec aided by facilitating a project ranking exercise (“dotmocracy”) where community members were asked to prioritize and provide comments on the current 10-Year Capital Plan (2017-2027).

The top 10 priority projects for all VoT, TTC and Joint projects were as follows:

1. New School (includes pool) (TTC)
2. Trail development (VoT)
3. Breakwater at marine / secure dock (VoT)
4. Recreation building upgrades (VoT)
5. Citizen housing (TTC)
6. Street lights from bridge to fox point subdivision (Joint)
7. Nisutlin Bay Bridge upgrades (Joint)
8. Recreation equipment (VoT)
9. Trail development (Joint)
10. Community garden & year round greenhouse (Joint; VoT)

There was a blank section where community members could provide additional feedback and suggest new project. The additional projects included:

- Waterfront walkway from Nisutlin Bay Bridge to Heritage Center





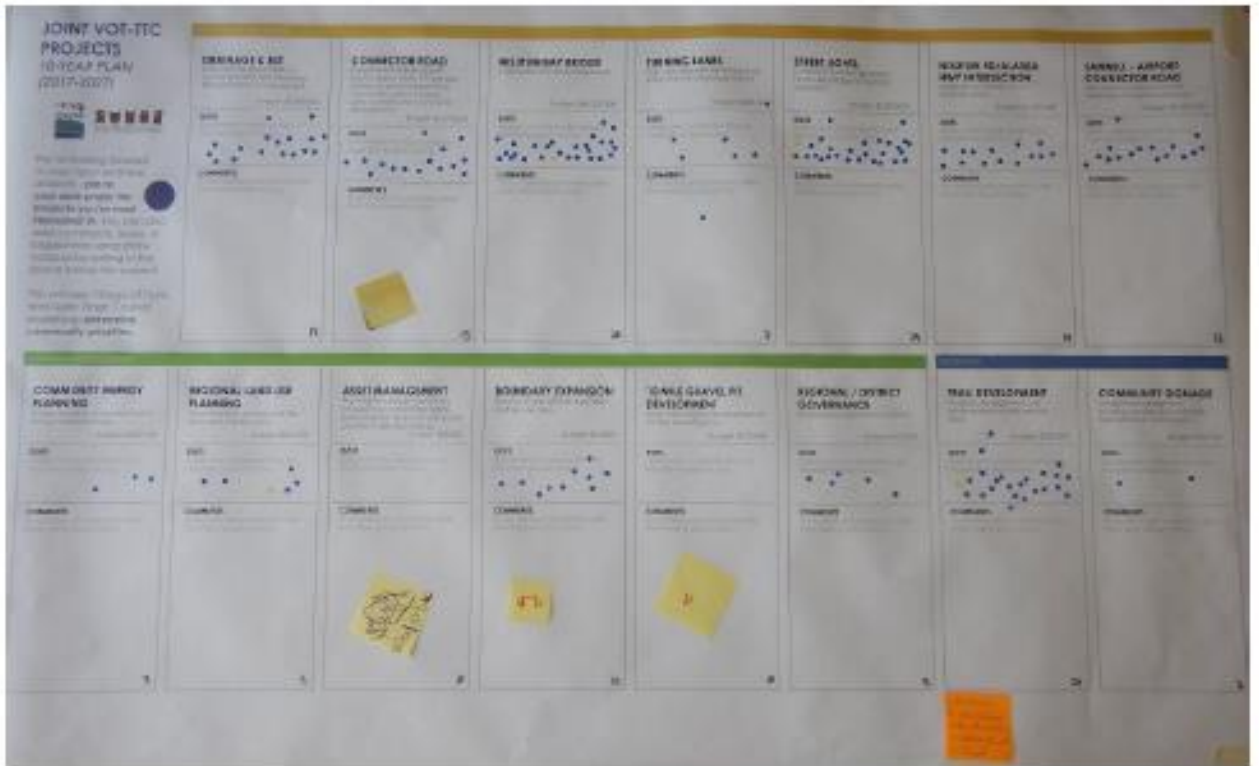
- Showcase Tlingit people and culture with a camp filled with people dressed in traditional regalia
- Develop remote trail to Juneau and Atlin
- Johnston Town Tlingit National Heritage Park and Campground
- Tlingit Arts and Beautification, totem poles, etc (like Carcross)
- Develop remote campsite around Teslin Lake, Quiet Lake, Wolf Lake,
- Speed bumps
- Future graveyard
- Use restored heritage trail, heritage houses for commercial outlets, coffee shops
- Public drinking establishment

## Frozen Blueberry Lemonade

### Ingredients

- 1 ½ cups blueberries
- 1 cup lemonade
- ½ cup fresh mint leaves, plus more for serving
- ¼ cup confectioners' sugar
- 3 cups ice

### Directions

1. In a blender, puree the blueberries, lemon, mint, confectioners' sugar and ice until smooth.
2. Garnish with mint sprigs

## Honeydew, Cucumber and Mint Coolers

### Ingredients

- 1 honeydew melon (about 4 ponds), peeled and chopped
- 1 English cucumber , ½ chopped and ½ thinly sliced
- 1 cup fresh mint leaves
- ½ cup fresh lime juice (from about 8 lime), plus 1 lime thinly sliced for serving
- Splash of gin (optional)

### Directions

1. Puree the melon, chopped cucumber, and mint in a blender until smooth. Strain into a fine-mesh sieve into a large pitcher.
2. Add the lime juice and sliced cucumber. Chill for 30 minutes or up to 12 hours,. Stir well before serving . Served over ice, garnished with lime slices .
3. Add a splash of gin, if desired.

## Ginger Peach Cooler

### Ingredients

- 3 cups ginger ale
- ½ cup peach nectar
- 2 ripe peaches, thinly sliced
- 1 tablespoon grated fresh ginger

### Directions

1. In a pitcher, combine the ginger ale, nectar, peaches, and ginger .
2. Serve over ice.

## Jalapeño-Lime Spritzer

### Ingredients

- 3 cups club soda
- ¼ cup fresh lime juice
- ¼ cup agave nectar
- 1 lime thinly sliced
- 1 jalapeño pepper, thinly sliced (seeded if desired)

### Directions

1. In a pitcher combine soda, lime juice, nectar, lime, and jalapeño .
2. Serve over ice.

## Pineapple, lime and Coconut Spritzer

### Ingredients

- 3 cups pineapple juice
- 2 cups coconut water
- ½ cup fresh lime juice (from about 8 limes)
- 2 cups club soda or sparkling water
- ½ cup pineapple, cored and cut into spears
- Splash of rum (optional).

### Directions

1. Combine the pineapple juice, coconut water, and lime in a large pitcher. Chill for 30 minutes or up to 12 hours.
2. Just before serving, add club soda. Serve over ice, garnished with pineapple spear. Add a splash of rum if desired.

## Strawberry-Thyme Lemonade



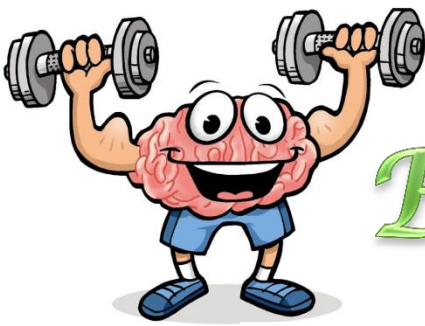

### Ingredients

- 1 cup sugar
- 8 sprigs fresh thyme, plus more for serving
- 1 quart strawberries, hulled and sliced (about 2 ½ cups)
- 1 ½ cups fresh lemon juice (from about 10 lemons)
- 5 cups cold water
- Splash of vodka (optional)

### Directions

1. Combine the sugar, thyme, and 1 cup water in a small pot. Bring to boil and cook, stirring occasionally, until the sugar is dissolved. Let cool and discard thyme.
2. Combine the thyme syrup with strawberries, lemon juice and water in a large pitcher. Chill for 30 minutes or up to 12 hours. Serve over ice, garnished with additional thyme. Add a splash of vodka, if desired.



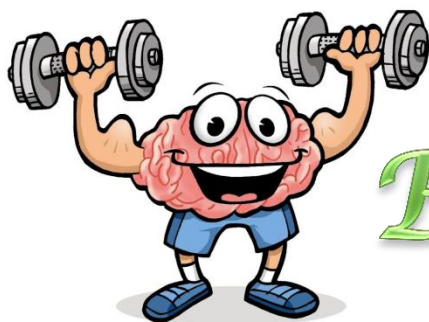

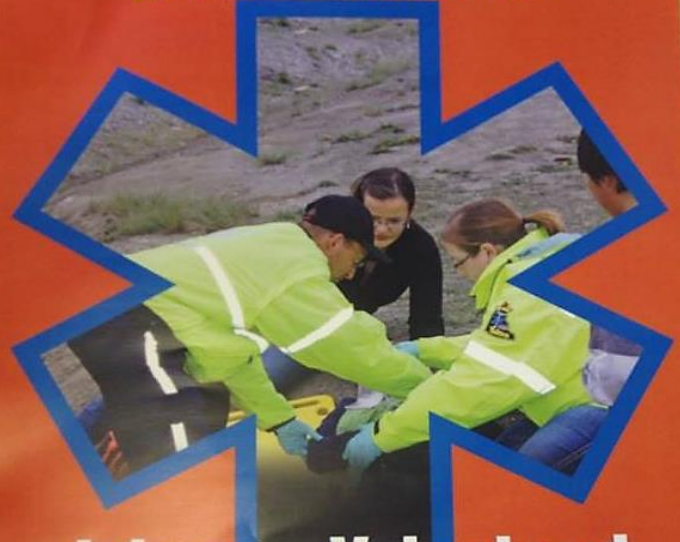
