September 2017: Prostate Cancer Awareness Month in Teslin


Last August 22, 2017, Regular Council meeting under the resolution #77-14-17,

WHEREAS, prostate cancer is the most common cancer to affect Canadian men; and WHEREAS, 1 in 7 Canadian men will be diagnosed with the disease in his lifetime; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 21,300 Canadian men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer this year; and WHEREAS, the survival rate for prostate cancer can be over 90% when detected early; and

WHEREAS, those with a family history of the disease, or those of African or Caribbean descent, are at a greater risk of developing prostate cancer; and WHEREAS, Prostate Cancer Canada recommends that men get a PSA test in their 40s to establish their baseline;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that, Village Council do hereby proclaim September 2017 as Prostate Cancer Awareness Month in Teslin.

TESLIN ROADS

All roads are in summer driving condition we have done some patching and will continue as needed throughout the summer. The Road (BST) project has started and is on schedule to be complete next month. The Alaska Highway shoulder mowing contract has been awarded to Sonrise Contracting the work has started will be completed by the end of the month.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY (LANDFILL)

To comply with our new waste management permit, we have done some upgrades to our transfer station these upgrades also make it more user-friendly. The new bylaw has been passed by Council and the new fees were in effect January 2017. The landfill fees and fines are listed in the Teslin Post, available at the Village office, posted at the landfill and on our website. If you would like to review the bylaw please stop by or call the Village Office.

Over the next few months we will be implementing the new bin system at the landfill; construction waste, metal, and appliance areas of the landfill will be closed to the public and the public will drop these waste streams into designated bins that are setup near the household waste bin. Arrangements can be made with the Village office for commercial vehicles to continue have access to the designated areas.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home and at work to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful on what is being flushed down the system. Cleaning and inspecting of the sewer lines has begun and will be complete this fall.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The new Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition and we are planning some regular maintenance for the summer months. The annual water report is due at the end of March we are compiling information and will have the report to the water board by the end of the month





Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

We have trained more staff on our water truck and delivery system so we have a few backup operators to help ensure our delivery system operates smoothly.

Please keep your driveway accessible for the water truck.

DOG CONTROL

We have received some complaints and concerns about dogs running at large. Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take these reports very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

The Yukon Government has announced a new community dog spay program which began Aug. 1st, the project will provide \$ 250.00 per spay surgery of one female dog, per dog owner in rural communities. Teslin Tlingit Council and Village of Teslin have created a program to enhance the YG program by assisting residents with neutering male dogs. The joint Councils will provide up to \$ 250.00 to residents of Teslin for one male dog. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.


We have completed some minor renovations in our buildings to add some storage space. Painting in the arena hallways continues. The LED light replacement RFP closes at the end of the month.

Healthy Kids Snacks For School

Tortilla Pizzas



What you need:

- Small corn tortillas
- Salsa
- Shredded cheddar cheese

Mound a little salsa and cheese on each tortilla. Cook on foil-lined tray in toaster oven until cheese has melted and is brown at the edges. Kids can help: Assemble the "pizzas," cover the tray with foil.

Extras: A layer of refried beans under the salsa, cilantro for garnish, a dollop of sour cream or a sprinkle of finely chopped green pepper.

Zucchini Muffins



Into a large bowl mix:

- 2 cups all purpose flour
- 2 tsp. baking soda
- 2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/8 tsp. nutmeg
- 1/8 tsp. ginger
- 1/8 tsp. allspice
 - 1/2 tsp. salt

Stir in:

- 2 cups grated zucchini
- 1 apple peeled, cored and grated

In another bowl, beat:

- 3 eggs
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 1/2 cup unsweetened apple sauce
- 1/2 cup oil (vegetable or canola)

Stir into flour mixture until batter is just combined. Spoon into well greased muffin cups, filling to the top. (*Note: If you are using muffin liners you may need to spray with cooking spray to prevent the muffins from sticking to the paper.*) Bake at 350° for 20 minutes.

Chocolate Banana Crepes



What you need:

- Pat of butter
- One banana, thinly sliced
- Handful chocolate chips
- Two flour tortillas
- Powdered sugar for dusting (optional)

Melt butter in non-stick pan. Arrange banana slices over one tortilla and mash them in very lightly with a fork. Dot with chocolate chips and place second tortilla on top. Slide into frying pan and cook for a few minutes on each side, until brown and golden at the edges. Let cool for a minute or two, then slice into wedges and serve dusted with powdered sugar, if desired.

Pour 1/2 cup of juice in a bowl and sprinkle gelatin over it. While this sits, heat the remaining juice to boil (can do this in the microwave for 2 to 3 minutes). Pour hot juice over juice and gelatin mixture and stir, adding in extra sugar if desired. Pour mixture into the bottom of a loaf pan and chill for three hours, or until firm. Cut into squares.

Extras: Pour mixture into miniature or regular-sized muffin tins for different shapes.

Coconut Cashew Butter Bonbons



Ingredients

- 1 cup crisp rice cereal
- 1/2 cup cashew butter
- 2 tablespoons pure maple syrup
- 1/4 teaspoon fine sea salt or table salt
- 1/4 cup unsweetened shredded coconut

Mix together the cereal, cashew butter, maple syrup, and salt in a medium bowl. Form the mixture into 12 1½-inch balls. Roll the balls in the coconut. Refrigerator in an airtight container for up to 5 days.

Apple Snack Cake



Ingredients

- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted, plus more for pan
- 1 cup whole-wheat flour
- 3/4 cup granulated sugar
- 3/4 teaspoon baking powder
- 3/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 cup applesauce
- 1/2 cup buttermilk
- 1 large egg
- confectioners' sugar, for dusting

Heat oven to 350° F. Butter an 8-inch baking dish. Whisk together the flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, and cinnamon in a medium bowl; set aside. Add the applesauce, buttermilk, butter, and egg and mix to combine. Transfer to the prepared pan and bake until a toothpick inserted in the center comes clean, 20 to 30 minutes. Cool in the pan for 5 minutes, then turn out to cool completely. Dust with the confectioners' sugar.

Tree-Bark Pen Holder

MATERIALS

- Sturdy cylindrical container
- Tree bark
- Scissors
- Wax twine

STEPS

- 1. Choose a container that matches the height of the bark.
- 2. Wrap the piece of bark around the container. For a more finished look, trim the bottom of the bark with scissors to make an even line.
- 3. Secure bark by wrapping wax twine several times around the container. Knot and snip the ends of the twine.

MATERIALS

- Backpack Iron-on patches
- Handheld iron
- Pressing cloth

STEPS

- To prep handheld iron, turn on to the hottest setting (avoid using steam) and work on a table or other hard, heat-resistant surface (not an ironing board, which has too much padding).
- 2. Place patches where desired on backpack.
- 3. To apply each patch individually, layer pressing cloth between the patch and iron. Press down on patch for 30 seconds, covering with heat evenly.

Patch Keychains

MATERIALS

- Patches
- Leather
- Super-fast glue
- Split key ring with chain
- Scissors
- Paper clips

STEPS

- 1. Match your patches to complementary leather scraps. Apply a generous amount of glue to the back of your patch and adhere it to the right side of the leather, leaving excess fabric around the border of the patch including 2 inches at the top where you will attach a key ring and chain.
- 2. Trim excess leather using scissors. Leave a long strip from the aforementioned 2 inches of excess to attach the keychain ring.
- 3. Insert the key ring towards the opening and glue the end to the back of the leather.
- 4. Apply pressure to the glued area by using a paper clip. Let dry according to the glue instructions.

MATERIALS

- Martha Stewart Craft Paint
- spiral notebooks with cardboard fronts
- Foam Pouncer

STEPS

- 1. Base-coat two of the notebooks with Porcelain Doll and let dry. Base-coat third notebook with Wedding Cake and let dry.
- 2. Dot notebook: Using the large foam pouncers, add dots and alternate the colors in rows.
- Ombre notebook: Using Camellia Pink, paint a wide stripe in center of notebook. Before it dries, paint a large stripe of Pink Dahlia at the bottom. Blend the colors where they meet, adding a little paint to your brush as needed.
- 4. Free-form stripes: Alternate Pea Shoot, Camellia Pink, and Porcelain Doll, creating stripes


