

Roads are in winter driving condition.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY (LANDFILL)

The landfill fees and fines are listed in the Teslin Post, available at the Village office, posted at the landfill and on our website. If you would like to review the bylaw please stop by or call the Village Office.

The bin system is ready to go! Construction waste, metal, and appliance areas of the landfill will be closed to the public and the public will drop these waste streams into designated bins that are setup near the household waste bin. Arrangements can be made with the Village office for commercial vehicles to continue have access to the designated areas.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home and at work to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful on what is being flushed down the system. Cleaning and inspecting of the sewer lines has begun is complete and we are reviewing all inspection videos and will be planning scheduled maintenance repairs for next season.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

We have trained more staff on our water truck and delivery system so we have a few backup operators to help ensure our delivery system operates smoothly.

With the changing weather please keep your driveway accessible for the water truck.



DOG CONTROL

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.



Hours of operation

Thursday & Friday 12:00 PM – 5:30 PM Saturday 10:00 AM – 4:30 PM Sun-Wed CLOSED

The Teslin landfill only accepts these items on a regular basis.

Starting September 28, 2017, the Village of Teslin is implementing a new bin system at the Teslin transfer station. This system will help us meet our permit requirements by; keeping materials sorted, being able to track volumes of each waste stream, improve safety and predict upcoming costs.

Construction waste, metal, and appliance areas of the landfill will be closed to the public and the public will drop these waste streams into designated bins that are set up near the household waste bins. Arrangements can be made with the Village office for commercial vehicles to continue to have access to the designated areas.

- Household Garbage
- **Clean Metal** Metal products by themselves with **NO** other products attached, rubber, wood, plastic, etc.
- Cars-NO fluids and NO tires otherwise a handling fee will be charged
- Tires Tires on rims will be charged a sorting and handling fee of \$10.00
 - I. 19" rim and smaller tire (no charge)
 - II. 20" rim and larger tire (\$32.00)
- Electronic Waste Computers, radios, TV's or any other electronic device
- Compost All organic waste
- Construction Waste –Construction waste deemed as special waste will not be accepted
- **Burnables** Brush, Scrap lumber, yard trimmings, etc.
- Recycle Center All non-refundable recycling has to be sorted in bins at the recycling center. All refundable recyclables will be counted at the recycling center.

Any larger items or any products not listed above will have to be brought to the Village of Teslin's attention prior to being dropped off at the landfill. If you are unsure of any items call the Village of Teslin and we will tell you if we can accept them at the landfill.

Dumping fees are attached and posted at the landfill or can be found in the Teslin Post

Special Waste

Special waste will be accepted at the Village of Teslin's public works yard not at the landfill.



Things You Probably Didn't Know About Christmas

1 It wasn't always on December 25.



Though Christmas celebrates the birth of Jesus Christ, there is no mention of December 25 in the Bible. (Most historians believe he was actually born in the spring.) It wasn't chosen as the official holiday until the 3rd Century. Some argue that the date was picked because it coincided with the pagan festival of Saturnalia, celebrating agricultural god Saturn with partying and gift-giving.




2 Thank Prince Albert for your tree.

Another Christmas tradition stemming from Saturnalia was the Christmas tree: During the winter solstice, branches served as a reminder of spring — and became the root of our Christmas tree. The Germans are credited with first bringing evergreens into their homes and decorating them, a tradition which made it's way to the United States in the 1830s. But it wasn't until Germany's Prince Albert introduced the tree to the new wife, England's Queen Victoria, that the tradition took off. The couple were sketched in front of a Christmas tree in 1848 — and royal fever did its work.

3 St. Nick was more generous than jolly.

Sure, you probably knew that Santa Claus came from St. Nicholas, a Christian bishop living in the fourth century AD. St. abundant Nicholas gave away his inheritance to help the needy. He also was known for good deeds like rescuing sisters from prostitution. As his legend spread, he was eventually known by names like as Sinter Klaas in Dutch — which morphed Santa Claus. He's into not iust protector of children, either: the Nicholas is also the patron saint of unmarried women, prisoners, thieves and pawnbrokers. How's that for a naughty list?




4 Stockings have a funny root.

Gift-giving also came from Holland. There, St. Nicholas' feast day is celebrated December 6 by children leaving out shoes overnight and finding little gifts from St. Nicolas in the morning. According to legend, hanging stockings came from the take of a poor man who couldn't afford his three daughters dowries: St. Nick dropped a bag of gold down their chimney one night so that the eldest could wed — but it fell into a stocking that was drying by the fire!

5 Jingle Bells was originally a Thanksgiving song.



James Lord Pierpont, an organist from Savannah, Georgia, first performed a song he wrote, "The One Horse Open Sleigh," at his church's Thanksgiving concert. The song was republished in 1857 and given the title of today. Bonus fact: It's also the first song broadcast from space. On December 16, 1965, the *Gemini 6* crew serenaded Mission Control after they reported seeing a "red-suited" astronaut.



6 Merrymaking used to be illegal.

Though the first American batch of eggnog was created by the Jamestown settlers, by the time the Puritans settled Boston, Christmas was illegal. (The word *nog* comes from the word *grog*; that is, any drink made with rum.) From 1659 to 1681, celebrating the oncepagan day could cost you a fine of as much as five shillings. And after the Revolutionary War, the new Congress found the day so unimportant that they held the first session on Christmas Day, 1789. It wasn't proclaimed a Federal Holiday for nearly another century.

7 Favorite carols have complicated histories.

The original lyrics to "Hark! The Herald Angel Sings" were "Hark! How the Welkin ring!" Pretty catchy, right? (Welkin was an old English term for heaven.) And though "Silent Night" was rumored to be a Christmas miracle by Father Joseph Mohr of Oberndorf, Austria, whose organ was broken, the truth was less dramatic: A Catholic priest wrote the poem "Stille Nacht! Heilige Nacht!" in Mariapfarr, Austria. Two years later, he transferred to Mohr's St. Nicholas Church and asked Franz Gruber to put it to music, which they performed on Christmas Eve 1818.

And the holiday classic "Santa Claus Is Coming to Town" has a less jovial history. Songwriter James "Haven" Gillespie was asked to write a Christmas song. At the time, he was broke, jobless, and mourning his brother's recent death. Despite being overcome with grief, he found inspiration in the holiday memories he and his brother had shared.



8 Santa has his own zip code.



Every year, letters to Santa Claus flood post offices across the world. Some Canadian Post Office workers even started answering them — but as more letters arrived, they set up a special zip code for Santa as part of a "Santa Letter Writing Program" literacy initiative. The zip code? H0H 0H0.



There are auction receiving dates in mid April and early May, so if you wish to leave hides untanned, unsold furs can still be sent to auction. The Yukon Trapper's Association will be onsite, so buyers can sent furs for tanning right from the event.

Tanned pelts will likely sell better, particularly beaver. Crafters would be likely be interested in slightly or very damaged furs as well as prime furs, and buyers may love fur colours that get lower prices at the auction.

Crafters:

It is up to you to set your prices, you know the market the best. As this is a fur event, please bring only your goods made with fur on them. Please label the furs used on each item.
