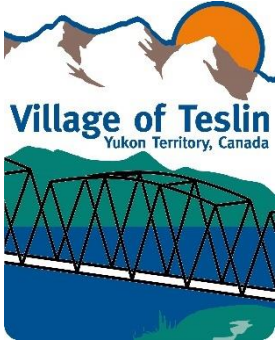

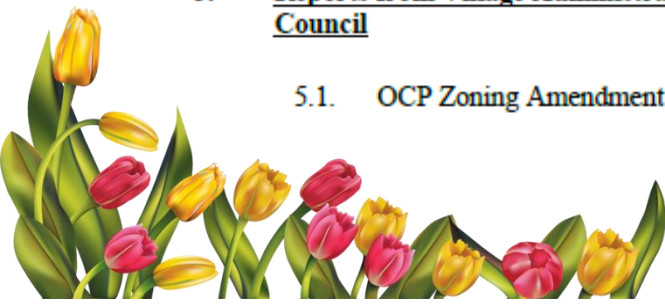

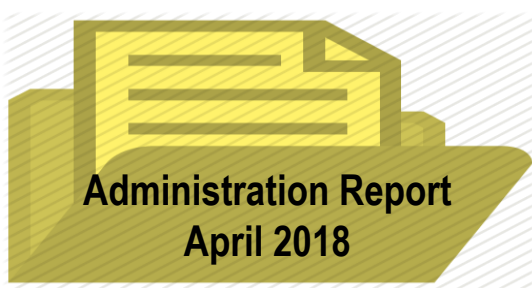

Spring has arrived and we are steaming culverts continuously, if you notice that we have missed a culvert in your area please let us know. When the weather cooperates we will be out sweeping the streets.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday – Closed to public

Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 9:00 am – 5:00 pm

Free Dump day will be Friday May 18th and Saturday May 19th.

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home and at work to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

Please ensure recycling bins are outside and easily accessible for pickup.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful on what is being flushed down the system.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

DOG CONTROL

Mother's Day Breakfast Ideas



Ingredients:

Cooking spray, for pan
2 cans crescent dough
3 tbsp. butter, divided
12 large eggs
1/4 c. milk
kosher salt
Freshly ground black pepper
1/4 c. finely chopped chives
1/2 lb. deli ham
12 slices cheddar
1 tsp. sesame seeds
1 tsp. poppy seeds
1 tsp. minced onion
1 tsp. dried garlic
Flaky sea salt

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 375° and grease a baking sheet with cooking spray. In a large bowl, whisk together eggs and half-and-half.
2. In a large nonstick pan over medium heat, melt 1 tbsp. butter. When butter is foamy, reduce heat to low and add egg mixture. Cook, stirring often with a spatula, until eggs are just set. Season with salt and pepper and remove from heat.
3. Unroll one can of crescents onto greased baking sheet and pinch seams together. Add a layer of ham then top with scrambled eggs, chives and cheese. Unroll second crescent dough and place on top of cheese. Pinch together crescent sheets to seal.
4. Melt remaining butter in microwave. Brush melted butter on top of crescent dough then sprinkle with poppy seeds, sesame seeds, minced onion, dried garlic, and flaky sea salt.
5. Let cool for at least 15 minutes before slicing into squares.
6. Bake until crescent dough is golden and cooked through, about 25 to 30 minutes. (If the crescent dough is browning too quickly, cover with foil.)

Mother's Day Breakfast Ideas



Ingredients:

12 Slider buns
6 slices bacon, cooked
1 c. white cheddar, shredded
12 eggs
2 tbsp. chives, chopped
kosher salt
Freshly cracked pepper

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350°F.
2. Place slider buns in a baking pan.. Using a paring knife, cut wells out of slider buns. Cut bacon slices in half crosswise, then lay a strip of bacon inside each bun, folding the bacon strip over the edges of the well. Sprinkle with cheddar then carefully crack an egg into each well. (Depending on the size of your slider buns, you may need to use less white.)
3. Season with salt, pepper and chives. Bake for 10-12 minutes, until the eggs are cooked through.

Mother's Day Breakfast Ideas



Ingredients

- 4 demi sourdough baguettes (I found them in the bakery section of the grocery store)
- 1 (7 ounce) package of Pork Sausage Links
- 8 eggs
- ½ cup heavy cream or fat free half & half
- 8 ounces pepper jack cheese, grated
- 3 green onions, thinly sliced
- salt and pepper, to taste

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350° F.
2. Cut and pull out the middle of all 4 sourdough baguettes, leaving ½ inch of bread in the bottom and on the sides. Set baguettes aside. Prepare sausage according to package directions. Cut links into bite-size pieces and set aside. In a medium bowl, lightly beat together the eggs and the cream. Whisk in remaining ingredients and sausage. Evenly divide and pour the mixture into each baguette boat. Place all 4 baguettes on a baking sheet and bake for 25-28 minutes or until set in the center. Allow boats to cool for 10 minutes, cut and serve.

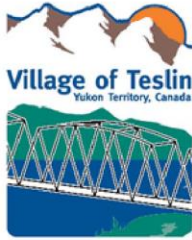

The Teslin landfill only accepts these items on a regular basis.

Starting September 28, 2017, the Village of Teslin is implementing a new bin system at the Teslin transfer station. This system will help us meet our permit requirements by; keeping materials sorted, being able to track volumes of each waste stream, improve safety and predict upcoming costs.

Construction waste, metal, and appliance areas of the landfill will be closed to the public and the public will drop these waste streams into designated bins that are set up near the household waste bins. Arrangements can be made with the Village office for commercial vehicles to continue to have access to the designated areas.

- **Household Garbage**
- **Clean Metal** – Metal products by themselves with **NO** other products attached, rubber, wood, plastic, etc.
- **Cars**– **NO** fluids and **NO** tires otherwise a handling fee will be charged
- **Tires** - Tires on rims will be charged a sorting and handling fee of \$10.00
 - I. 19" rim and smaller tire (no charge)
 - II. 20" rim and larger tire (\$32.00)
- **Electronic Waste** – Computers, radios, TV's or any other electronic device
- **Compost** – All organic waste
- **Construction Waste** –Construction waste deemed as special waste will not be accepted
- **Burnables** – Brush, Scrap lumber, yard trimmings, etc.
- **Recycle Center** - All non–refundable recycling has to be sorted in bins at the recycling center. All refundable recyclables will be counted at the recycling center.

Any larger items or any products not listed above will have to be brought to the Village of Teslin's attention prior to being dropped off at the landfill. If you are unsure of any items call the Village of Teslin and we will tell you if we can accept them at the landfill.

Dumping fees are attached and posted at the landfill or can be found in the Teslin Post

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)



Corrosive: Corrosive such as car battery acid and drain cleaners that will eat away at material and injure skin.



Flammable: Flammable such as lighter fluid, turpentine and gasoline that can ignite.



Explosive: Explosive such as aerosol containers that may explode if incinerated or stored above 50 degrees Celsius.



Poisonous: Poisonous such as cleaning fluids, pesticides and medicines that can be poisonous or lethal, even in small quantities, to adults, children and pets.

Types of Household Hazardous Waste

Automobile and Garage Products

- Antifreeze
- Car batteries
- Brake fluid
- Body filler
- Car wax with solvent
- Fuel (gasoline, diesel, kerosene)
- Motor oil (new and used)

Home Healthcare Waste

Home healthcare waste is garbage with the exception of syringes, medical sharps and medication. By disposing of home healthcare waste in the garbage, you will not contaminate the recycling program.

Although some of these items are plastic, they are not recyclable.

How to dispose of home healthcare waste:

1. Empty and rinse all tubes, filters and bags.
2. Put the waste inside two plastic bags (double-bagged).
3. Put in garbage.

Syringes and medical sharps should be placed in a sealed container labelled "Syringes"
Medication and vitamins do not go in the garbage or Green Bin. Proper disposal options are at a local pharmacy or HHW day. Empty pill bottles can be recycled.

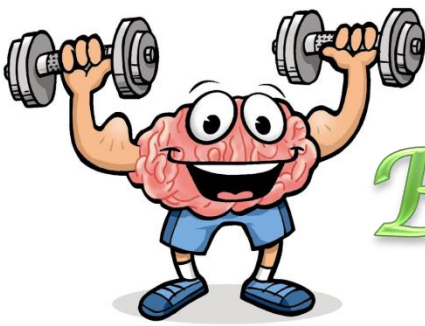

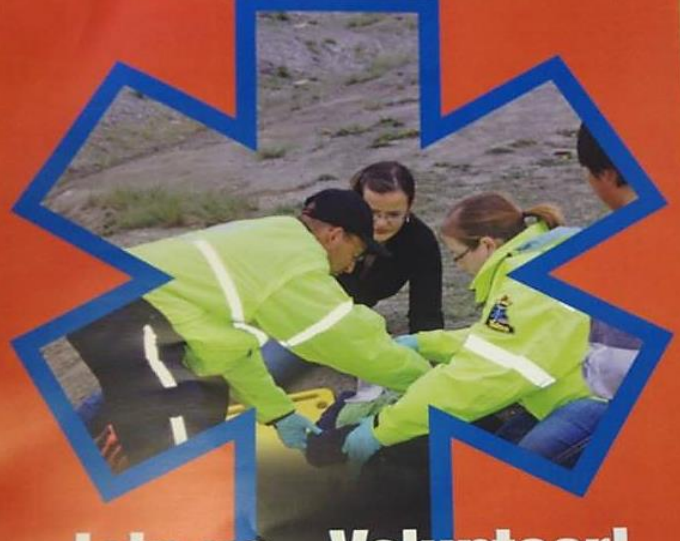
