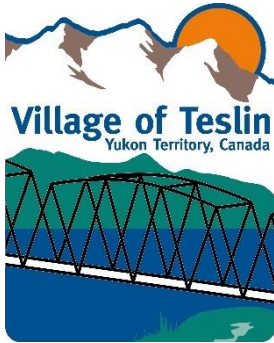

Winter has arrived, please drive accordingly. The roads are always slippery this time of year, please use extra caution. We try to sand as soon as possible but are not able to get to every area right away.

### **SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING**

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday – Closed to public

Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 9:00 am – 5:00 pm

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

The free store has been upgraded; please ensure all items dropped off are clean and in good shape.

Please ensure recycling bins are outside first thing Wednesday morning and easily accessible for pickup.

We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! 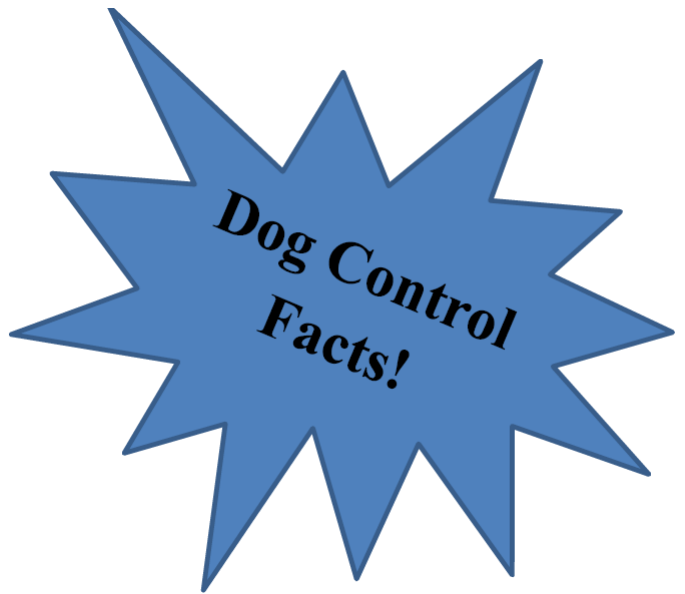

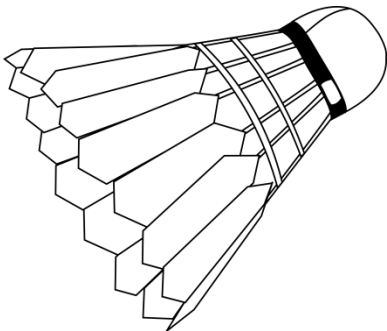

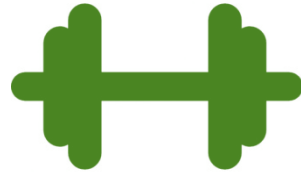

# Ways to Eat Your leftover Halloween Pumpkin

## Creamy pumpkin risotto with bacon and leeks



### Ingredients

1/4 c olive oil  
1 leek, finely chopped  
4 cloves of garlic, minced  
4 slices of bacon, chopped to 1/2-inch pieces  
1 c arborio rice  
4 c hot chicken broth  
1 c white wine, plus more for sipping while you stir  
1 c pumpkin puree  
black pepper and chili pepper, to taste

### Directions

- In a large pan, heat olive oil over medium heat. add leeks and cook until soft, about five minutes. Add garlic and cook for two more minutes. add bacon and cook until it starts to get crispy.
- Add rice and cook, stirring, for a few minutes until it is slightly toasted.
- Add one cup of broth and cook, stirring, until it is absorbed into the rice. Repeat this process with the remaining three cups of broth and the one cup of wine.
- Stir in pumpkin, black pepper, and chili pepper, and cook for a few more minutes.

# Ways to Eat Your leftover Halloween Pumpkin

## Sausage and pumpkin casserole



### *Ingredients*

- 8 vegetarian sausages, sliced
- 1 can of cannellini beans
- 1 can of chopped tomatoes
- 100ml passata
- 300ml vegetable stock
- 200g of cubed pumpkin
- 1 onion, thinly sliced
- 3 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 bunch of chard, chopped
- 2 rosemary sprigs, leaved taken off and finely chopped
- A pinch of sea salt and black pepper

### **Directions**

- Heat a little oil in an oven proof pan and add the onion, mushrooms, garlic, pumpkin and Quorn Gluten Free Sausages and cook gently for 4 minutes.
- Add the rest the ingredients and mix well and put in a preheated over at 190C for 25 minutes

# Ways to Eat Your leftover Halloween Pumpkin

## Baked pumpkin with mushroom & leek stuffing

### Ingredients

- 1 pumpkin, about 1.4-1.8kg (3-4 lb)
- 250ml (1 cup) rice
- 500ml (2 cups) vegetable stock (optional)
- 15g (½ oz ) butter
- 300g (10 oz) leeks, chopped
- 300g mushrooms, quartered
- 2.5ml (½ teaspoon) nutmeg
- 2.5ml (½ teaspoon) cinnamon
- salt and pepper to taste
- parsley, to garnish



### Directions:

- Preheat oven to 180°C/fan 160°C/gas 4. Halve pumpkin crosswise and scoop out seeds and strings. Place pumpkin halves in a large baking dish, shallow side down. Bake, uncovered, for 1-1½ hours, or until fork tender.
- Meanwhile, Boil the rice and stock (you can use water if you like) in a saucepan until cooked. Drain and set aside.
- Melt the butter in a large frying pan, add the leeks and fry gently for about 10 minutes until sweet and tender. Add the mushrooms, nutmeg and cinnamon and fry for another 5 minutes. Lower the heat, add the rice to the vegetable mixture and stir well to blend all the flavours.
- Quarter the two cooked pumpkin halves and divide the vegetable-rice mixture evenly between the pumpkin wedges. Garnish with parsley and serve immediately.

# Ways to Eat Your leftover Halloween Pumpkin

## Pumpkin Loaf



## Ingredients

- 1 tsp nutmeg, ground
- 1 tsp cinnamon, ground
- 1/2 tsp cloves, ground
- 1/4 tsp ginger, ground
- 4 eggs
- 1 1/2 tsp salt
- 250 ml sunflower oil
- 620 grams caster sugar
- 300 grams pumpkin purée
- 180 ml water
- 525 grams plain flour
- 2 tsp bicarbonate of soda

## Directions

- Preheat oven to 180 C and line 2 or 3 loaf tins (depending on size)
- Mix together spices, eggs, salt, oil and sugar together in a large bowl.
- Add pumpkin purée and water and combine thoroughly.
- Sift together plain flour and bicarbonate of soda.
- Add flour to the wet mixture and stir until combined.
- Spoon into your prepared loaf tins and bake for 60-75 minutes, until a skewer inserted in the centre comes out clean and the top is lovely and golden.
- Transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.



# Ways to Eat Your leftover Halloween Pumpkin

## Curried pumpkin and parsnip soup



### INGREDIENTS

- 1 Tbs vegetable oil
- 2 small onions
- 2 cloves garlic
- 1 Tbs mild curry powder
- 1 culinary pumpkin around 750g/26.45oz
- 500 g (1 lb) parsnips
- 2 vegetable stock cubes

### Directions

- Prepare the vegetables – roughly chop the onions, finely chop the garlic, peel, deseed and chop the pumpkin into bite sized pieces, peel and roughly chop the parsnips.
- Fill your kettle and put on to boil then heat the oil in a large saucepan or stock pot.
- Gently fry the onion and garlic in the oil until starting to soften.
- Add the curry powder and fry for 1 minute until fragrant.
- Add the pumpkin and parsnip, and stir to coat in the curry powder.
- Crumble over the two stock cubes, then pour over boiling water until it just covers the vegetables.
- Bring the pan to the boil, then cook for 15-20 minutes until the vegetables are cooked through.
- Leave to cool for 5 minutes, then season to taste and whizz up until smooth with a stick blender.
- If the soup is too thick, add a little boiling water and whizz again with the blender until at the desired consistency.
- Serve warm with a drizzle of natural yogurt, sprinkle of pumpkin seeds, some chopped coriander and crusty bread on the side.

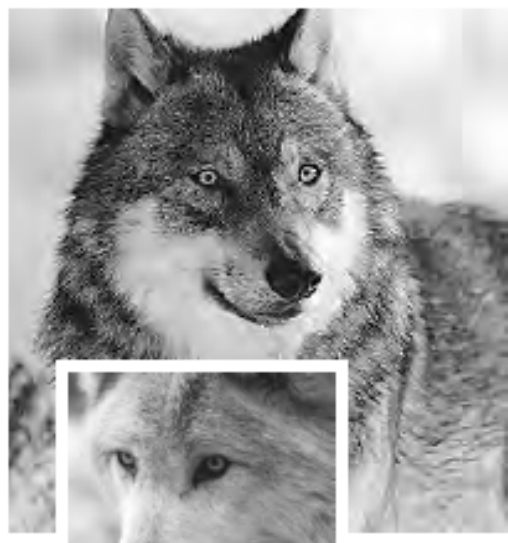

# Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door



Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

## What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.

- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time.
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children. Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.

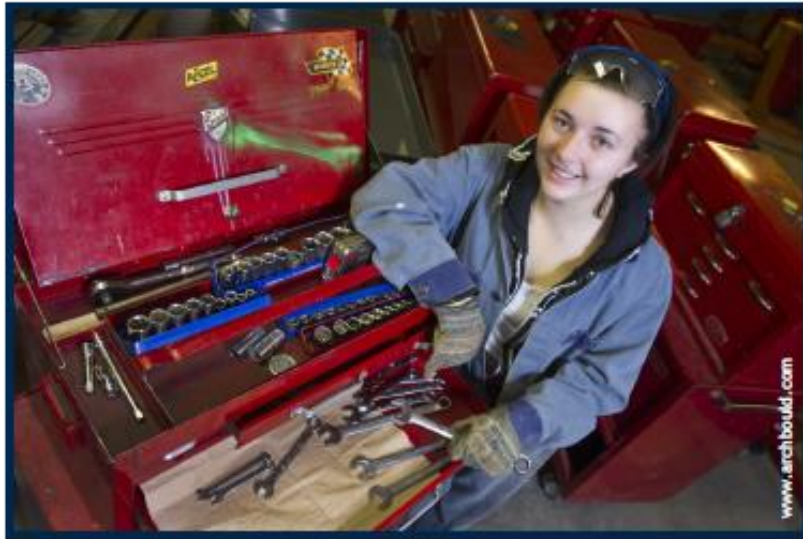

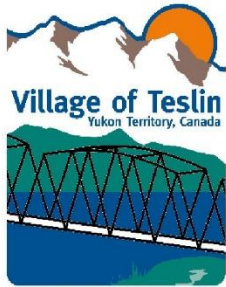

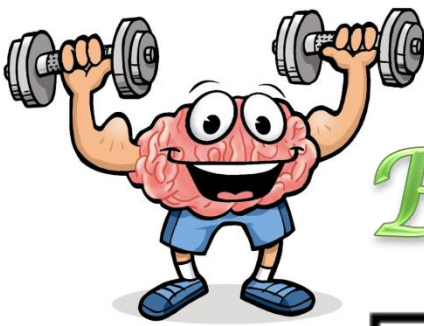
