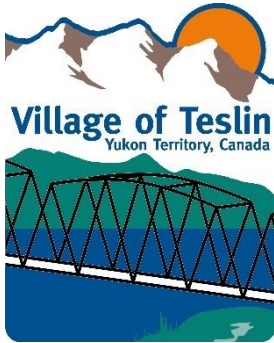





TESLIN ROADS

Winter has arrived, please drive accordingly. The roads are always slippery this time of year, please use extra caution. We try to sand as soon as possible but are not able to get to every area of town right away.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday – Closed to public

Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 9:00 am – 5:00 pm

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

The free store has been upgraded; please ensure all items dropped off are clean and in good shape. It is not maintained by VOT staff, so please clean up after yourself. All items left out will be discarded.

Please ensure recycling bins are outside first thing Wednesday morning and easily accessible for pickup.

Electronic waste is now on the designated material list so it is free of charge to dispose of.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition.

Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

DOG CONTROL

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We have seen an increase in complaints about loose dogs wandering in Fox Point so we have increased out patrols in that area. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements

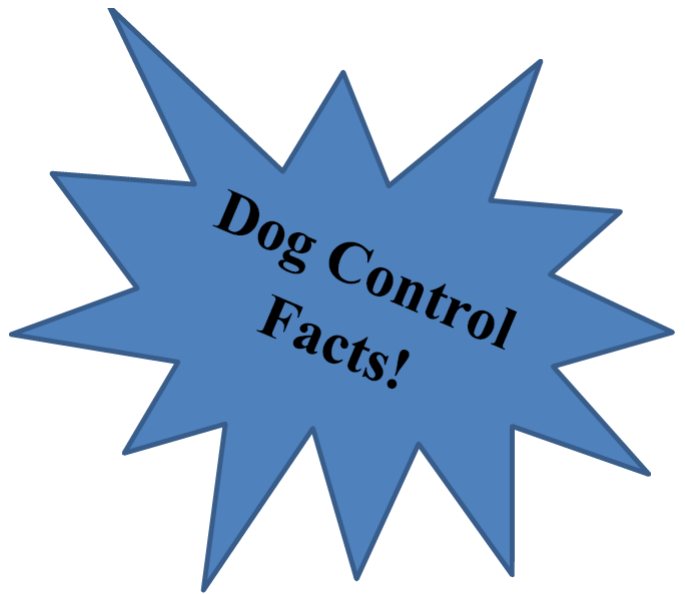

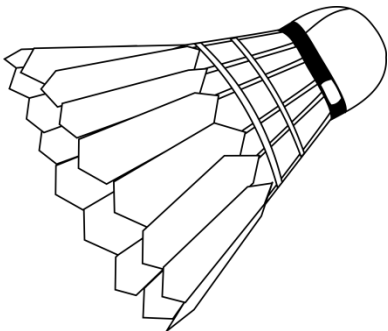

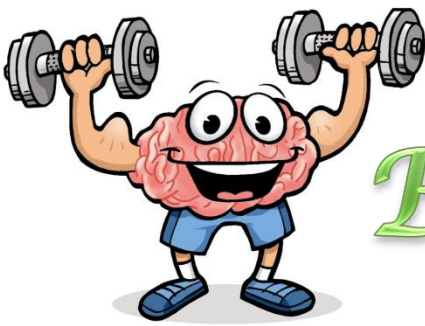

Recognize, Reject and Report it!

If you receive a suspicious phone call or e-mail from someone claiming to be from the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) – question it! Canadians lose millions of dollars each year through various CRA scams.

RECOGNIZE IT!

What are common CRA scams?

CRA scams come in many forms - over the phone, by e-mail, or by text message. In all cases, the caller or sender poses as an agent from the Canada Revenue Agency in an attempt to gather personal information, or intimidate a victim into providing financial payment.



Phone Scam

Phone scammers posing as CRA agents will claim one of several possibilities:

- that you owe money to the CRA and will be arrested if you do not pay immediately;
- that a lawsuit has been filed against you by the CRA;
- that a warrant of arrest has already been issued under your name;
- that you will be deported if you do not pay the money demanded; or
- other similar threats to get you to share your personal tax information and/or pay money.



E-Mail Scam / Text Message

An e-mail or text message is sent from someone pretending to be with the CRA, claiming:

- that your tax calculation has been completed, and you will receive a tax refund by going through a link and submitting information;
- that you or your company is being accused of participating in tax evasion schemes;
- that several discrepancies have been found with your filed taxes which need to be revised;
- that you've received an e-transfer from the CRA for what appears to be a tax refund; or
- that an "investigation" has been started on your CRA claim.

"The reason behind this call is to notify you that we have registered a criminal case against your name concerning a tax evasion and tax fraud in the federal court house ... If we don't receive a call from your side, please be prepared to face the legal consequences."

REJECT IT!**How can I protect myself or my loved ones?**

- Hang up immediately if there's anything suspicious or unprofessional about the call – the CRA will **NEVER** threaten you with immediate arrest, use abusive language or send police.
- The CRA will **NEVER** request a payment by Interac e-transfer, online currency such as bitcoin, pre-paid credit cards or pre-paid gift cards such as iTunes, Home Depot, etc.
 - The CRA's accepted methods of payment are online banking, debit card, credit card or PayPal through a third-party service provider and pre-authorized debit.
- Do not click on any link in an e-mail pretending to be from the CRA – the CRA will **NEVER** ask you to click on any link to get a refund or to collect personal or financial information.
 - The only time the CRA will send an e-mail that contains links is if a taxpayer calls the CRA to ask for a form or a link to specific information. A CRA agent will send the information to the taxpayer's email during the telephone call – this is the **ONLY** exception to the above rule!
- The CRA **NEVER** sends out text messages. Any text message from the CRA is a scam.
- Young people are often the most at risk to this scam, particularly when filing their taxes for the first time. Make sure your family and friends are educated on what the CRA will and will not ask for during tax season.

REPORT IT!**How should I respond?**

- If you are not sure if a message is from the CRA, confirm your tax status with the CRA online through a CRA secure portals such as [My Account](#) or by calling 1-800-959-8281.
- File a report with the Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre (CAFC) toll-free at 1-888-495-8501 or online www.antifraudcentre.ca, whether you paid money or not.
- Report the scam to your local police if you paid money (this includes purchasing pre-paid credit cards, gift cards, or online currency such as Bitcoin).
- If you sent money or shared financial information, report it to the financial institution used e.g. your bank, Western Union, MoneyGram.
- If your social insurance number has also been stolen, contact Service Canada at 1-800-206-7218.

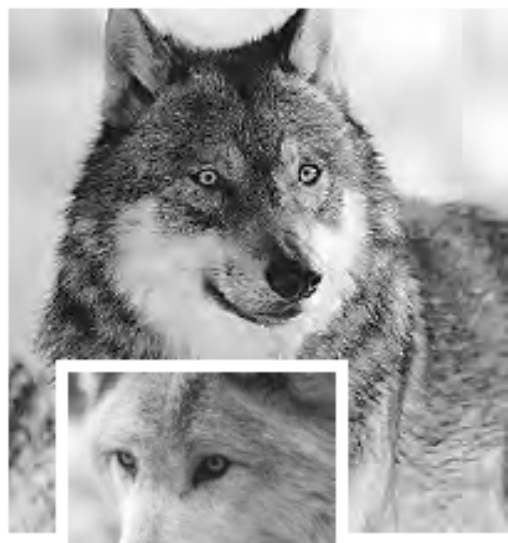
**We strongly suggest that you **REPORT THE INCIDENT** for the following reasons:**

- If you've sent money or transferred money or goods to a scammer, the police and financial institutions need to be aware in order to properly investigate, recover stolen funds and/or goods (if possible) and work towards preventing further criminal activity
- Reporting scams helps fraud authorities to warn other people about current scams, monitor trends and disrupt scams where possible

Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door



Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.

- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time.
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children. Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.

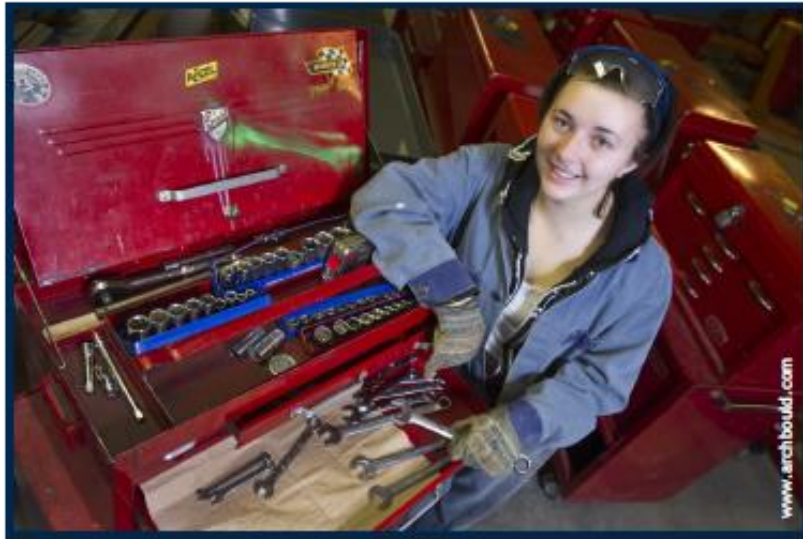

Applications are reviewed by a locally based committee and funding decisions are based on eligibility, merit and ability to meet fund criteria.



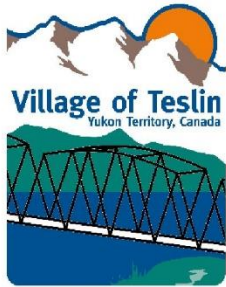
