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



All roads are in Spring driving conditions. We will continue with sweeping them over the next few weeks to keep the dust down.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday - Closed to public Thursday and Friday - Noon to 6:00pm Saturday - 9:00 am - 5:00 pm



There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

The free store has been upgraded; please ensure all items dropped off are clean and in good shape. It is not maintained by VOT staff, so please clean up after yourself. All items left out will be discarded.

Please ensure recycling bins are outside first thing Wednesday morning and easily accessible for pickup.

Electronic waste is now on the designated material list so it is free of charge to dispose of.

New signage has been installed at the recycling facility.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

In the coming months we will be flushing the sewer system, we will have equipment parked on the roadway so please use caution when passing.

Our water licence is due in 2020 so work will begin on gathering information to apply for a new licence.







4 ounces cream cheese softened to room temperature
4 ounces crab meat finely chopped
5 cloves garlic minced
1 teaspoon dried oregano
1/2 teaspoon paprika
1/2 teaspoon black pepper
1/4 teaspoon salt

Crab Stuffed Mushrooms With Cream Cheese

Ingredients

•20 ounces cremini (baby bella) mushrooms (20-25 individual mushrooms)
•2 tablespoons finely grated parmesan cheese
•1 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley

•salt

Instructions

 Preheat the oven to 400 F. Prepare a baking sheet lined with *parchment paper*.
 Snap stems from mushrooms, discarding the stems and placing the mushroom caps on the baking sheet 1 inch apart from each other. Season the mushroom caps with salt.

3.In a large mixing bowl, combine all filling ingredients and stir until well-mixed without any lumps of cream cheese. Stuff the mushroom caps with the mixture. Evenly sprinkle parmesan cheese on top of the stuffed mushrooms.

4.Bake at 400 F until the mushrooms are very tender and the stuffing is nicely browned on top, about 30 minutes. Top with parsley and serve while hot.

Keto Chicken Enchilada Bowl

Ingredients •2 tablespoons coconut oil (for searing chicken) •1 pound of boneless, skinless chicken thighs •3/4 cup red enchilada sauce •1/4 cup water •1/4 cup chopped onion •1– 4 oz can diced green chiles

Toppings (feel free to customize) •1 whole avocado, diced •1 cup shredded cheese (I used mild cheddar) •1/4 cup chopped pickled jalapenos •1/2 cup sour cream •1 roma tomato, chopped

Instructions

- In a pot or dutch oven over medium heat melt the coconut oil. Once hot, sear chicken thighs until lightly brown.
- Pour in enchilada sauce and water then add onion and green chiles. Reduce heat to a simmer and cover. Cook chicken for 17–25 minutes or until chicken is tender and fully cooked through to at least 165 degrees internal temperature.
- Careully remove the chicken and place onto a work surface. Chop or shred chicken (your preference) then add it back into the pot. Let the chicken simmer uncovered for an additional 10 minutes to absorb flavor and allow the sauce to reduce a little.
- To Serve, top with avocado, cheese, jalapeno, sour cream, tomato, and any other desired toppings. Feel free to customize these to your preference. Serve alone or over cauliflower rice if desired just be sure to update your personal nutrition info as needed.

Spinach Artichoke Stuffed Chicken Breast

- Ingredients • 1 ½ lbs. <u>chicken breasts</u> 6 4-oz. portions • 2 tablespoons <u>olive oil</u> • 4 ounces cream cheese softened • ¼ cup Greek yogurt
- ¹/₂ cup Mozzarella cheese shredded
- ½ cup <u>artichoke hearts</u> thinly sliced

•¼ cup frozen spinach drained, and tightly packed

- ½ tsp. <u>salt</u> divided
- •¼ tsp. <u>pepper</u> divided

• Instructions

- Pound chicken breast to 1-inch thick. Using a sharp knife cut each chicken breast down the middle, being careful not to cut all of the way through, to make a pocket for the spinach artichoke filling. Sprinkle chicken breasts with ¼ teaspoon salt and 1/8 teaspoon pepper.
- In a medium-sized bowl combine the cream cheese, Greek yogurt, Mozzarella cheese, artichoke hearts, drained spinach, ¼ teaspoon salt and 1/8 teaspoon pepper. Mix until thoroughly combined.
- Carefully fill each chicken breast with equal amounts of the spinach artichoke filling. If you have extra filling, set it aside until the chicken is almost done cooking.
- In a large skillet over medium heat add olive oil and stuffed chicken breasts. Cover skillet and cook for 7-8 minutes on each side, or until chicken reaches 165 degrees with a meat thermometer.
- During the last few minutes of cooking, add additional filling to the skillet to heat it up. Serve chicken with cauliflower rice, regular rice, mashed cauliflower, or mashed potatoes and enjoy!

Keto Chocolate Muffins

- •1 cup natural creamy almond butter
- •2/3 cup confectioners erythritoll
- •2 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa powder
- •2 tablespoons peanut butter powder
- •2 large eggs
- 1 tablespoon melted salted butter, or coconut oil for dairy free
- •2 tablespoons water
- 1 1/2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 cup sugar free dark chocolate baking

Instructions

1.Preheat oven to 350°F. Place a <u>silicone mini muffin pan</u> on top of a <u>rimmed baking sheet</u>.

2.In a large mixing bowl, combine the almond butter, <u>erythritol</u>, cocoa powder, peanut butter powder, eggs, butter, water, vanilla extract, and baking soda. Using an elecrtric hand mixer, mix until all ingredients are well combined. It should be a fairly thick dough. Fold in the <u>chocolate</u> chips.

3.Divide the mixture evenly among 18 wells of the mini muffin pan – or 12 regular sized muffins.

4.Bake for 11 minutes. Remove the baking sheet from the oven and place on a cooling rack to allow the muffins to cool before eating.

What does that mean in plain words? The Official Community Plan reflects what the people want to see in the community's future. It provides "marching orders" to the Village Council for the next 10 years.

Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door


Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.



- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time.
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children. Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.

Chainsaw Safety, Operation, & Maintenance Course

This introductory course provides students with the ability to demonstrate safe chainsaw use for bucking and limbing trees in the Yukon. Course work will also cover basic chainsaw maintenance, repair, equipment, and awareness of falling techniques, safety, and styles.

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Describe and identify safety equipment and wear appropriate for working with chainsaws
- List forest hazards such as snags, overhead branches, leaners and dead tops
- Describe a typical field emergency / evacuation plan
- Have an awareness of falling hazards and describe and demonstrate a safe work area for self and in relation to others
- Demonstrate proper liming and bucking techniques
 - Describe aspects of the theory of falling trees under 30cm DBH

Traffic Control Person (Yukon)

This two-day course provides participants with qualifications allowing them to become traffic control person (flagger) in the Yukon.

Field sessions give participants a change to practice basic traffic control skills and demonstrate competence. Field Sessions include setting up, controlling, and removing work zones in the following:



- Two-lane, two-way roadway with speed limit of 50km/h.
- An intersection.
- A work zone that uses only one (1) TCP.

Students will need to bring approved safety footwear with toe and ankle support, and all weather clothing for outdoor practical sessions. There is a written exam and practical skill evaluation exercise. Participants MUST receive 80% on the written exam and demonstrate 100% competency in order to pass this course.

Certificate is valid for three (3) years.




