

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

The free store has been upgraded; please ensure all items dropped off are clean and in good shape. It is not maintained by VOT staff, so please clean up after yourself. All items left out will be discarded.

Please ensure recycling bins are outside first thing Wednesday morning and easily accessible for pickup.

Electronic waste is now on the designated material list so it is free of charge to dispose of.

New signage has been installed at the recycling facility.

Free dump weekend is scheduled for May 16th, 17th, and 18th.



Mother's Day Breakfast Fdeas



Ingredients:

12 Slider buns
6 slices bacon, cooked
1 c. white cheddar, shredded
12 eggs
2 tbsp. chives, chopped
kosher salt
Freshly cracked pepper

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F.
- 2. Place slider buns in a baking pan.. Using a paring knife, cut wells out of slider buns. Cut bacon slices in half crosswise, then lay a strip of bacon inside each bun, folding the bacon strip over the edges of the well. Sprinkle with cheddar then carefully crack an egg into each well. (Depending on the size of your slider buns, you may need to use less white.)
- 3. Season with salt, pepper and chives. Bake for 10-12 minutes, until the eggs are cooked through.

- □ 1 Ball pizza dough
- 8 oz thinly sliced deli ham

- □Arrange ham slices evenly over dough to within ½ inch od edges.

 Starting at one of the shorts end, roll up the dough to form a log. Pinch seam together to seal. Place seam side down, on a greased baking sheet.
- □Bake for 50 minutes, or until deep golden brown. Let sit for 10 minutes before cutting into 8 slices with a serrated knife.

Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door


Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.



- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children.
 Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.



This introductory course provides students with the ability to demonstrate safe chainsaw use for bucking and limbing trees in the Yukon. Course work will also cover basic chainsaw maintenance, repair, equipment, and awareness of falling techniques, safety, and styles.

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Describe and identify safety equipment and wear appropriate for working with chainsaws
- List forest hazards such as snags, overhead branches, leaners and dead tops
- Describe a typical field emergency / evacuation plan
- Have an awareness of falling hazards and describe and demonstrate a safe work area for self and in relation to others
- Demonstrate proper liming and bucking sechniques
- Describe aspects of the theory of falling trees under 30cm DBH

Traffic Control Person (Yukon)

This two-day course provides participants with qualifications allowing them to become traffic control person (flagger) in the Yukon.

Field sessions give participants a change to practice basic traffic control skills and demonstrate competence. Field Sessions include setting up, controlling, and removing work zones in the following:



- Two-lane, two-way roadway with speed limit of 50km/h.
- An intersection.
- A work zone that uses only one (1) TCP.

There is a written exam and practical skill evaluation exercise. Participants MUST receive 80% on the written exam and demonstrate 100% competency in order to pass this course.
