SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday – Closed to public

Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

The free store has been upgraded; please ensure all items dropped off are clean and in good shape. It is not maintained by VOT staff, so please clean up after yourself. All items left out will be discarded.

Please ensure recycling bins are outside first thing Wednesday morning and easily accessible for pickup.

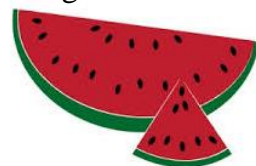
Electronic waste is now on the designated material list so it is free of charge to dispose of.

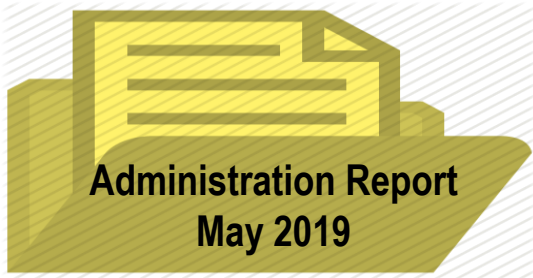
New signage has been installed at the recycling facility.

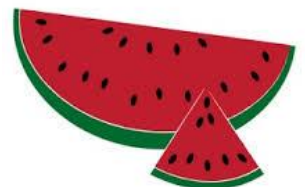
DOG CONTROL

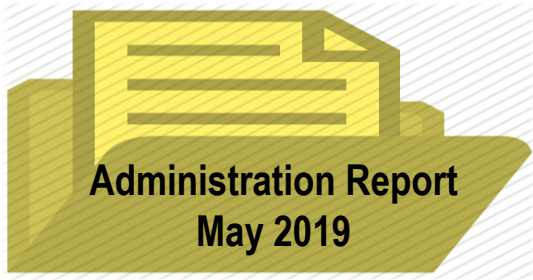

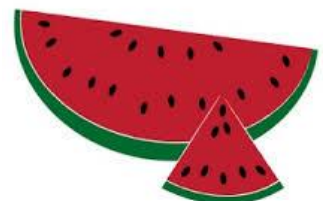

Message from the Mayor May 2019

Hello Tesliners,

I am planning on using this space to update you on council meetings and other items of significance that comes to our attention. I had intended to start this posting a few months ago, but things got very busy. So, here we go.

It was my pleasure to attend the 2019 Minister of Justice Safety Awards on May 29th to see the Teslin Detachment of the RCMP and Fire Chief James Smarch receive



awards for outstanding service to the community. The detachment, represented by Cpl, Jeff Myke, Cst. Travis Draper, and Cst. Jason Pradolini, won the award for Yukon Policing. James won the award for Lifetime Contribution to Community Safety. It is great to see these community members recognized for their outstanding contributions to safety in the community.

At the ceremony, I also had the opportunity to see Cst. Candace MacEachen, a former member of the Teslin detachment, win an award for youth mentorship. If you remember, Cst. MacEachen spent considerable time working with youth in our community, so it was a pleasure seeing her rewarded for her ongoing efforts. Furthermore, our new incoming member, Cst. Amy Handrahan, also won an award for her work in the Watson Lake community. So, the fine work by our local detachment should continue even with the departure of one of our members. On that topic, we would like to wish Cst. Draper and his family best wishes in their move and new posting. They will be missed and remembered for their involvement in our community.

Many thanks to everyone who came out to the Official Community Plan (OCP) consultations and the community dinner near the end of April. We also had an extremely high response rate for the surveys with many helpful comments. We would

like to thank everyone who took the time to fill it in. The survey report is available to the public on our website or at the office.

For those who do not know, the OCP is an important document adopted by the municipality that incorporates the vision of the community, and the objectives and policies that guide decisions on planning and land use management for the area covered by the plan. Basically, the OCP reflects what Teslin residents want to see in the community's future and provides "marching orders" to the Village Council for the next 10 years. This was the first set of consultations and we will be hosting an open house on June 4th from 5-8pm at the Recplex to provide community members with another opportunity to discuss results from the survey and first consultation and provide additional input. The Recreation Programmer will also be in attendance to hear any suggestions or idea for recreation programming for the next year. Once this round of consultations is complete, council will receive a report summarizing what was heard and a draft OCP. The draft OCP then goes out for further consultation with the community in the late fall, so you will have another chance to participate in the process. We are expecting this consultation-intensive process to take until the new year.

You may not know that VOT has a joint Emergency Measures Plan with TTC that is available on our website. Although the plan has been in place for many years, council recognizes that we have not had time to practice it. Therefore, we will be conducting a tabletop exercise over the summer to test it. We may also play a role in Operation Nanook, but we will have to wait for word from the Yukon Government on our role. We see two possible issues around wildfire – fire risk directly to our community and, secondly, fire in Whitehorse which causes an evacuation to outlying communities including Teslin.

On June 12th, Wildland Fire Management will also be hosting YG's annual BBQ in the community and an open house on fire management in the Teslin area. Worried about how Wildland will tackle fire threats in our area? Then come out and find out how they action threats. They will also be a talking about firesmartering your own property. We encourage you to come out to the event which will be at the Rec Plex. There will also be information from YG on the airport industrial lot development.

Finally, the Yukon Government conducts on-going consultations on a broad range of topics through the website engageyukon.ca. Current topics include Yukon University legislation, economic development funding program improvements,

Health and Wellness, Smoke-Places Act, Wellbeing in the Yukon, Motor Vehicles Act, Creative and Cultural Industries Strategy, and Yukon Wetlands. I encourage you to visit the website. If you do not have internet at home, feel free to use the college (although we are on summer hours and are closed from time to time).

Many thanks to all who contribute to making our community a great place to visit and live.

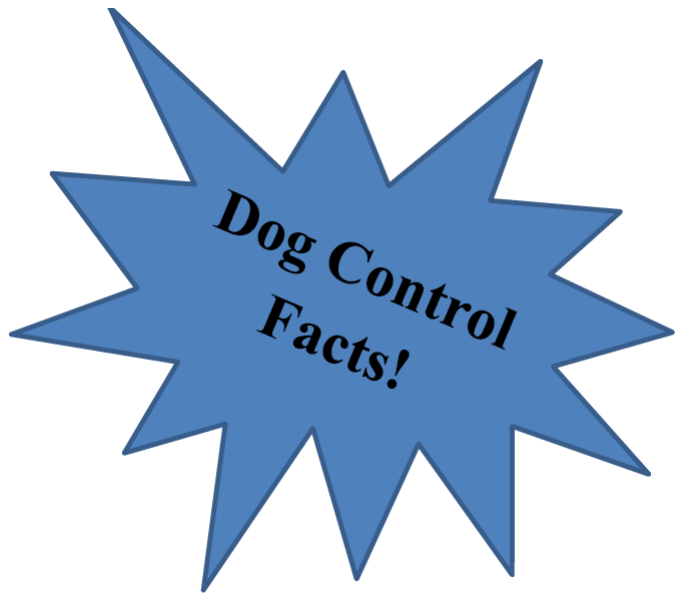

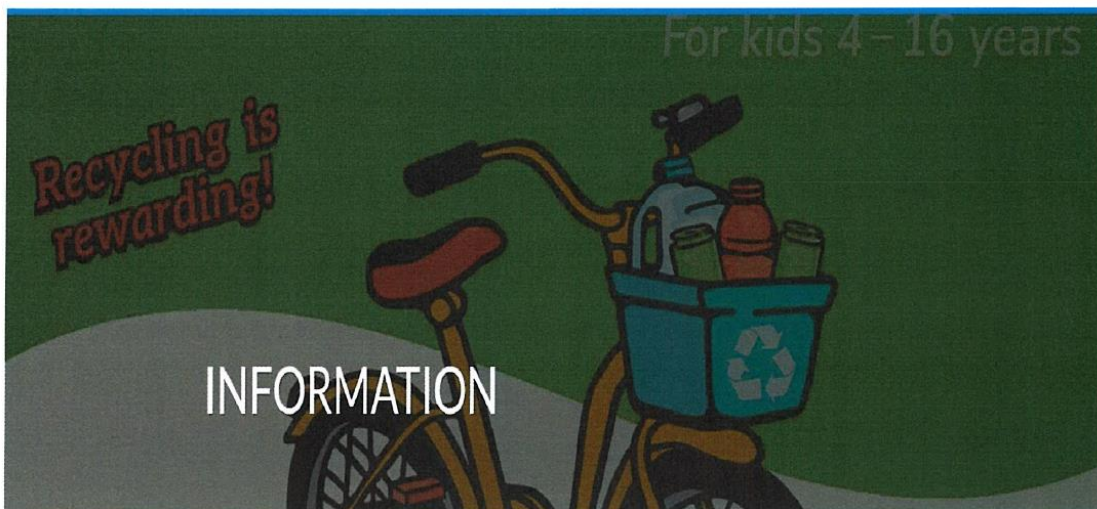

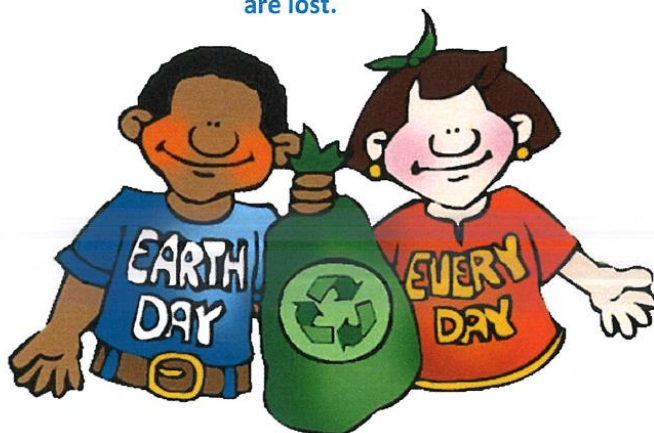


The administrator for the Yukon Recycling Club this year is Raven Recycling.

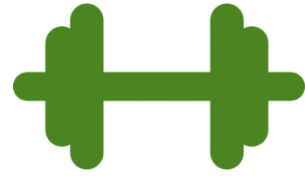

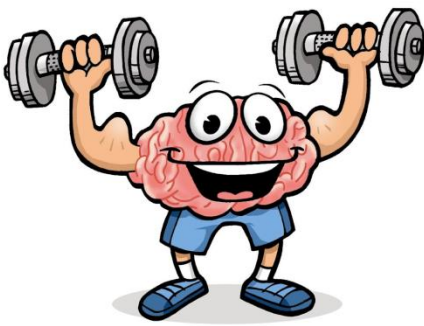

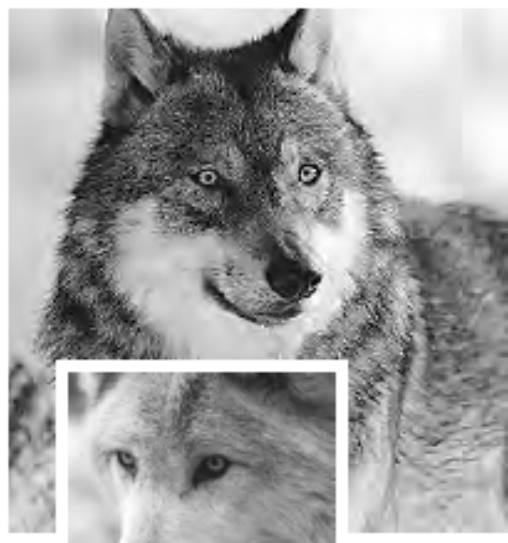

Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door



Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.

- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time.
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children. Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.

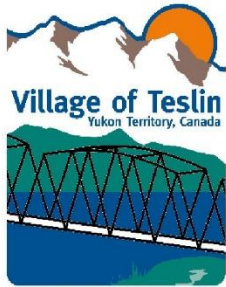
