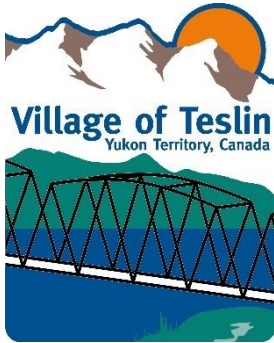

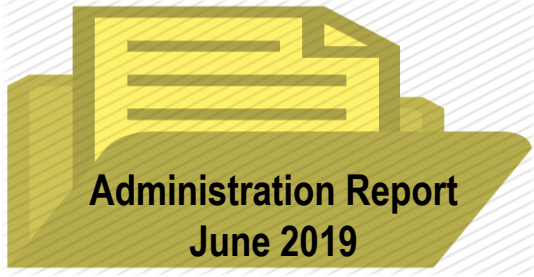

## **SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING**

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

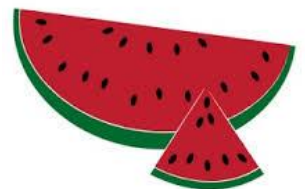

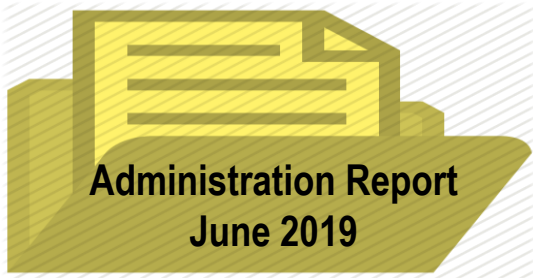
Please ensure recycling bins are outside first thing Wednesday morning and easily accessible for pickup.

Our water licence is due in 2020 so work will begin on gathering information to apply for a new licence.

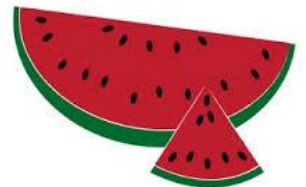
## **WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY**

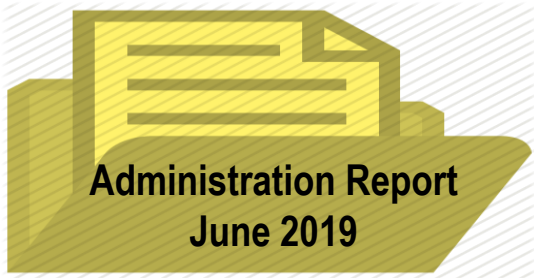
The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. The annual clean of the cisterna and trucks are complete.

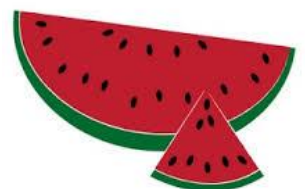

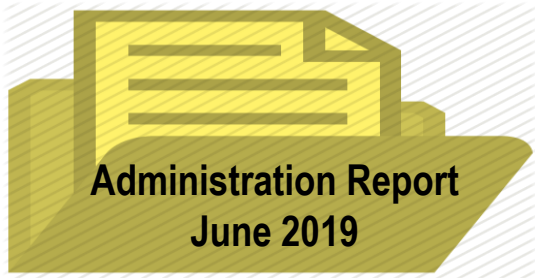
With the warmer weather Children are out and around the community on their bikes and walking so please be cautious while driving especially around playgrounds. **SLOW DOWN!**

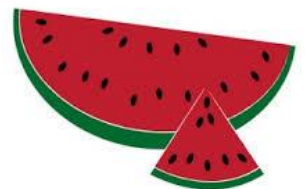

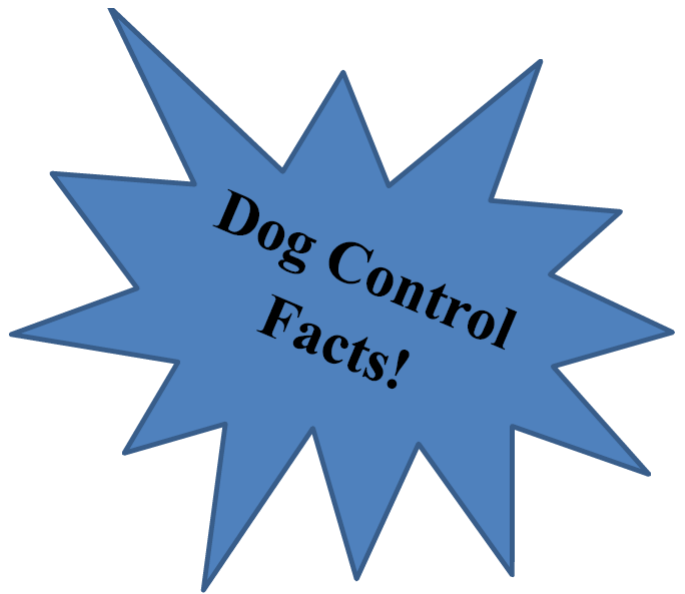

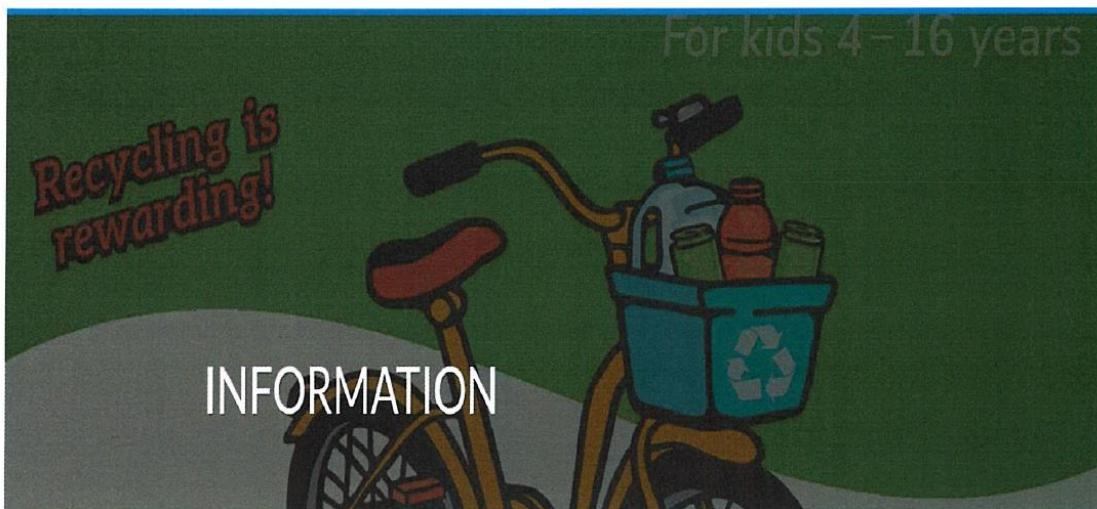

*Our Commitment is the Environment*

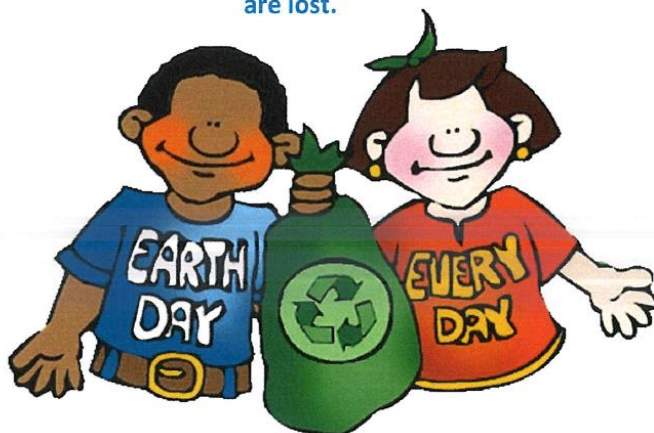


The administrator for the Yukon Recycling Club this year is Raven Recycling.

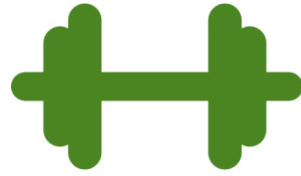

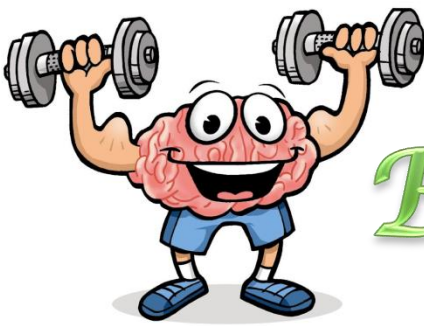

# ***BBQ Chicken Bacon Pineapple Kabobs***



## **Instructions**

- Combine Chicken Pieces with the BBQ Sauce and let marinate for 2-3*
- Microwave Bacon for 2-5 Minutes*
- Using Kabob Skewers, Thread chicken, bacon pieces and pineapple in a pattern. Fold the bacon in half to arrange next to the chicken*
- Grill Kabobs until chicken Reaches 155-160 Degrees F. Slather remaining ½ cup of BBQ sauce on kabobs when almost cooked.*
- Cover loosely with foil and let sit for 5-10 minutes before severing*

- Boneless skinless Chicken Breasts cut into 1 ½ chunks*
- Favorite Flavour BBQ Sauce*
- Bacon Cut into small Pieces*
- Fresh Pineapple cut into 2' Chunks*



# GRILLED CHEESE HOT DOGS

## Ingredients:

- 6 Hot Dog buns
- 6 Hot Dogs
- 3 Cups Shredded Monterey Jack and cheddar Cheese mixed,
- 6 Tablespoons soft butter, for brushing buns

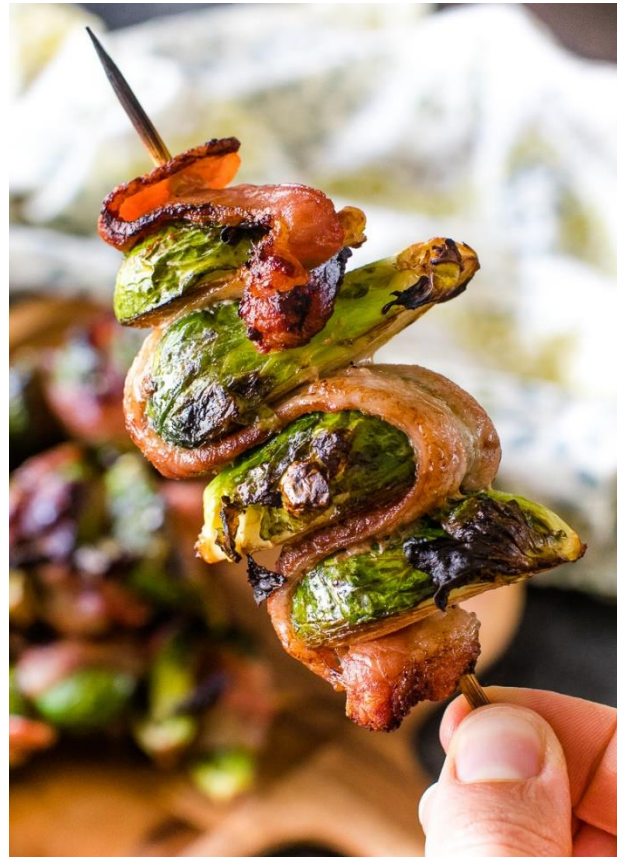
## Directions:

- Heat a non-stick skillet over medium heat.
- Open and roll each hot dog bun flat with a rolling pin. Spread the outside of each bun with 1 Tbsp butter. Place it on a skillet, butter side down, and sprinkle top evenly with 1/3 cup shredded cheese.
- Slice each hot dog lengthwise to where its connected, but will lay flat on the grill. Place hot dog , flat side down on the grill next to the bun. Grill for 2 minutes on both sides. Transfer the hotdog to the other side of the bun and sprinkle with 3 Tbsp shredded cheese
- Close bun over the hotdog and let grill until cheese is completely melted. Serve with Ketchup & Mustard

## Instructions

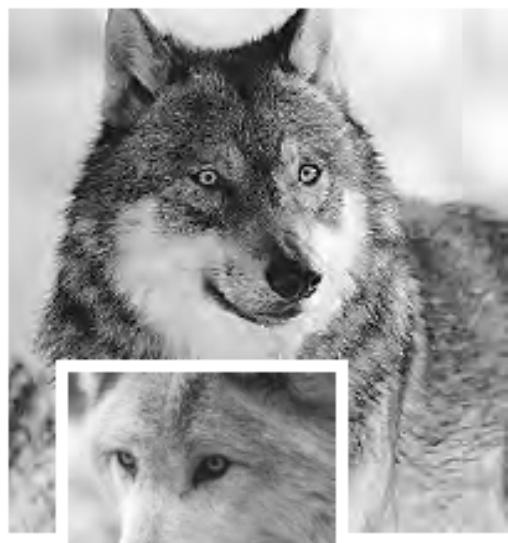
- ✓ In a small bowl whisk together the soy sauce, pepper and garlic powder

- ✓ Next get your skewers. Stick the end of a piece of bacon through skewer, add a Brussel sprouts. Fold bacon over the brussel sprouts and onto the skewer, repeat with three more Brussel sprouts, ending with bacon
- ✓ Clean, Oil and preheat your grill to 350Degrees
- ✓ Place skewers on grill. Grill for 5 minutes, Flip on grill an additional 4-5 Minutes or until bacon is crispy.



## Ingredients

- ✓ 1/3 Cup Soy Sauce
- ✓ 1/4 tsp Pepper
- ✓ 1/4 tsp Garlic
- ✓ 8 Slices Bacon
- ✓ 16 Brussel Sprouts

# Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door



Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

## What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.

- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time.
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children. Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.

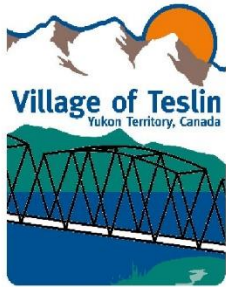
