Message from the Mayor July 2019

Hello Tesliners,

I hope everyone is enjoying their summer months and getting outside. It's been quiet on the council front, but that does not mean things are not moving forward. We have infrastructure projects in various stages of development, the official community plan process, emergency measures exercises, celebrations, and a new RCMP member.

As for infrastructure development, this summer is quieter than past years when we updated our roads and lift stations (sewage pump stations). Our main infrastructure project this year is the completion of the connector road project, a joint project with Teslin Tlingit Council. This road connects past the airport to the road below the sewage lagoon. In addition to connecting the airport lots with a planned TTC subdivision, it also forms the backbone for industrial lot development in the area. Consultation for the industrial lots is underway and coled by Yukon Government and Teslin Tlingit Council.

We will also be initiating the planning process for the new fire hall in the coming months, including site location. Why do we need a new firewall? We have run out of room in our old fire hall, especially since we added a second fire truck with our new agreement with YG to provide regional coverage on the Alaska Highway and mutual aid assistance to neighbouring communities (something we already did, but is now formalized with funding).

At our July 8th meeting, Council received a report on the April community consultation on Official Community Plan. The report is available on the village website (www.village.ca). The report identified four areas that will require policy choices by the Village of Teslin to get the desired policy and/or regulation: Food security, agriculture and animals; Housing; Community places; and Future land management and regulation. The consultants will be providing policy documents on these areas by early fall to inform further discussion. The second round of public consultations will take place in late fall



Message from the Mayor July 2019

On July 16th, we conducted a tabletop exercise of our Joint Emergency Measures Plan. Representatives from the Teslin RCMP, Teslin Fire Department, TTC Lands, Health and Social, and Executive departments, Teslin YG Social Services, and VOT attended the training. The Yukon Emergency Measures Organization and Fire Marshall's Office facilitated the session. A tabletop exercise is how it sounds – the group is presented with a scenario around a boardroom table and is walked through the various steps as the scenario unfolds. This scenario was a fire near Hermit Lake, and we learned a lot about the process and identified some areas of improvement, such as radio communication and need for a few formal agreements. This exercise is the first step in practicing the plan, and could potentially lead to a more advanced step such as a mock exercise which is under consideration for next year's exercise.

Many thanks to everyone who came out for the July 1st parade and activities. A great big thank you to Patty Wiseman and Kelsey Hassard for organizing the activities which the kids and adults seemed to thoroughly enjoy (although the slippery slide hockey followed by sliding seemed to be a real favourite).

I also saw a lot of Tesliners in Carcross for the Haa Kusteeyi Celebration at the end of July. Although not in Teslin this year, I know that it is an important event for many of our community members, and it seemed to be a very successful event with many smiles and lots of pride. An especially big congratulations to those who took part in canoe journey to Carcross leading up to the opening. By all accounts, this great accomplishment was not only successful but emotionally moving. I also understand that there was significant participation by the youth. Great to hear!

Teslin Echo Fire Crew

Lightning Fire Management (LFM) is a subsidiary of the Deisleen Development Corporation and holds a yearly service contract for Fire Suppression with the Yukon Government's Wildland Fire Management. The contract is to provide a crew leader, 3 crew members/trainees and their transportation. This is a territorial service and the crew is deployed by WFM to fight fires where and when needed.

The Type 1 Initial Attack Crews are comprised of firefighters who are physically fit, highly trained and skilled individuals. Initial attack firefighters operate as part of a three-person (in Echo Crew's case a 4 person crew) and are usually the first on scene of a new wildfire. Once there, the initial attack crew works quickly to set up water pumps, remove fuel from the fire's path and dig fire guards to control or extinguish the blaze. The majority of fires in Yukon are responded to by initial attack crews who perform initial attack and sustained action activities on wildland fires.

Teslin Echo Fire Crew is comprised of:

Kevin Welin who has shown his competence in fire suppression as a Type 1 Crew Member with over 50 fireline days, on fires in which rotary wing and air tankers have been utilized in the suppression effort. This is the 5th summer that Kevin has worked as an Initial Attack member and the first as a Crew Leader.

Roan Evans-Ehricht has experience on at least 7 fires or a minimum of 60 hours of fireline duty as a Type 1 crewmember and is in his second summer as an Initial Attack crew member. Roan also has his Emergency Medical Responder Certificate.

Thomas Dewhurst joined LFM as an Initial Attack Crew Member Trainee. Thomas passed the WFX-FIT fitness test and the 10 day CIFFC S-131 Type 1 Crew Member Course. Tommy was deployed to the Haines Junction Fire and got his minimum of 60 hours of fireline duty as a Type 1 crewmember with satisfactory performance appraisals and is now a Certified Type I Crew Member.

Trenton Dupont joined LFM as an Initial Attack Crew Member Trainee. Trenton passed the WFX-FIT fitness test and the 10 day CIFFC S-131 Type 1 Crew Member Course. Trenton was deployed to the Haines Junction Fire and got his minimum of 60 hours of fireline duty as a Type 1 crewmember with satisfactory performance appraisals and is now a Certified Type I Crew Member.



Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door


Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.



- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children.
 Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.
