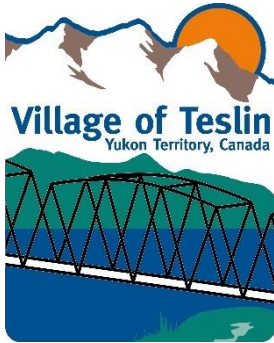

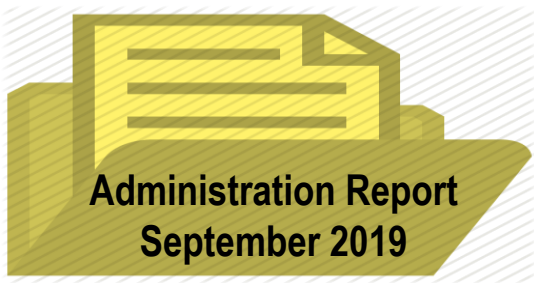

Speed bumps are removed and road maintenance has been completed for the season.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, and Tuesday– Closed to public

Wednesday, Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

The facility is now open on Wednesdays until the end of October.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

The free store has been upgraded; please ensure all items dropped off are clean and in good shape. It is not maintained by VOT staff, so please clean up after yourself. All items left out will be discarded.

Please ensure recycling bins are outside first thing Wednesday morning and easily accessible for pickup.

Electronic waste is now on the designated material list so it is free of charge to dispose of.

We are working on a site plan for future growth of the landfill.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

Our water licence is due in 2020 so work will begin on gathering information to apply for a new licence.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

DOG CONTROL

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

We have received numerous complaints about dogs running at large in the Fox Point subdivision we are actively pursuing loose dogs in the area.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements

Message from the Mayor September 2019

Hello Tesliners,

I hope everyone is enjoying the fall and the nice weather as we head towards the colder months. I know lots of people are out hunting and enjoying the last bits of sun and warmth before winter. Council is back in full swing in October. In this edition, we have news to share on the Official Community Plan update, thoughts on plastic bags, and introduction of our new recreation manager.

We are preparing for the next series of Official Community Plan (OCP) meetings that are coming up in late fall. As part of this process, we reviewed what we heard in the spring meetings and received policy documents on specific issues. Over the past month, we received a general background research report on the OCP, and specific reports on food security, affordable housing, and community spaces. These reports provide information for council and the public to consider for the next round of OCP community consultations. I encourage you to pick up a copy of the reports at the village office or on the village website (www.teslin.ca). The murals from our spring sessions are also available on the website (<https://www.teslin.ca/ocp-2019>). Just a reminder that every municipality in the Yukon is required to have an official community plan and our plan was last updated in 2009 through a similar community consultation. One of the key findings of the background report is that we completed almost 88% of the 67 action items from the 2009 OCP. This success is exceptional and speaks to intergovernmental cooperation between VOT and TTC, and the engagement of our community members who provided input during our 2009 consultations. So, please find time to engage in the second round of consultations that will be taking place in the late fall.



Message from the Mayor October 2019

Over the summer, we had an interesting conversation at council about plastic bags in light of the Village of Carmacks decision to ban plastic bags. At this time, we have no intention of doing the same in Teslin. However, as you know, the three R's of solid waste reduction are reduce, reuse and recycle. Reducing and reusing are preferable to recycling since that keeps things out of the solid waste stream entirely. As a result, we are focusing on raising awareness on the importance of using cloth bags. We may also be issuing some cloth bags of our own to encourage reuse. As a family, the Currans are trying to get better at remembering to bring our Nisutlin Trading Post cloth bags when we go to the store (still a work in progress) and when shopping in other places, and I encourage others to do the same.

At the end of August, we said farewell to our recreation programmer Kelsey Hassard after several years of great work. We are pleased to announce that Lindsay Johnson is joining us in mid-October as our new Recreation Manager. She is coming to us from Old Crow with excellent recommendations from many people in the far northern community. We would like to welcome her to Teslin and look forward to hearing about her ideas for recreation in the community.

Many thanks to all who contribute to making our community a great place to visit and live.

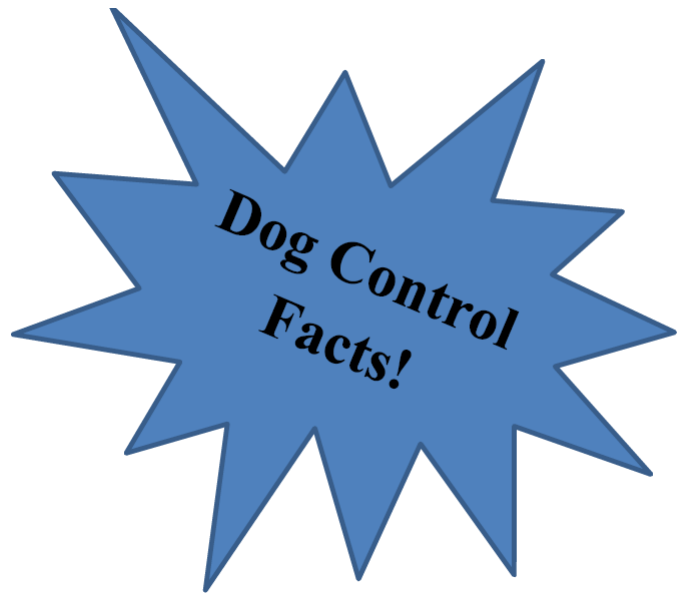

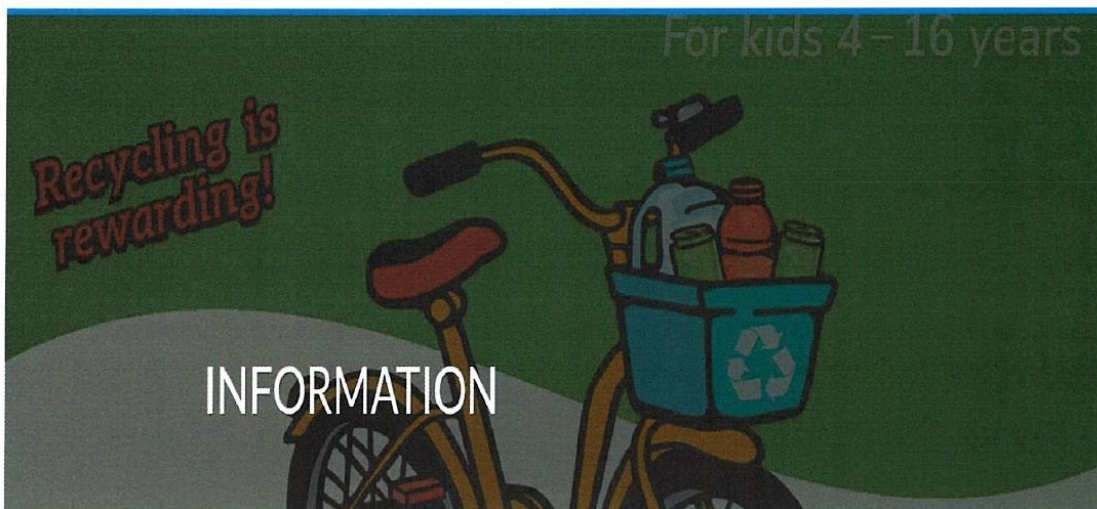

Our Commitment is the Environment

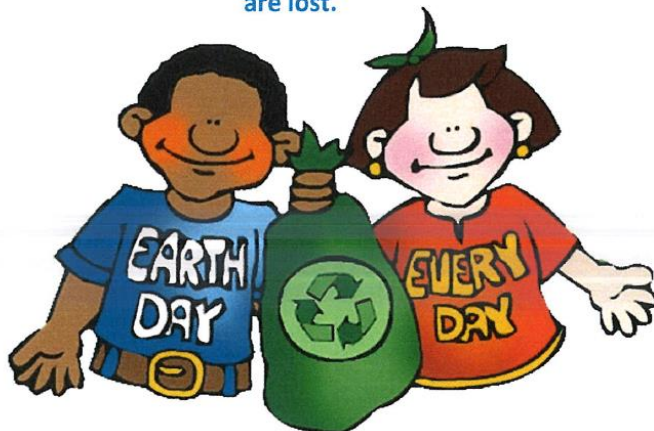


The administrator for the Yukon Recycling Club this year is Raven Recycling.

PUMPKIN PIE TRUFFLES

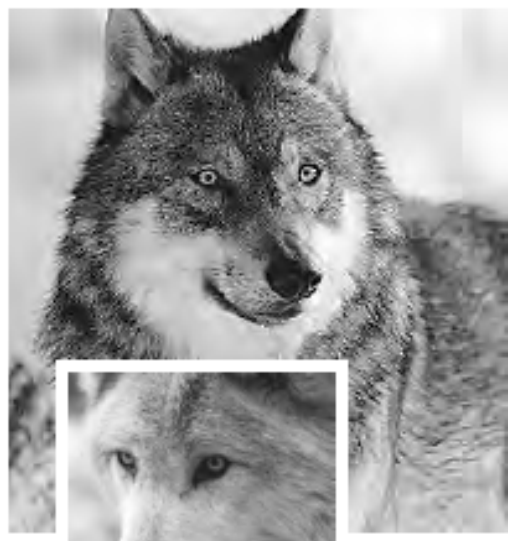
Instructions

- Melt white chocolate in a double boiler
- In a food processor, combine white chocolate, pumpkin puree, 2/3 cup graham cracker crumbs, cream cheese, powdered sugar, pumpkin pie spice, and salt. Transfer to a bowl, cover and chill mixture for at least 2 hours.
- Meanwhile heat butter in a small skillet. Add remaining 2 tablespoons graham cracker crumbs and stir to combine. Toast for about 2 minutes, then remove from heat and set aside.
- Roll the chilled mixture into 1 inch balls, place on a parchment-lined baking sheet and freeze for about 15 minutes.
- Melt dark chocolate in a double boiler. When the chocolate has melted, dip truffles individually into melted chocolate using a fork to drain off the excess chocolate (it helps to tap the wrist of the hand that is holding the fork with your other hand). Use a spoon to gently slide the truffle off of the fork and onto the baking sheet. If chocolate begins to cool, return to the double boiler briefly before continuing to dip truffles.
- Immediately garnish each truffle with reserved graham cracker crumbs and chill for at least 1 hour before serving!

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup white chocolate chopped
- 1/4 cup pumpkin puree
- 2/3 cup graham cracker crumbs plus 2 tablespoons
- 1 ounce cream cheese room temperature
- 1 tablespoon powdered sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon pumpkin pie spice
- Pinch of salt
- 1/2 tablespoon unsalted butter
- 6 ounces dark chocolate, chopped

Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door



Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.

- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time.
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children. Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.

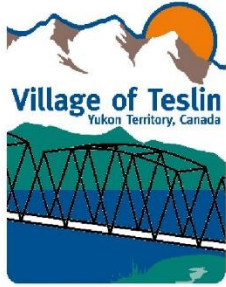
