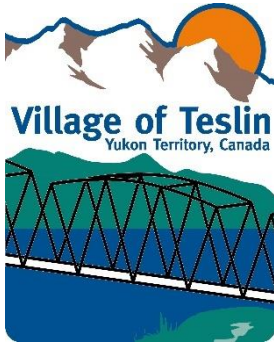

TESLIN ROADS

All roads are in winter driving conditions, please drive appropriately.

Please be considerate and avoid walking on private property and through residents' yards.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, and Tuesday– Closed to public

Wednesday, Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

We may be crushing some scrap steel and shipping it south during the coming month.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

The free store has been upgraded; please ensure all items dropped off are clean and in good shape. It is not maintained by VOT staff, so please clean up after yourself. All items left out will be discarded.

Please ensure recycling bins are outside first thing Wednesday morning and easily accessible for pickup.

We are working with YG on possibly becoming a regional facility. Will keep you posted as we move forward in the discussions.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

Our water licence is due in 2020 so work has begun on gathering information to apply for our new licence.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not

requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

DOG CONTROL

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

We have received numerous complaints about dogs running at large in the Fox Point subdivision we are actively pursuing loose dogs in the area.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements

October 2019 Recreation Report

I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself to the community. My name is Lindsay Johnston and I started as the Recreation Manager on October 15. I moved to Teslin from Old Crow where I had been the Recreation Coordinator for the past 5 years.

While in Old Crow I was part of restructuring the recreation department and capital projects such as a youth center renovation, erection of a storage garage, and early stages of baseball diamond and hockey rink upgrade projects. Another big focus of mine was community sport events, preparing youth for participation in major games and increasing the land-based programs offered through recreation including land camps, hunts, and multi-day canoe trips.

I truly believe that Sport & Recreation has the ability to change lives and have seen first hand the impact that Sport & Recreation can have at the community level. Sport and recreation have been the focus of my life since childhood- from participation at the community, University, and recreational level; to acquiring my Business & Entrepreneurship Degree, Majoring in Sport & Recreation, receiving my Graduate Certificate in Indigenous Sport & Recreation and pursuing a passionate career in the field.

I am thrilled to be working with the Village of Teslin and Teslin Tlingit Council to strengthen recreation offerings for all community members and welcome input and feedback regarding the recreational wants and needs of the community.

Now in other recreation news. I would like to thank Patty for her efforts with the After-School Activity program (and hosting the Halloween events this year) while I get settled into the role.

With November comes the return of the hockey and public skating season. Minor Hockey will return on Monday and Wednesday nights from 7-8pm. The men will resume their Tuesday and Thursday night schedule and women will try a new Sunday afternoon ice time. Public skating will be open over the lunch hour and on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturdays from 6-7pm.

Boys Club with Jordan will also resume Thursday evenings from 6-8:30pm. We are also working with the Yukon Aboriginal Sport Circle to offer an Archery Coaching Clinic in November and a regular Archery and Arctic Sport program through the fall and winter months.

2020 is a big year for Major Games with Arctic Winter Games taking place in Whitehorse March 15-21 and the North American Indigenous Games in Halifax July 12-19. These games are amazing opportunities for young athletes and I will be available to help those wishing to participate train and attend tryouts.

I look forward to getting to know everyone!

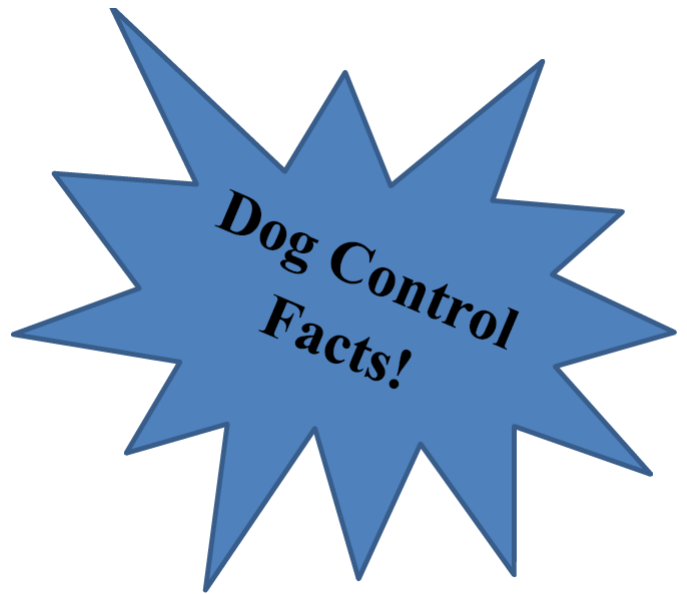

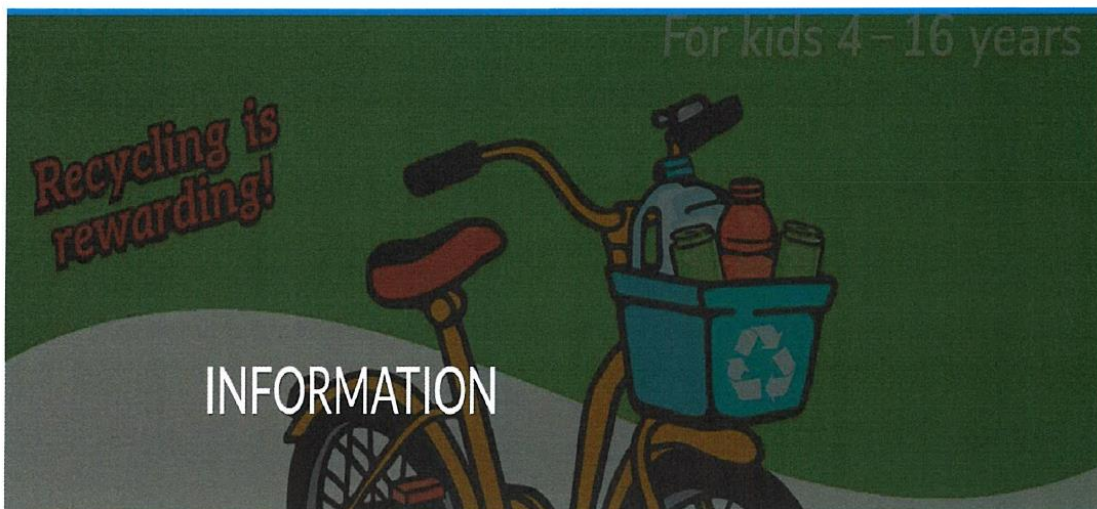

Our Commitment is the Environment

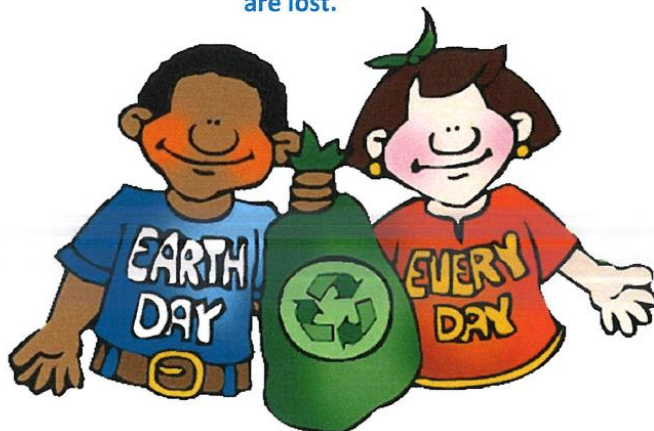


The administrator for the Yukon Recycling Club this year is Raven Recycling.

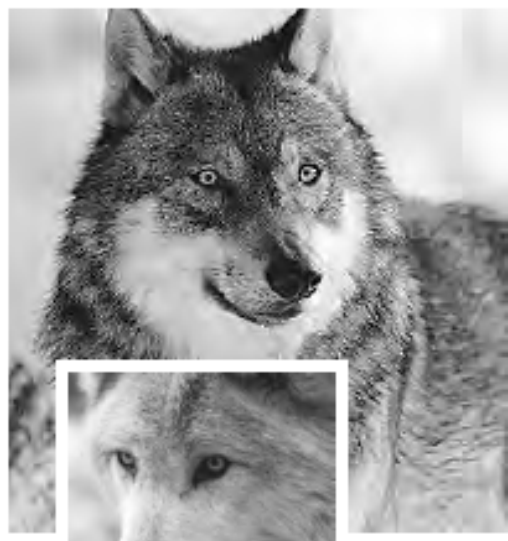
ONE POT KIELBASA PASTA

Instructions

Ingredients

- ✓ 1/2 cup olive oil
 - ✓ 1 lb smoked kielbasa or turkey/chicken sausage sliced 1/4 inch thick
 - ✓ 1.5 cups diced onion
 - ✓ 2 cloves garlic, minced
 - ✓ 2 cups low-sodium chicken broth
 - ✓ 1 (10 oz) can diced tomatoes
 - ✓ 8 oz dry pasta (small pasta)
 - ✓ 1/2 cup milk or heavy cream
 - ✓ 1/2 tsp salt and pepper, each
 - ✓ 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
 - ✓ 1/3 cup thinly sliced scallions, for garnish
- ✓ Add olive oil to a 4-5 quart sauté pan over medium high heat.
 - ✓ Fry the smoked kielbasa and onions.
 - ✓ Add garlic and cook until fragrant, about 30 seconds.
 - ✓ Add chicken broth, tomatoes, heavy cream, pasta, and seasonings.
 - ✓ Simmer for 15 minutes, or until pasta is tender.
 - ✓ Remove skillet from heat and stir in 1/2 cup cheese.
 - ✓ Top with remaining cheese and cover until cheese is melted, spotty brown, and bubbly.
 - ✓ Sprinkle with sliced scallions and serve.

Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door



Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.

- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time.
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children. Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.

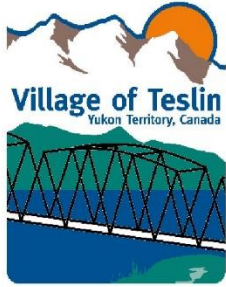
