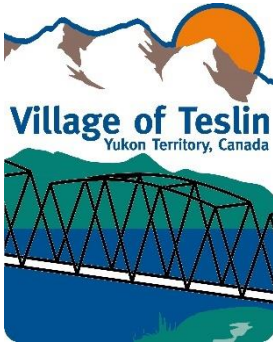

Due to COVID-19 virus the Village of Teslin has prioritized our essential services, water treatment, water delivery, sewer system, garbage pick-up & disposal are our priorities at this time. Sewer pump outs will only be available on Mondays and Fridays.

We are working diligently to ensure that we maintain these services while balancing community and staff safety. Please be respectful of our staff as they conduct their duties. The municipal office building will also maintain its standard hours but with limited staffing and we encourage residents to pay their municipal services accounts via electronically means if possible.

TESLIN ROADS

All roads are in winter driving conditions, please drive appropriately. We are doing our end of winter season plowing. We are currently operating with limited employees so if you notice any culverts filling up with water please call the Village office so we can schedule steaming.

SOLID WASTE FACILITY/RECYCLING

Due to COVID-19 virus and recommendations from the Chief Medical Officer for Yukon we have closed the recycling center until further notice. We are only accepting household waste at the solid waste facility and no fees will be charged. The solid waste facility hours have been decreased as follows:

The solid waste facility hours are as follows:

Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday– Closed to public

Thursday and Friday – Noon to 6:00pm

Saturday – 10:00 am – 5:00 pm

There is no after hour access to the facility so please plan accordingly.

Recycling pickup services has been cancelled until further notice, please store your recycling at home in a cool, dry, indoor location that is secure from wildlife until recycling resumes.

We will not be accepting any recycling drop off at our recycling center.

An average of one refuse bin a week is being sent to Whitehorse landfill for disposal. Everyone is encouraged to do recycling at home, and at work, to reduce the amount of material that goes to the landfill.

The free store has been upgraded; please ensure all items dropped off are clean and in good shape. It is not maintained by VOT staff, so please clean up after yourself. All items left out will be discarded.

Please ensure recycling bins are outside first thing Wednesday morning and easily accessible for pickup.

We are working with YG on possibly becoming a regional facility. Will keep you posted as we move forward in the discussions.

LAGOON AND SEWER SYSTEM

All systems are in good working order. Please be aware and careful of what is being flushed down the system.

Our water licence is due in 2020 so work has begun on gathering information to apply for our new licence.

WATER QUALITY/ WATER DELIVERY

The Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is in good working condition. Please ensure that pathways to the water fill spouts are clear and sanitary for safe water delivery. Please notify us if you will be away and not requiring water delivery. Kindly ensure that spouts & tank whistles are in good working order and lids closed to help avoid water overflow.

When constructing new buildings or renovating buildings please contact the Village office to get a copy of the water bylaw to ensure your water systems complies.

DOG CONTROL

Please ensure your pets are secure on your property. We take dog control very serious and are actively pursuing loose dogs, our public works staff do patrol for stray dogs 7 days a week! If you have stray dogs wandering on your property, please call the Village office.

We have received numerous complaints about dogs running at large in the Fox Point subdivision we are actively pursuing loose dogs in the area.

Once a dog is picked up by our staff, we notify the owner and if they are not picked up by the owner after three business days, they are sent to the animal shelter in Whitehorse.

The community dog spay program is still available. Please call the Village office for more information and to make arrangements to use this program.

The Village of Teslin has partnered with Yukon Government & Humane Society on a dog surrender program, so if you need to surrender a dog please give us a call and we can assist with making arrangements

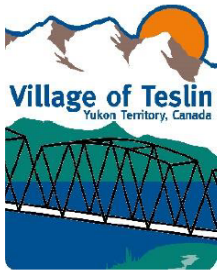

Message from the Mayor

COVID-19 Update from the Mayor March 26, 2020

In response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and advisories from the Chief Medical Officer (CMO) of the Yukon and the Government of the Yukon, the Village of Teslin has undertaken several more measures to curb the spread of the virus. We are also asking members of the public to pay close attention to the guidelines for social distancing and self-isolation. Spread the message, not the virus.

Municipal Services

As this situation evolves, the Village of Teslin will be focused on maintaining essential municipal services which include water treatment, water delivery, sewer system, and garbage disposal. Garbage pickup will continue as scheduled and the solid waste transfer station (i.e. the dump) remains open for residential garbage. We are not accepting any other items for disposal. Sewer pump outs will only be available on Mondays and Fridays.

All recycling is suspended as recycling pickup is cancelled and the recycling centre for refundables (e.g. bottles) and non-refundables (cardboard, plastic, etc) is closed. We are asking for people to keep these items in a dry place until we resume normal operations.

The municipal office building maintains its standard hours but with limited staffing. Due to staffing and social distancing, community members are asked to consider paying VOT bills by electronic transfer and reduce visits to our office. Our council meetings will also continue, but by video or phone conference. The public will be made aware of how to access these meetings as they remain open to the public although not in-person.

We are working diligently to maintain these essential services while balancing community and staff safety. Please be respectful of our staff as they conduct their duties. We are monitoring the situation regularly, and it is evolving daily. The measures could change at any time based on new information.

I would like to thank the staff and council for working together on the measures.

Social Distancing and Self-Isolation

One of the best ways to fight COVID-19 is through prevention through social distancing and self-isolation. *Monitoring your own behavior and those around you is very important.* There is lots of information available, but it is important to get facts from reliable sources. Please pay close attention to the measures and work with your friends and family to ensure that they are following them. *Spread the message, not the virus.* Help us keep our small northern community safe and self-isolate when you are supposed to. Please check in with others in the community (safely, with distance) to ensure that they have all they need.

Note that the Chief Medical Officer advises against ALL non-essential travel between ALL communities. Chances are good that unless you live here or have essential business here or in another community, you should be staying put right where you are at.

What if you or others are feeling sick?

If you think you are sick, do NOT go to the health centre or hospital. Please called **8-1-1**.

If there is a need to isolate or quarantine residents in communities, Yukon Health and Social will be the responsible agency. We are working with the YG to understand how this will work in the community and how we can assist.

We have a resilient and strong community that looks after each other during times like this. Please be patient and demonstrate compassion with others who are doing their best to provide services, practice social distancing or self-isolation, or are feeling stressed. We will get through this with people doing their best to modify their behavior and support others.

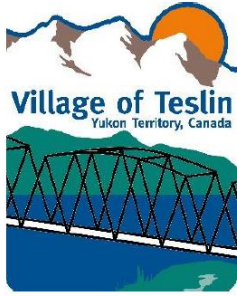

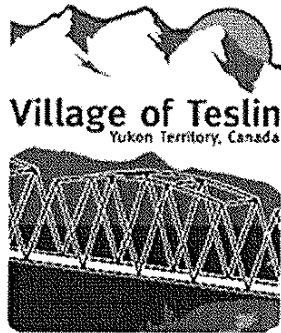
Public Notice

Lemon Asparagus Pasta

Ingredients

- ✓ 1 lb. penne pasta
- ✓ 1 lb. thin asparagus, trimmed and cut into 2" pieces
- ✓ 3 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil, divided
- ✓ 1 small onion, diced
- ✓ 2 cloves garlic, thinly sliced
- ✓ 1/2 c. heavy cream
- ✓ 1 c. dry white wine, such as Sauvignon Blanc
- ✓ 1 lemon, zested and juiced
- ✓ 1 tsp. kosher salt
- ✓ 1/2 c. freshly grated Parmesan, plus more for serving
- ✓ 1/2 tsp. freshly ground black pepper, plus more for serving
- ✓ 1/4 c. fresh parsley, finely chopped
- ✓ 1/2 tsp. crushed red pepper flakes

Directions

- ✓ Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. Add penne and cook according to package directions, until al dente. Reserve ½ cup pasta water, then drain. Set aside.
- ✓ Meanwhile, in a large skillet over medium-high heat, heat 1 tablespoon oil. Cook asparagus until crispy, then season with pinch of salt. Transfer to a plate and set aside.
- ✓ Heat remaining 2 tablespoons oil over medium heat. Cook onions and garlic until softened, about 5 minutes. Add heavy cream, white wine, lemon juice, and zest. Bring mixture to a boil, then simmer for 5 minutes. Add in salt, Parmesan, and black pepper. Reduce heat to low and mix until well combined.
- ✓ Turn off heat and mix in pasta, asparagus, and parsley until well coated. Add small amounts of pasta water until you reach desired consistency. Serve with more grated Parmesan, cracked black pepper, and red pepper flakes.



HOMEMADE PLAY DOUGH

Ingredients

- 1 Cup Flour
 - 2 Tsp Cream Of Tartar
 - 1/2 Cup Salt
 - 1 Tbsp Cooking Oil Olive Oil Or Vegetable Oil
 - 1 Cup Water
 - Food Coloring
- In a large bowl, combine all of your dry ingredients (flour, salt, cream of tartar) and mix well
 - Mix food coloring with your water first. Then add the vegetable oil and water with food coloring to a large pot. Mix together.
 - Add the dry ingredients to your pot and mix well
 - Cook over low to medium heat until the dough starts to form and becomes dry.
 - Once it starts to form a ball together and looks fully cooked, take off the heat. Let the dough cool first before touching.
 - Once cool, knead the dough for 5 minutes to make the dough soft.

Easter Cheesecake Macarons



Ingredients

- 1 recipe French macaron shells
- 4 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 1 and 1/2 tablespoons lemon curd
- 1 and 1/2 tablespoons strawberry jam
- 1 and 1/2 tablespoons blueberry jam
- your choice of colorful sugar sprinkles

Instructions

1. Prepare the French macaron shells according to the recipe instructions. Sprinkle the piped mounds with your choice of sprinkles immediately after piping, while they mounds are still wet. Bake as directed and cool completely.
2. Divide the cream cheese into 3 equal portions. Place each portion in its own bowl.
3. Add the lemon curd to one, the strawberry jam to another, and the blueberry jam to the last one. Mix each bowl of cream cheese and jam until well combined and free of lumps.
4. Place each filling into its own sandwich bag and cut off a tiny bit of the bottom corner. Squeeze a small amount of filling into the bottom center of one cookie, don't go all the way to the rim. Place an equal size cookie on top to sandwich the filling. Repeat with remaining cookies and filling.
5. Store the macarons in the refrigerator overnight and bring to room temperature just before serving.

All dogs must be licensed with the Village Of Teslin. There are two programs sponsored by YG & TTC/VOT to assist dog owners with the vet bill to have your dog spayed or neutered. Dogs running at large (off their property & not with the owner) will be picked up by the Village of Teslin. We only hold dogs in our pound for 3 business days after that the dog will be relocated or re-homed.

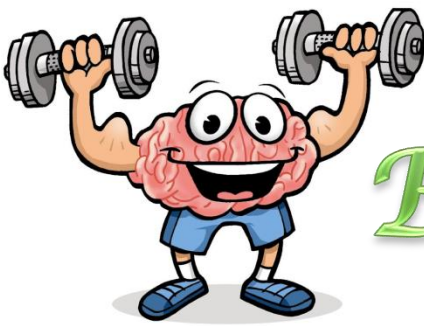

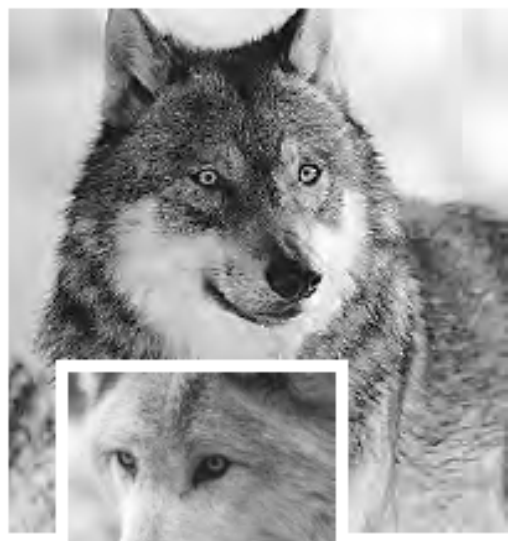

Check This List When You Want To Keep Coyotes, Wolves and Foxes Away From Your Back Door



Feeding wild animals might seem like an act of kindness, but it is not. Feeding wildlife is illegal and usually ends in a death sentence for the animal. When foxes, coyotes and wolves become habituated to unnatural food sources they can lose their fear of humans.

A wild animal that has become conditioned this way can be a danger to itself and to the general public.

In some cases, wild animals that frequent residential areas can be live-trapped and relocated. But if the animal has become a nuisance to the extent that it kills domestic animals or threatens people, it must be destroyed.

What you can do:

- Don't feed or leave food out for foxes, coyotes or wolves.
- Don't attract wildlife with carelessly stored garbage and compost.
- Make sure your garbage and compost put out for pick-up are secure against scavengers.
- Keep meat and dairy products out of backyard compost systems, and ensure your compost is completely enclosed with a secure lid.
- Store pet food indoors or lock it up outdoors.

- Vaccinate your pets.
- Keep your pets indoors or safely tied in a well-lit and fenced yard.
- Prevent any interaction between your pets and wildlife – walk dogs on a leash all the time.
- Do not touch the fecal waste of foxes, coyotes and wolves.
- Set an example for your children. Teach them how to behave around wild animals. If you or your child sees a wild animal that is threatening, be big, be loud and never run.
- Talk to your neighbours, educate them on the risks to the community and to wildlife associated with feeding foxes, coyotes, wolves and any wild animals.

Applications are reviewed by a locally based committee and funding decisions are based on eligibility, merit and ability to meet fund criteria.



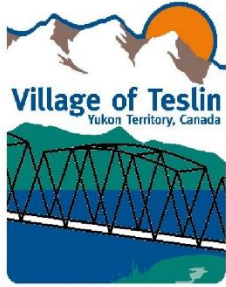
