#### My Career in the R.C.M.P.

For a period of two months I was seconded by the Co-ordinated Law Enforcement Unit in Vancouver to be a shift supervisor on a contract killer project. The suspect we were following worked for an organized crime group and lived in the high rent district of the west end of Vancouver. Although we never caught the fellow committing a crime, the investigation paid off in the long run. The dozens of wiretaps we were running were turned over to the Vancouver R.C.M.P. Drug Section who eventually took down the largest drug importation conspiracy in B.C. history.

Another notable case involved the murder of a young mother by her son. He beat her to death in her sleep with a baseball bat because she refused to let him use the family car. Although there was a preponderance of physical evidence, the murder weapon could not be found and the young man denied committing the offence. He was asked to submit to a polygraph examination to which he agreed. The results of polygraph tests are not admissible as evidence in Canada but it would tell whether he was telling the truth. During the pre-test interview the suspect admitted killing his mother and then took us to where he had disposed of the murder weapon. During a subsequent trial the lower Court judge ruled the accused had been hypnotized by the polygraph operator so any evidence gained from the interview by the polygraph operator was inadmissible. On appeal, the Supreme Court of Canada upheld the lower Court ruling and this decision stands as case law to this date.

At the end of day on a quiet Sunday evening, three employees of a Burnaby building supply centre were approached by two gunmen. The employees were made to lie face down on the office floor where they were shot in the back of the head. Very little evidence was found at the scene but a short time later an informant identified the culprits as twin brothers from North Vancouver. The informant also advised that the murder weapon had been thrown from the Second Narrows Bridge. A search by the R.C.M.P. dive team was eventually called off by senior management but the team did not want to give up. They continued searching on their own time and during practice dives until they found the murder weapon. The handgun was linked to the murder scene and also to the two brothers who are now serving life sentences.

The Morality Section kept files on known sex offenders living in our detachment area. When young children started disappearing on a regular basis one of the investigators on our section advised he was sure he knew who was responsible. Following a lengthy investigation this individual was caught red handed with two young girls. Clifford Robert Olson confessed to murdering eleven people between the ages of nine and eighteen. He was subsequently sentenced to eleven concurrent life sentences. Olson died of terminal cancer in 2011.

My son was born during my time in Burnaby and I now had two children. Due to the nature of my duties I had spent little time with my family so I volunteered for northern service where I thought things would be a little quieter. Would you believe my next transfer was to Baker Lake, Northwest Territories as the Detachment Commander. Baker Lake is situated in Canada's central Arctic four hundred miles north of Churchill, Manitoba and six hundred miles north east of Yellowknife, Northwest Territories.

# Recipe Corner Grouse Northwoods

Hunter Angler Gardener Cook

Ingredients:

1 1/2 cups wild rice, divided

Breasts from 4 grouse, skinned with tenders removed Salt

1/4 cup butter, divided

3 cups chicken stock

1/2 cup flour

1 to 2 pounds fresh mushrooms (any kind)

2 garlic cloves, minced

1 teaspoon dried thyme

1 cup fresh cranberries

1/4 cup fruit syrup (cranberry or blueberry work well)

1/3 cup cider vinegar





- 2. Simmer 1 cup wild rice in the chicken stock until tender, anywhere from 20 minutes to 50 minutes depending on type. When the rice is done, drain and set aside.
- 3. Grind the remaining 1/2 cup of wild rice in a spice grinder into a powder. Mix this with flour and coat the grouse with the powder.
- 4. Heat 3 tablespoons of butter in a large pan and sauté the grouse breasts until they are just barely done, about 4 to 5 minutes per side. Set aside.
- 5. Put the remaining butter in the pan and turn the heat to high. Add all the mushrooms. Shake the pan as you do this so they don't all stick to the bottom. Keep searing and shaking the pan until the mushrooms give up their water. Sprinkle them with salt and add the garlic and thyme. Let the mushrooms sear without moving the pan for 1-2 minutes: You want them to get some browning. Stir the mushrooms and repeat until you get them as browned as you want about 8 minutes.
- 6. Add cranberries and toss to combine. Cook until they just start popping, then add the wild rice, vinegar and fruit syrup. Toss to combine and serve with the grouse.
