Brook Hill MSW RSW

I grew up in Toronto but headed to the "laid back "West Coast once graduating with an honours BA in Environmental Studies. Unable to find paid employment in my area of study I began working in the Battered Women's' movement. I became fascinated by what aspects allowed people to embrace change, recover from trauma, and move on from very difficult situations.

Wanting to understand more about how people navigate change I eventually returned to school and completed my Masters in Social Work (counselling stream) at Dalhousie University in Halifax and later post graduate training in Family therapy. I remained on the east coast for about 10 years and worked with children and adolescents with Mental Health issues.



In 1996 I was feeling like I needed a change and accepted a term position in a counseling agency in Whitehorse Yukon. A few days after my arrival I realized that was totally smitten with "the North" and happily settled there permanently.

My interest in helping people find their purpose and recover from trauma remained strong as I continued work in both the Addictions and Mental Health field. Since moving North I have also developed a particular interest in First Nations communities, reconciliation, and the impacts of colonization as these issues have significant impacts on an individual's health and a community's general wellbeing.

Outside of my work world I remain passionate about environmental issues and have a particular fondness for animals. I love being outdoors and enjoy canoeing, hiking, skiing hiking and camping.



Jan Forde, MSW, RSW

I have lived and worked in the Yukon since 1990. After many years of involvement with the fight to end sexual violence and spousal abuse, I came to the Yukon to assume the position of Director of Kaushee's Place, the Yukon Women's Transition House. This afforded me my first exposure to the many difficult issues faced by women, both Native and non-Native, living in the North. Later I worked as a counselor with Victim Services. There I sought and received the advanced training required to maintain a specialized caseload of trauma survivors, many of whom were of First Nation backgrounds. During that time I acquired considerable familiarity with the emotional and psychological impacts of residential schools and colonization in general.

After leaving Victim Services I worked with the Carcross/Tagish First Nation as both an Outreach Worker and then as a Counselor, providing support, advocacy, and counseling for individuals and groups. Subsequently, I attended graduate school at UNBC to increase my ability to work more effectively with people who struggle with complex trauma and complicated grief. There I explored the connections between mental health issues and historical, as well as current, social injustice, racism, poverty, and culture loss. This remains an on-going area of exploration and learning for me.

I am currently on the list of Access counselors and have, in that capacity, traveled to other communities to provide post-crisis support. In my home community of Carcross, I provide occasional counseling through the Health Canada IRS RHSP program for those suffering from the broad array of residential school impacts. I love living and working in the North and look forward to becoming a service provider in beautiful Atlin.

Brook and Jan will be visiting Atlin regularly on most Tuesdays and Thursdays and are available by appointment.


