Counselor Corner

So why go to counseling?

The motivation for going to counselling will be different for everyone. However, research does show that discussing challenging life situations with a trained, unbiased helping professional can be one useful way to help resolve uncomfortable emotions. It can also provide an effective way to undertake a shift in how an individual is actually living their lives. Even so, for some people the very idea of attending counseling can create anxiety. It requires the client to embark on a new relationship which may shine a light on uncomfortable topics or require assumptions about self or others to shift.

The issues that people discuss with a counselor are as varied as those who attend. Sometimes feelings of depression and anxiety will become serious enough for an individual to initiate asking for help from a counselor. Recovery from a traumatic event (including physical or sexual abuse or attending residential school) can be another motivation to enter counseling. Growing up in a home where alcohol and drugs were heavily misused, can lead to unresolved issues related to self-esteem. Sometimes as children begin to mature parents will want some help to ensure that they are providing the best environment possible and will initiate counselling to explore their parenting style. Sometimes conflict with those we live with or at work can become very intense and we may need to examine what the underlying causes of these feelings are. Learning assertiveness, managing anger, reducing drug and alcohol overuse, grief work after a death or a separation, are other common issues motivating individuals to seek out counseling.

Choosing a Counselor.

Should you decide to seek counselling it is essential that you feel comfortable with your counselor. It can be a good idea to have an initial session to see if the therapist seems like someone you could discuss your feelings with. Remember that you are the consumer and it is the client who gets to decide if the counselor is the right person for you to work with.

As a client you have the right to know what qualifications your counselor has and what their previous work experience has been. There are many different types of counselors and their training and background inform their approach. It can be useful for the client to ask about these things to get a sense of how the working relationship might develop. A good working relationship includes feeling of safety and trust so you can speak openly about issues that have brought you there. It is important that you feel heard, understood and secure that the feedback that the therapist provides will be respectful and (hopefully) helpful.

Research shows that it is the quality of the relationship between client and therapist that makes the difference in the effectiveness of therapy. The relationship between a client and therapist can feel quite intimate but is markedly different from a friendship as the information sharing is about the client's perspective and experience. It is the counselor's role to assist you to evaluate how your experiences have shaped you and to find ways to help you come to terms with what has happened in your life.


