BREWERY BAY MARINA ASOCIATION – DECEMBER 2018

This submission to the Whisper was generated by a complaint made to Natural Resources BC by an Atlin resident. Apparently, the complainant feels the Brewery Bay Marina is not operating according to the terms of the leases they hold by restricting public access to the marina.

The BBMA was formed a number of years ago as a non-profit organization incorporated under the B.C. Societies Act. It was established to take over the maintenance and operation of the marina from the Atlin District Board of Trade. The Association is managed by a board of directors that is representative of the community and currently has over sixty permanent members. The Association holds three leases of Crown land which include the boat basin and launch ramp, the picnic area and parking lots and the free public launch ramp at the foot of Rant Street.

At the present time forty members of the association have moorage sites in the marina and all either live or own property in Atlin. Moorage sites are allotted from a waiting list, but not in any particular order. Determination is made by the applicant meeting certain requirements. e.g. Do they reside in Atlin? Do they own property in Atlin? Are they available to assist with the O&M of the marina? The size of their vessel, etc.

Over the past few years, with the exception of the airplane dock, all of the walkways and docks have been replaced at a cost of over \$60,000.00. The framing and decking for the new docks was purchased locally. The flotation and hardware had to be obtained outside of Atlin. The new docks were built entirely by volunteers and donated time and equipment.

This spring the association will undertake major repairs to the free public launch ramp at the foot of Rant Street. The plan is to widen and lengthen the ramp and replace and back fill the retaining wall. A 'Use at Your Own Risk' sign will be purchased and erected. Hopefully, the Atlin District Board of Trade, and private donations will help defer some of the costs for these extensive repairs.

Our income comes from membership and moorage fees. For the past two years we have rented RV campsites during the festival week-end to assist the Atlin Arts and Music Festival with their campsite overflow. Our leases stipulate we must have \$2,000,000.00 PL & PD insurance that costs us \$1,500 annually. The BBMA is a worthwhile community-minded organization and anyone can join at a cost of \$75.00 annually. A membership entitles you to unlimited use of the marina launch ramp and parking lots and the right to attend annual general meetings where motions can be made and voted on.

The marina is a valuable community asset managed entirely by volunteers. It was originally built by Atlinites who donated hundreds of hours of time and effort and donated equipment. Atlin is well known for its volunteer services and the BBMA is a fine example. I am extremely grateful and proud of the 'Over the Hill Gang' who continually show up to assist with the operation and maintenance of the marina.

I am willing to meet with anyone to discuss the operation of the marina. We would appreciate any sound recommendations and constructive criticism.

POSITION SUMMARY

Reporting to the Manager of Social and Health, the Justice Coordinator will develop programs to assist and support victims of crime in the community. The position will consult with representatives of the community to plan a Justice Program to deliver services to the community using traditional values that will promote peacemaking in both a social and criminal context. The Justice Coordinator is responsible for establishing a Youth/Elders Planning Committee and developing and implementing a Youth Crime Prevention Action Plan. This position will develop a process to intervene in urgent social issues and provide a conflict resolution process to those issues.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Developing with department staff a preventative process to deal with critical issues, i.e. spousal assault.
- 2. Liaising and facilitating meetings with community groups and individuals to establish a Justice Committee. Assisting the Justice Committee to develop guidelines and policies.
- 3. Documenting alternate models of justice, including traditional models. Arranging for and coordinating training for staff and committee members in traditional healing values.
- 4. Arranging for and coordinating training for appropriate volunteers and staff in Justice processes i.e. Restorative and Circle Justice.
- 5. Developing activity plans for Youth/Elders Committee.
- 6. Participating on the Risk Management Team which involves meeting with offenders either in or returning to the community and supporting them in identifying what supports can be provided to assist them in managing their risk.
- 7. Setting up and maintaining client files and running records.
- 8. Preparing reports to the Manager, Social and Health, the Justice Committee, Youth/Elders Committee and leadership as required.
- 9. Position is responsible for recommending changes and/or modifications to existing programs to address identified needs or gaps in service.
- Ensuring that all members of the Justice Program carry out their duties in a respectful, fair, non-discriminatory and non-abusive manner.
- 11. Providing ongoing communication with the Manager of Social and Health and other parties as required.
- 12. Attending relevant workshops, training sessions and seminars on justice issues to develop personal skills in order to bring professional qualifications to position and to the efficient operation and benefit to the TRTFN.
- 13. Other related duties as reasonably requested.

December designated as Provincial CounterAttack Impaired Driving month in BC



Impaired Driving enforcement is a national policing priority and Atlin RCMP will support this priority by increasing enforcement efforts to stop impaired drivers this holiday season.

Saturday, December 1, 2018 marks the start of the provincial, month-long CounterAttack impaired driving campaign. Atlin motorists can expect to see a heightened police presence in many areas of the community targeting impaired drivers.

According to provincial statistics, 65 people die each year (on average) in collisions where alcohol, drugs or medication is involved (5 year average from 2012 to 2016), making impaired driving fatalities one of the leading causes of death on our provincial roadways. Impaired driving, defined as driving under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs is entirely preventable yet it continues to happen with devastating consequences. Police will be using every resource at their disposal to get impaired drivers off the road. Police are also fully prepared to enforce the recently introduced cannabis legislation.

A small decision to plan ahead and drive responsibly can have great impact on our community. If you are planning on drinking or using drugs this holiday season, please do not drive. By finding an alternative way home such as walking or a designated driver you can ensure that you, and others sharing the road with you, get to their destination safely. Please make it your habit to drive sober every time you get behind the wheel.

Motorists can expect to see police road-checks in Atlin during the month of December and thereafter. Police ask everyone to drive safely and obey the direction of officers at all check-stops. Atlin RCMP wishes everyone a safe holiday season!

Subject: Recycling and dumping garbage procedures at the landfill

The Atlin Community Improvement District would like to inform the public of its current efforts in revamping the procedures for accepting garbage and recycling at the landfill.

The ACID outlines the importance to sort and recycle your garbage as much as you can to have the landfill last for the longest time possible and decrease the overall impact on the environment. This is why the Atlin CID has spent time and efforts to improve the recycle processes at the landfill:

- the recycle shed has had the addition of 4 more stalls enabling more recycle items to be deposited.
 - books can be added to the empty boxes on the bench in the recycle shed.
 - a Raven Recycle Poster with sorting categories has been attached for guidance.
- if you have any doubt on where to put your recycling or garbage, please ask the landfill attendant who will be pleased to show you the right place for it.

The Atlin CID would also like to take the opportunity to remind the public some basic procedures that make the work at the landfill safer, more efficient and less burdensome:

- recycle items should be placed in separate clear or blue plastic bags (cans in one bag, plastic in another bag, styrofoam in another bag and so on...). Doing so, it may take 2 or 3 weeks to fill the bags thus reducing the amount of refuse being picked up weekly.
- Cardboard is now bailed and should be broken down prior to being deposited in the recycle bag
- household garbage must be put in black or orange garbage bags and tied shut.
 Please refrain from putting cat litter and liquids in your garbage, this is a health hazard to the employee.
- As of January 1st 2019, garbage in shopping bags will no longer be accepted.
 Reason being those bags are too fragile and too often break scattering loose garbage. This adds to the cost in extra time and possibly exposes the employees to unsafe and hazardous waste.

The Atlin CID would like to commend those who already follow these procedures and encourage the rest of the public to join the efforts in making the landfill a cleaner and safer environment with an extended life for our children and grandchildren. We truly believe that once recycling will become a habit, it will be amazing to see how little household garbage is going into the landfill.
