ELECTIONS & ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Atlin Community Improvement District (Atlin CID) has the object of operating the following services:

- Drainage
- Fire Protection
- Sidewalks
- Solid Waste Disposal
- Street Lighting
- Waterworks
- Representing the Community in communication with provincial agencies on land use matters and advising or making recommendations to the Minister of Community Development on land use matters

The Atlin CID currently meets the Wednesday (Wed in winter to accommodate curling, otherwise the second Tuesday) of each month at 7:00pm at the Fire Hall. Meetings are normally 2 hours in length. Each trustee receives an honorarium per regular board meeting (currently \$50.00/meeting). Attendance at as many meetings as possible is extremely important.

TRUSTEE ELECTIONS will be held on 16 April 2019
CALL FOR NOMINATIONS: March 15 – April 15
3 Three-Year Terms are open for the position of Trustee
1 1-Year Term is open for the position of Trustee

Persons entitled to vote at an election must be:

- a Canadian citizen
- at least eighteen years of age
- an owner of land in the improvement district
- a resident of the province for the previous six months, or the legal representative of an owner of land in the improvement district who has died, become insolvent or insane.

One vote is also allowed for each board or corporation that owns land within the improvement district. The board or corporation must designate one person to act as an authorized agent to vote on its' behalf. This must be done in writing so the returning officer can verify their eligibility when voting.

If more than one person is registered on title as a landowner, each one can vote as long as they also meet the other qualifications. However, no person can have two votes unless they meet the qualifications to be an elector and are also an agent authorized to vote on behalf of a board or corporation.

Every person who is qualified to vote in an improvement district is also qualified to be a trustee.

POSITION SUMMARY

Reporting to the Health and Social Department Manager, the Family Skills Worker (FSW) is responsible for liaising with, and providing support, advocacy and referral services to parents, foster-parents, children and youth in the community. The FSW will adhere to and uphold the Protocol Agreement between Taku River Tlingit First Nation (TRTFN) and the Ministry of Child and Family Development (MCFD), while ensuring traditional roles and values are included in the relationship with MCFD. The FSW will facilitate and coordinate linkages between family, family members and resource workers; as well as coordinate workshops. Specifically, this position exists to support families within the TRTFN community of Atlin, BC, unless delegated otherwise by leadership.

DUTIES, ACCOUNTABILITIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Conduct needs assessments and develop case plans.
2. Make appropriate referrals.
3. Work with Health and Social Team to develop case management.
4. Recruit and support local foster families.
5. Advocate with external agencies to support families.
6. Facilitate integrated case management approach with MCFD, Victim Services and RCMP as appropriate.
7. Liaise and advocate with doctors, lawyers, court, school, and other professional networks on client's behalf.
8. Prepare and submit reports as required (interim and annually) as: required by TRTFN; required for clients; per contribution agreement with MCFD.
9. Coordinate workshops.
10. Work in conjunction with the Community Wellness Worker and other designated parties to utilize traditional methods of support, healing, and wellness, coordinates and facilitates to connect resources to the benefit of members in need ("Traditional Methods").
11. Ensure strictly to TRTFN's confidentiality policy and ensure that all records are maintained and stored securely.
12. It is recognised that the Family Skills Worker's and Community Wellness Worker's duties interact and at times overlaps. Therefore, it is vital that they work on a coordinated basis and when necessary reassign duties between themselves - as approved by H&S manager or designate.
13. Other duties as reasonably assigned.

POSITION SUMMARY

The TRTFN has recently begun to re-establish its Heritage Department after being unstaffed for many years. A Heritage department is vital in the recording and preservation of traditional beliefs, oral histories/legends, and cultural knowledge of TRTFN people for the benefit of future generations. The Heritage Digital Archivist is a unique and exciting opportunity to participate in many aspects of culture and heritage resources; from field and office documentation such as archeological studies and interviews, to practical management applications such as mitigation measures for development and community cultural events.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES, include:

General

1. Regularly communicate work progress to supervisor, Lands management team and TRTFN leadership
2. Engage in community outreach, consultation and information gathering including meetings, newsletters, etc.
3. Maintain strong cooperative relationships with TRTFN, other government staff and community members
4. Other related duties as directed by Supervisor

Heritage

5. Development of a digital heritage database (training will be provided).
6. Digitization of archival material including but not limited to: audio tapes, VHS, paper documents and photographs
