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CHAPTER 1

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE INTESTATE SUCCESSION ORDINANCE."

(Assented to June 14th, 1932.)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

(1)

"The Intestate Succession Ordinance," being Chapter 1 of the Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1925, is hereby amended by striking out the words "except where it is made for the purpose of distribution only" in the eighth and ninth lines of sub-section 1 of Section 7 of the said Ordinance.

The said Ordinance is further amended by striking out sub-sections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the said Section 7; and by striking out Sections 8 and 9 of the said Ordinance.

CHAPTER 2

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE COMPANIES ORDINANCE."

(Assented to June 14th, 1932.)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

(1)

"The Companies Ordinance," being Chapter 18 of the Consolidated Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1914, is hereby amended by striking out Sections 180, 181 and 182 of the said Ordinance, and by substituting therefor the following sections:

180. The incorporation of any Company hereafter formed for the purpose of operating any public utility under this part of the Ordinance, either solely, or in conjunction with other objects, shall be by memorandum and articles of association under Part II. of this Ordinance.

181. The provisions of this Part shall, so far as applicable, apply to any such Company.

182. The provisions of this Part shall continue to apply to any Company heretofore formed by Letters Patent.

CHAPTER 3

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE ASSESSMENT ORDINANCE."

(Assented to June 14th, 1932.)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

(1)

"The Assessment Ordinance," being Chapter 5 of the Consolidated Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1914, is hereby amended by adding the following section immediately after Section 17 of the said Ordinance:

17-A. (1) Every Insurance Agent or Broker soliciting or writing insurance of any description in the Yukon Territory, who during any calendar year does not reside in the Yukon Territory for a period of eight months, whether consecutively or not, shall pay a yearly license fee of \$100.00, which shall be payable to the Territorial Treasurer. Such license shall expire on the 31st day of March in each year.

(2) Any such Agent or Broker soliciting or writing insurance without having obtained the license above provided for shall be subject to the penalties provided in subsection (j) of Section 20-A of the Ordinance.

CHAPTER 4

AN ORDINANCE TO SUSPEND THE OPERATION OF "THE CROWN GRANT TAX ORDINANCE."

(Assented to June 14th, 1932.)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

The operation of "The Crown Grant Tax Ordinance," and all Ordinances in amendment thereof, shall be suspended in and during the years 1933, 1934 and 1935. Such suspension shall in no way interfere, hinder or suspend the carrying out of the provisions of said Ordinance and amending Ordinances so far as concerns the assessment and collection of taxes thereunder for any year from the coming into force of the said Ordinance up to and including the year 1923, and all proceedings and things necessary for the recovery of such taxes, for the year last mentioned, or the sale of property for unpaid taxes, and all proceedings and things necessary to be done or that may be done both before and subsequent to any such sale as provided by the said Ordinance and amendments, may be had and done notwithstanding any of the provisions of this Ordinance.

The said "The Crown Grant Tax Ordinance," and Ordinances in amendment thereof, shall again come into full operation from and after the first day of January, 1936.

CHAPTER 5

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE YUKON GAME ORDINANCE."

(Assented to June 14th, 1932.)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

(1)

"The Yukon Game Ordinance," being Chapter 1 of the Ordinances of 1920, and amendments thereto, is hereby amended by striking out the words "first day of September," in the fourth line of sub-section 7 of Section 4 of the said Ordinance, and substituting therefor the words "fifteenth day of August."

CHAPTER 6

AN ORDINANCE FOR GRANTING TO THE COMMISSIONER CERTAIN SUMS OF MONEY TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE IN THE TERRITORY, AND THE CITY OF DAWSON.

(Assented to June 14th, 1932.)

Whereas, It appears by Message from George Ian MacLean, Esquire, the Gold Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, and in the Supplementary Estimates accompanying same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned in Schedule "A" are required to defray certain further expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory and the City of Dawson, and for the purposes relating thereto for the year ended March 31, 1932; and,

Whereas, It appears by Message from George Ian MacLean, Esquire, the Gold Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, and in the Estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned in Schedule "B" to this Ordinance are required to defray certain expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory and for the purposes relating thereto for the twelve months ending March 31, 1933; and,

Whereas, It appears by Message from George Ian MacLean, Esquire, the Gold Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, and in the Estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned in Schedule "C" to

this Ordinance are required to defray certain expenses of the Public Service of the City of Dawson and for the purposes relating thereto for the twelve months ending March 31, 1933;

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, therefore enacts as follows:

1. From and out of the sums at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall be paid and applied a further sum not exceeding in the whole one hundred and twenty-one thousand and twenty-four dollars and fifty-nine cents for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory for the year ending March 31, 1932, as set forth in Schedule "A" of this Ordinance; and from and out of the sums at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall be paid and applied a further sum not exceeding in the whole seven hundred and thirty-eight dollars and four cents for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the City of Dawson for the year ended March 31, 1932, as set forth in Schedule "A" to this Ordinance.

2. From and out of the funds at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall and may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding in the whole one hundred and ninety-nine thousand, three hundred and twenty-four dollars and one cent, for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory for the twelve months ending March 31, 1933, as set forth in Schedule "B" of this Ordinance.

3. From and out of the funds at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall and may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding thirty thousand, nine hundred dollars for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the City of Dawson for the twelve months ending March 31, 1933, as set forth in Schedule "C" to this Ordinance.

4. The due application of all moneys expended shall be duly accounted for.

In the event of there being a surplus of moneys standing to the credit of any item voted for Roads, Bridges and Public Works after the construction or repairs provided for have been completed to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Works and Buildings, such surplus of moneys shall forthwith on the acceptance of such works or repairs by the Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, be taken from said item and become part of and be added to the amount provided for contingencies to such Roads, Bridges and Public Works, and shall thereafter be at the disposal of the Commissioner of the Yukon Territory for Roads, Bridges and Public Works.

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
